Deputy Principal on bridge: 'It put the fire under me'

At the CedarBridge Academy in Bermuda, the faculty tries to assure that students are exposed to a variety of opportunities. Bridge, as it happens, fit the bill just fine. So says Kalreta Conyers-Steede, deputy principal at the school and a new devotee of the world's best game.

Conyers-Steede knew nothing about bridge but had an open mind about the possibilities when John Burville approached CedarBridge about starting bridge teaching. Conyers-Steede said bridge fit the school's mandate for students to pursue "cocurriculum" activities: — undertakings that support development. "Bridge," she says, "helps with math and problem solving." Further, she notes, bridge "is a niche for students who would love to be part of something."

Once Conyers-Steede decided get her feet wet in the game, her interest took off. She is now studying the game and playing once a week. "It's a "wonderful experience," she says. "It's really put the fire under me."

Associate National Director David Metcalf has worked hundreds of sessions of bridge in various venues, from clubs to NABCs. He says that if he was given his choice of tournaments, he would pick the Youth NABCs, the 2018 version of which has been going in Atlanta since Thursday.

"This," says Metcalf, "is where I get my energy for the rest of the year."

Winner of the Jean
Molnar Award winner in
2016 as ACBL's top field
employee, Metcalf is running
his fifth Youth NABC
and still getting a kick out
of what he sees. He has been a full-time ACBL
employee since 2016.

"There's enough energy to power a city," Metcalf says, "and it's cool to see them all over the place one minute and completely focused the next. You can tell they are really enjoying this."

Metcalf, who lives in Newton MA, has assembled what he describes as "a really good team" to run the games and help the players, some very young, enjoy the bridge competition and fellowship that comes from a shared, often intense, interest in the game of bridge.

Helping Metcalf are TDs Cathy Hildebrand of Williamsburg VA, Carolyn Pinto of Fort Worth TX and Jesse Laird of Fort Lauderdale FL.

Hildebrand says the annual Youth tournament "inspires me about bridge. I like to see the enthusiasm. It amazes me." Hildebrand says it's

gratifying to see the young players return for more. "You get to see them grow up year to year. It's rewarding work."

Hildebrand says she can also see changes in the players she gets to know. "Bridge gives them confidence."

Laird, working the Youth NABC for a second time, considers the tournament "a great asset for the ACBL to have an event for youths to play as peers. Our future stars are definitely in this room."

Pinto, working her third Youth NABC and described by Metcalf as "amazing," specializes in the youngest players in the Youth NABC field – known as "cardrooks" – and is highly protective of her charges. "Watching these young kids is one of most rewarding parts of my 27 years of playing and directing. I love to watch them play and get to meet different cultures. It's very good."
