NAP - North American Pairs

Each club can hold two NAP games per sanctioned session during each of the months of June, July and August. No special sanction is required. Masterpoint awards are $\frac{1}{2}$ red, $\frac{1}{2}$ black at sectional rating. Fees are \$4.00 per table.

Flight eligibility is as follows:

A: Open

B: Less than 2,000

C: Non Life Master with less than 500 Flight eligibility is based on the June, 2012 masterpoint cycle, which is run on May 6, 2012.

NAP material is sent to all club managers, unit and district NAP coordinators by e-mail. Please read the conditions of contest carefully. Unit level events begin September 1, but must be held prior to the district finals. The NAP finals will be held in St. Louis, MO in March 2013. First and second place district finishers in all flights receive monetary awards that will be distributed at the finals in March. First place pairs receive \$700.00 per person, second place pairs receive \$300.00 per person and third place pairs receive an invitation with no subsidy.

ACBL-wide International Fund Game # 3

Help support North Americans in international bridge competition. On Friday evening, July 13, bridge clubs across ACBL will host the third of three events designed to raise funds to defray expenses of North American teams entered in international competition for World Bridge Federation titles. Masterpoint awards are ½ red, ½ black at sectional rating. In addition to masterpoints earned at clubs, there will also be ACBL-wide and district-wide awards. Printed material is sent by mail approximately 4 to 6 weeks in advance of the game. Click here to sign up.

ACBL-wide Instant Matchpoint Game

The Instant Matchpoint game will be held on Thursday evening, October 4, 2012. Masterpoint awards at the club are 1.00 gold point to section tops; the remaining points are ½ red, ½ black at sectional rating. Additional overall and district-wide awards are possible. Players can see their score instantly after each deal is completed. Game material includes analysis booklets written by national champion Larry Cohen. Fees are \$11.00 per table. Update from the Board of Directors Meeting in Memphis, TN



Junior Coupons

Junior coupons will be made available for junior members in good standing for entry into events at NABCs.

Any junior under the age of 26 years who is a full time student (must provide proof of eligibility) will be entitled to coupons that can be used for any event. These coupons will have a value of \$10.00 per session.

Any junior under the age of 21 years will be entitled to coupons that can be used for any event. These coupons will have a value of \$10.00 per session.

Any junior 19 years and under will be granted free plays for each session of regionally rated events.

Proposed Masterpoint Formula Changes

Prior to any implementation of a new formula for the awarding of masterpoints the following procedures will be done:

A "shadow" testing period will begin in May, 2012 to review how the formula would change masterpoint awards. The results of this testing will be reviewed by both management and the Masterpoint Committee.

The results of the initial testing will be reported to the Board of Directors in Philadelphia.

The monitoring will include, but not be limited to the following items.

- Masterpoint Inflation
- Effects on both Regional and Sectional events
- Geographic and Demographic variations

GNT/NAP Conditions of Contest
