Florida schoolteacher leads kids into bridge



September, 16 fourth- and fifth-grade students show up every Friday at Anissa Dyen's third-grade classroom at Bear Lake Elementary School in the Orlando suburb of Apopka FL. The kids arrive at 7:45 a.m. for

an hour's worth of learning about bridge. The class is so popular that Dyen has a waiting list. Those lucky enough to get into the class are smitten with the game. "They never miss," says Dyen.

She and her husband, Scott, learned the game about three years ago – after their daughter and two sons discovered bridge in a class for gifted students. The children – Avery, 17, Spencer, 15, and Mitchell, 12 - are in Chicago for the Youth NABC.

The impetus for Dyen's bridge teaching was the

retirement of the gifted-class teacher. At that point, Dyen saw a need. Her children loved the game so much, she says, "I wanted to make sure the class continued."

Dyen approached the school's principal with the idea of starting a bridge class and received an immediate go-ahead.

Although she had no training as a bridge teacher, Dyen was not daunted by the task she undertook. She is supremely confident in her ability as an educator. "I can teach anything," she says.

Careful not to overcomplicate what can be an inscrutable game, Dyen put together a game plan for teaching youngsters bridge basics in simple terms and on a schedule that allows for slow absorption of the materials.

Dyen and her husband were not strangers to cards. Both say they grew up playing various card games, although bridge was not among them.

Dyen was pleased when a local magazine sent a writer and photographer to put together an article about her class. She and her students were featured on the cover of the glossy publication.

Buoyed by the success of the effort, Dyen is looking forward to the start of school next month, and she sees a major benefit to the children's interest in bridge. "The whole thing," she says, "is keeping their minds off of video games."

It's a family affair

The way Nola Lamoureux sees it, bridge provides more than just entertainment for her three children, all of whom are in Chicago to play in the Youth NABC.

"The kids," she says, "are learning social skills, sitting down and paying attention for three hours. These are things that can be useful in life."

The Lamoureux family lives in Halifax NS. Mom doesn't play, but Victor, 17, Vivian, 13, and VJ, 9, are already hooked. They have been regulars at Youth NABCs since 2010, the year after Victor attended the youth tournament by himself.

Jengs rally for narrow win in Baron Barclay Youth Open Pairs

Andrew and Richard Jeng, trailing late in the Baron Barclay Youth Open Pairs, came through at the end to win the event for the second time. Their margin of victory over the runners-up was 2.93 matchpoints on a top of seven.

Second place went to Joseph Lieberman of Los Angeles CA and Christopher Welland of New York City.

The win for the Jengs means more than masterpoints and glory. Baron Barclay's sponsorship provides a \$1000 scholarship for each player. That will come in handy for Andrew, who starts studies at Purdue University next month.

The brothers live in Johns Creek GA. In 2009, Richard became the ACBL's youngest Life Master at age nine years, six months and 12 days. That record has since been eclipsed.

The game started with 22 tables, half the field qualifying for the second-session final. The qualifying was dominated by three pairs. Lieberman-Welland scored 79.70% for a carryover of 14 matchpoints, the Jengs recorded 75.47% (12 carryover) and Jake and Luke Williams of San Diego CA came through with 69.02%, (8.96 carryover).

In the second session, the Jengs led the field with 59.74%, followed closely by the Williamses with 59%. Lieberman and Welland could not hold onto



their lead, scoring 56.8% in the second session. Besides the win in the Baron **Barclay Youth Open Pairs** five years ago, the Jengs have also posted wins in the NAP 2011 Young (0-1500) Life Master Pairs and the 2015 Golder North American Pairs, Flight B.

In Washington DC,

Victor's mother says, he found something brand new. Although he played a lot in Halifax, Nola says, "he had never seen another kid play bridge." Victor started the game at age 5, inspired by his grandmother.

In Washington, Lamoureux says, Victor was so excited to be playing he kept on going even after the sessions were over. "He was so thrilled he played bridge on the floor with other kids," his mother says.

Victor is now a Life Master and a club director.

Once Victor started playing, Lamoureux says, Vivian and VJ could not be held back. Vivian is a big fan: "It's different," she says. "It's not like the same stuff my friends do. I like math a lot and I'm good at concentrating."

Vivian says bridge also gave her the opportunity

for a rare thrill. At the 2012 Youth NABC in Philadelphia, Microsoft Founder Bill Gates made an appearance at the youth tournament. Vivian says she will never forget the occasion: "I got to ask *Bill Gates* a question."

Bob Lyon of Indianapolis is another parent who approves of bridge for his children. He and his son RJ are in Chicago for the youth tournament. RJ has been playing for two years, emulating his dad, an experienced player. Lyon was on the runner-up squad in last year's Grand National Teams, Flight A.

Lyon would love to play more with his son, but he says "I'm trying not to push it because I want him to do it on his own. I would like to play with him at some tournament." It was hard not to notice Evan Berman of Sarasota FL at the Youth NABC on Friday.






