## NORTH AMERICAN PAIRS DISTRICT 11 CONDITIONS OF CONTEST

1. The National Conditions of Contest for the North American Pairs (NAP) are established by the ACBL and take precedence over District 11 conditions. The District 11 Conditions of Contest are solely intended to provide additional district specific information.
2. Club qualification games are played at local clubs during June, July, and August. Each club decides when to run its NAP qualifying games; however, games should never conflict with D11 regionals and should avoid conflicts with D11 sectionals. Qualifying at the club level is on an individual basis. If a player qualifies at the club level, they may play with anyone in the District finals as long as both players are residents of District 11 and current ACBL members.
3. The District Finals in each flight will be a two session event; each session must be at least 24 boards and no more than 30 boards. All partnerships are expected to play both sessions and will not be permitted to withdraw except in cases of emergency as permitted by the DIC. There will be no refunds in case of withdrawal. Entry fees are $\$ 25 /$ person for the event. Players may play in the finals of more than one flight if they are qualified to play in each flight. Flight eligibility is determined as of the June masterpoint cycle. Information about each flight is as follows:

4. If a qualifying pair in the District final is unable to compete in the National ACBL finals, they will be replaced by the next highest finisher in their Flight. This process will repeat itself until the District has selected three qualified pairs in Flight A and four qualified pairs in Flights B and C.
5. ACBL will award each first place district winner $\$ 700$ and each second place player $\$ 300$. District 11 will award each third place player $\$ 200$ and each fourth place player $\$ 150$. Awards are received after participation in the NABC finals, and are intended to subsidize travel costs. The ACBL waives entry fees for the NABC finals.
