Sponsors play big role in Youth NABC success

Patty Tucker started the Youth NABC in 2008 and has watched it grow, in no small measure because of the loyalty of the sponsors.

Baron Barclay Bridge Supply sponsored the first Open Pairs in the competition limited to players 19 and younger with fewer than 5000 masterpoints. The event has always been the Baron Barclay National Youth Open Pairs.

The company, based in Louisville KY, is the world's largest bridge supply house. Each member of the winning duo in the Baron Barclay National Youth Open Pairs receives a \$1000 scholarship from the company.

Another company highly involved with bridge books is Toronto-based Master Point Press, whose owners – Ray and Linda Lee – provide a \$1000 scholarship for the player chosen by his or her peers for the Sportsmanship Award. MPP is the world's largest publisher of bridge books.

"We sponsor all kinds of things," said Ray Lee, "and we have felt that we wanted to do something for junior bridge. The game has given us an awful lot and we try to put what we can back into it."

The bridge-playing software is among the most popular of its kind and has competed regularly in the Computer-Bridge World Championships at World Bridge Federation tournaments. Great Game Products has been in business since 1985.

"We want to promote bridge among everyone," said Smith, "but especially among young players."
Bridge Baron 23 works with Windows and Mac operating systems.

This year's National Youth Swiss Teams is sponsored by Bridge Base Online, the dominant player in live, online bridge. Founder Fred Gitelman is well known for his philanthropy and contributions to the game, not the least of which was helping to get Microsoft Founder Bill Gates interested in the game.

Gitelman is an accomplished player with several North American championships to his credit, plus a world championship – the Rosenblum Cup at the World Bridge Series in Philadelphia in 2010.

BBO is providing four \$1000 scholarships to the winners of the Swiss teams on the final day of the Youth NABC.
