

## Summary of Changes to Recorder Regulation

1. A number 3 noting counseling and education was added.
2. The definitions were clarified and made consistent with definitions in other documents.
3. Through 7.

These were left unchanged with regard to content. The wording was changed to increase clarity.

8. The DIC of a tournament was given the responsibility to see that any player memos filed at the tournament were given to the organization's recorder.
9. 9.2 was clarified regarding the privacy issue for the reporter if the player memo was ever evidence at a disciplinary hearing.

9.6 dealing with procedures in recording a memo was altered by noting that memos that are recorded should be sent directly (and only) to the Memphis Office of the Recorder to be filed. This means that any recorder must contact the ACBL recorder to get information about previous reports that have been recorded, as Memphis will have the central database.

10.3 was moved into section 9 since it deals with procedures.

10. There was a change here and in 11 to retain memos (except for those dealing with allegations of possible cheating) for 10 years instead of the previous 5. This is due to the change in the Code of Disciplinary Regulations which allows properly filed player memos to be used by a disciplinary body in determining the severity of a discipline.
