## Youth NABC welcomes Bermuda players

Two years ago, when Mike Viotti showed up for his new job at the Saltus School in Bermuda, his boss - the school's headmistress - had a question for him. "Do you play bridge?"

Viotti did not play, but he could tell where the conversation was going. As it happened, there was a Learn Bridge In A Day? class on the island. Viotti took the class plus some lessons at the local club and settled in to the unexpected duty. "I just played more and more," says the transplanted New Yorker.

When bridge classes were offered to students at the school, about a dozen showed interest. It was a different story this year, says John Burville, who notes that it didn't take a lot of convincing to get the headmistress interested in starting bridge classes.

This year, the response from students was much improved. "We started this year with 26, ," Burville says. "They just poured in."

With more of the students learning the game, it was natural for them and their families to consider attending this year's Youth NABC. Burville, Viotti and chaperon Ellen Davidson made the trip to Chicago with four young players. It is the first appearance at the youth tournament by any player from Bermuda.

There would have been more, says Viotti, but the idea of traveling to the Youth NABC came up too late for families with vacation plans already set.

Ruskin Cave is one of the students attending the tournament. He designed the bright pink shirts the Bermuda contingent is wearing in Chicago. The four players played in the Youth Pairs and Youth Swiss Teams on Thursday and will compete today and on Saturday in the two main events.

Gianluca Cacace, another member of the Bermuda group, says he is pleased that his contemporaries have taken a liking to bridge. "It's nice to see people our age playing," he says.

Viotti says he has been selling the game partly on the basis that players might have a chance to represent their country in world competition one day. Indeed, Bermuda has sent teams to more than a few world championships.

Viotti is looking forward to a larger group next year, including a couple of young female players he says are potential stars.

Bermuda will be represented again at the 2016 Youth NABC in Washington DC, says Viotti. "Next year," he adds, "we will have more players."

## Sachar book inspires young player

The Rockoffs are pleased to see their son so interested in a pursuit that tests his intellect. Says his mom, "It's better than video games, don't you think?"

## Costly overtricks

Jonathan Baumel of Kennett Square PA and Jack Gillispie of Ringgold GA had some excitement at their table during the Youth Pairs on the first day of the 2015 Youth NABC. The result was a number rarely seen at any level.

The two were uncertain about the meaning of redouble, although it seems logical that Gillispie took the action in hopes his partner would view it as a effort to get out of playing 1NT doubled.

East led a low heart, taken by Baumel in dummy. He played a club to West's king, took the low diamond shift with the 10 , then played another club. The suit was blocked, but Baumel still came up smelling like a rose.

East, in with the A, played another heart, taken in hand by Baumel. When Baumel cashed his good clubs, East discarded a spade, which helped declarer to the overtricks.

When Baumel played the $\uparrow \mathrm{K}$, East took the ace and played a low diamond. West did not, however, play the ace, so Baumel ended up with two diamonds, two clubs, three hearts and three spades for 10 tricks and the unusual score of plus 1960 . It was the final board of the session, so the top helped the pair to a $54.46 \%$ game. Despite the result, their opponents managed a $55 \%$ game.
