1 Size of Gathering Limitations

Local area must allow gatherings of a sufficient size to allow the event to go forward.



Limitations are such that running a successful event is not possible.

7 Travel Bans

Areas with mandatory quarantines will require extra consideration for staff and possibly players.



Mandatory quarantines where this will include a significant portion of players and/or staff.

Positivity Rates

Regional/local reported active cases of COVID must be below 10% (ideally 5%) of the population. A range of 5%-10% will be determined by review of vaccination implementation numbers and new cases.

1 Club Activity

We will examine whether local club activity has safely resumed prior to holding a tournament in that area.



Under 25% of clubs have reopened and those that have are experiencing low attendance.



25% to 50% of clubs have reopened and have started to see attendance rise.



Above 50% of clubs have reopened and are seeing a significant return of players to the clubs.
