2010 INTERMEDIATE/NEWCOMERS REPORT

The Intermediate/Newcomers program was started in 1984 for 0-50 players under the direction of Edith McMullin. This was the start of a program to get players who knew little about the game an opportunity to play at an NABC. This program has grown to include games for all players from those with no master points to those with fewer than three hundred master points. The program is composed of ten elements which have helped to encourage these players to advance to the open games.

The ten elements are:

- 1. Games each sessions for 0-5,0-20, 0-50.0-100, 0-200, and 0-299 players (games may be stratified)
- 2. Trophies for each overall winner of each strata
- 3. A separate room/area for the IN Games
- 4. Directors experienced in working with newcomers.
- 5. A Celebrity Speaker Program
- 6. Special Events
- 7. Pictures of the Winners
- 8. A New Player Services Program
- 9. Flyers to invite the players and guarantee partners
- 10. Newcomer hand records with analysis sheets for players with fewer than 50 master points

New to the IN schedule this year is the 300/750 games. These were named for flowers or called the gold rush pairs. They are two-session pairs games which award some gold points for overalls in the 750 strata. They are listed in the IN Schedule but are not counted as tables for the IN area. This is a way to encourage the newer players to play in the open games. It also lets the newer players know what is available at the tournament on their own schedule. This helps the newer players move toward open games which is one of the main reason for the IN program.

The three NABC's for this year were Washington DC (Summer 2009), San Diego (Fall 2009), and Reno (Spring 2010).

WASHINGTON DC SUMMER 2009

The IN chairs for the tournament were Ron and Mary Ann Kral. They chose a political theme for the IN room. The room was decorated in red, white and blue. For the photo area, there were life size cardboard figures of Obama, Biden, McCain, Palin, and Hilary Clinton as well as a red, white, and blue backdrop. The winners could choose any of the figures or not to be in their pictures. Photo frames were given to the winners for their pictures

There were several social events. Each was held in the Hospitality Suite. There was one after the afternoon sessions on the first Saturday, Wednesday, and the second Friday. The players received invitations as well as guides to get them to the suite.

The first Saturday the chairmen had setup a Bridge University with several opportunities for the players to attend classes during the morning. They could play in the afternoon sessions. This was followed by the Sunday and Monday two-hour free lessons by Jerry Helms and Amy Nellissen. These were each followed by 0-5 and 0-49 free games respectively. There were eight tables in the 0-5 game and eight and one-half tables in the 49er game. Each of these programs was well received by the players. There were approximately thirty tables for each lesson.

Treats (candy, cookies or snack bars) were given out in the playing area each session. The players really enjoy these pick-me-ups when playing.

There were many junior players attending this tournament because of the Youth tournament on the second Thursday, Friday, and Saturday.

The National 199er had 41 tables in it. The record of 67 tables is held by Chicago.

The total number of tables in DC was 14,115. The total number of IN tables was 1213.5 with 1276 participants.

Jerry Helms presented a two hour free lesson to thirty tables of players. This was followed by a Bridge+ game with 14.5 tables.




