BRIDGE IS FUN

Have you seen those fabulous new color-coded cards from which you can deal out 20 hands? More than 50 tables of players were introduced this week to the innovative *Bridge America* E-Z Deal cards which are part of the membership package for ACBL's new Social Division.



Last September the ACBL first introduced the concept of a membership for players who are primarily interested in the social, less formal side of bridge. The League joined forces with Audrey Grant to offer a new magazine and an exclusive bridge product to players who want something different from duplicate and masterpoints -- or perhaps, who want more. After all, many of us who are dedicated tournament players also play occasionally with a social group.

The *Bridge America* magazine is an expansion of Audrey Grant's *Better Bridge* newsletter, a very popular publication that Audrey has published for the past four years. Its 8 1/2 by 11 format is very attractive, easy to read, and offers bridge entertainment as well as bridge education.

A membership in *Bridge America* costs \$30 US or \$35 CN. Members receive a deck of *Bridge America* cards which allows them to deal out 20 hands plus a companion booklet which offers a full analysis of each hand. (Have you ever needed something to defend yourself against the "know-it-all" that many social games seem to attract?) In addition to the cards and booklet, a one-year membership includes a welcome issue of the new magazine and six annual issues. It's quite a bargain.

Coast-to-coast pair wins Mixed Pairs

A New York-California pair won the Mixed Pairs yesterday by a slim margin -- 12 matchpoints with 64 top on a board.

Phyllis Quinn of New York and Wafik Abdou of Bakersfield CA scored 2009.17 to 1997.10 for runners-up George Whitworth of San Ramon CA and Shirley Blum of Fresno CA.

Carol Sanders and Chuck Said, both of Nashville, were third with 1936.77.

Quinn is a computer consultant who lived in Euliss TX for nine years before moving back to her native New York. This is her first North American championship.

Abdou, an anesthesiologist, won the Open *Continued on page 6*

Zia, Cayne explode; Schwartz survives again -- Nickell doesn't

The team captained by Richard Schwartz continued its habit of winning close matches, defeating Kit Woolsey's squad by 1 IMP, 144-143, in yesterday's Round of 8 in the Vanderbilt.

Zia and Jimmy Cayne exploded in the fourth quarter of their matches, Zia outscoring Bob McMahan 103-12 and Cayne outscoring Grant Baze 51-14, to claim berths in today's semifinal match.

The Bermuda Bowl champion Nickell team, however, trailed throughout their match and lost to Jeffrey Wolfson's squad, sending WOLFSON into the other semifinal match against SCHWARTZ.

SCHWARTZ, who defeated Gerald SOSLER on Tuesday by 3 IMPs, compared after their match with WOOLSEY and thought they had lost by 1 IMP.

WOOLSEY, however, thought the match was a tie. When the teams re-calculated their scores, SCHWARTZ was the winner by 1 IMP.

WOLFSON led throughout their match against

NABC caddies: part of the extended bridge family

For Jackie Matthews, each NABC begins with a group of largely-unknown youngsters and ends with their assimilation into her expanded caddy family.

Matthews, a tournament director who lives in Roseville CA, is the Caddymaster at NABCs. She's been on the job about 11 years and feels that "some caddies you'd like to put in a bottle and take from tournament to tournament."

"You don't deal with just one caddy. They have parents and family. You become a part of their family and they become a part of your family."

The caddy family is diverse and includes head caddy Julie Old of Kemp TX, a sixth grade science teacher. The mother of three-year-old Toni and nine-

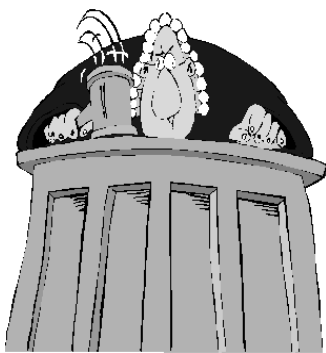

The Facts: 2♠ made three, plus 140 for E/W. South bid 1NT, announced as 12-14 HCP and after two passes East doubled to show a hand of at least the high-card strength of the 1NT bid. West, who had not heard the announcement, Alerted the double and without being asked volunteered that it showed a one-suited hand, the E/W agreement versus a 15-17 HCP 1NT opening. South redoubled as the start of some type of possible runout. West then bid 2♣ (unnecessarily in view of the redouble) to allow partner to bid his suit. East then bid 2♠. The Director was called after the hand



was over by N/S. The Director ruled that East had taken advantage of the unauthorized information from the Alert and awarded Average Plus to N/S and Average Minus to E/W.

The Appeal: Both E/W and N/S appealed the Director's ruling. East stated that he knew from the Alert and the volunteered explanation that his partner had not heard the announcement of the range of the 1NT bid. East stated he had every right to keep from being "shot in the foot" and elected to bid 2♠. N/S stated that they did not think Average Plus was an adequate result for them.

The Committee Decision: The Committee quickly decided there was no bridge reason for not passing partner's 2♣ call except for the unauthorized information available from the explanation of the Alert. East, in fact, had stated that was why he had bid 2♠. The Committee changed the contract to 2♣ down two, plus 100 for N/S.

It was emphasized to E/W that the Alert procedure was 100% for the benefit of the opponents and that they must never use this information in the subsequent bidding or play. A matchpoint procedural penalty, they were told, would have been applied in addition to the score adjustment except for the fact they seemed totally unaware of their responsibilities in these situations. They were also advised it is good practice not to explain the meaning of an Alerted call until requested.

Freilich (East) opened 2NT, which was passed out, and South led the ♣Q. Without the slightest hesitation, Freilich covered with the king, finessed the ♠Q and claimed his contract with five diamonds, two spades and a club.

Complimented by his partner, David Sokolow of Austin, Freilich responded with a twinkle in his eye: "You want to know how to play like a world champion? Sleep with one!"

Declarer deception -- life imitates art

As someone who has just published a book on declarer deception, I am always on the lookout for opportunities to persuade the defense to go wrong. Board 29 from Tuesday evening's game gave the East player an option to combine deception with good technique.

Most East-Wests reached 3NT on an unhelpful heart lead. Declarer obviously will win this in hand and should advance the ♦9, putting North in an awkward position. It would be a major error not to cover if the actual layout exists, but a disaster if declarer has ♦9-8-6 and partner the singleton 10 (remember this the next time you hold ♦9-8-6!) If North covers you can still succeed, but it requires some very good views.

If you win the diamond and play a spade to the jack or 9, you can then establish a long club -- duck a club, win the heart return in dummy and play a second club. North wins and plays a third heart, and you win in hand and duck a club. Now you take two spades, three hearts, two diamonds and two clubs for your contract.

month-old Tres, she's been caddying since age nine. Her parents -- John and Lora Parish, Hugh and Sandy Campbell -- are all active tournament players and Julie is a novice bridge player "when I get a chance. It's fun watching new people win -- they get so excited."

The other head caddy is Sandy Bippert of San Antonio, who began caddying about eight years ago when she was pregnant with her fifth child. "I have to go to work to get a vacation," she says, laughing.

She works all the Austin tournaments and most of the San Antonio tournaments. "The directors are fabulous, absolutely wonderful."

Then there's Carol Ure from Cambridge ON, who was working the Morning KOs and passed by a table as declarer was going set in a 6♦ contract. "You could have made that, you know," she said.

The player came back after the break, looked up Carol and said, "You're absolutely right. Would you like to play in the Open Pairs this afternoon?"

Unfortunately, Carol was already committed to caddying so she had to decline the invitation.

Sometimes caddies come in pairs. That was the case with Jack Killough of Oklahoma City and Bobby Sympton Jr. of Shawnee OK. The two qualified to represent District 15 in the North American Non-Life Master Pairs and decided to come a few days early.

"It was a good chance to make a dollar," said Jack. The two worked three sessions Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday and begin play in the North American Non-Life Master Pairs this afternoon.

Sometimes caddies work for a cause. Laina Heathman of Cedar Hill TX is a member of Sigma Phi Gamma, a social service sorority. She and her sorority sisters are working for Open Arms Home, a long-term shelter for battered women and children.

Other times caddies work as caddies, recorders -- even part of the set-up crews. That's the case

Speeding tickets for rude players

Only one thing bothers Jackie Matthews and that's rudeness to her caddies. In fact, two caddies went home after one session here because of players' rudeness.

To combat this rudeness, Matthews and her caddies have a plan. If people are rude or inconsiderate to the caddies, the caddies are free to issue speeding tickets.

Players who receive a ticket must attend caddy traffic school, and part of the curriculum includes caddying one session before the player is allowed to play bridge again.

The plan is only in the talking/planning stage but rude players should take note.

Matthews emphasizes that most players are polite and considerate to caddies "and we appreciate you and thank you."

In the first round of the Vanderbilt, Fred Gitelman and George Mittelman cooperated nicely to defeat what seemed like a comfortable partscore by their opponents.

On the lead of the ♠4 Gitelman put in the 10! Declarer won the queen, crossed to a top diamond and played a spade to the 9 and jack. Mittelman played a third trump, which Fred of course won, and he exited with a high diamond. Declarer took the king, pitching a heart, and played a club to the jack -- and George ducked!

Now declarer was dead. He had to lose three hearts, one club and two spades for one down. It probably did not improve declarer's mood when he realized he could have recovered from his bad guess in spades by ruffing the second diamond and setting up the clubs, playing for both hearts and clubs to split 3-3.

Laws Seminar set

A Laws Seminar is scheduled for Friday, March 14, from 9 a.m. until noon in Cascade Ballroom B.

National Tournament Director Roger Putnam will conduct the seminar. Subjects include interpretation of new laws and rulings on questions asked by participants.

Cost is \$25 and a certificate will be mailed to participants.

The seminar will become a regular feature -- the "Club Director's Refresher Course" -- beginning with the Summer NABC in Albuquerque. The course is scheduled for Monday, July 28. Cost is \$30 which includes a new Laws book.

Another Shipley

Another grandchild of Tournament Director Roberta Shipley is here at the tournament -- 7-year-old Laura Hamsher. She's here with her mother, Denise, who's in Dallas on business. She told a fib about her age, saying she was eight and a half, hoping that would be good enough to get her a job as a caddy. No such luck.

Board of Directors highlights

ACBL CONVENTION CARD. The new convention card is approved for testing. It will be reviewed by the Competition and Conventions Committee. After testing and review it will be presented for final approval at the Summer Board meeting.

NATIONAL SENIOR SWISS TEAMS. A two-day four-session National Senior Swiss Teams will be added to the Summer NABC. The event shall be held on Tuesday and Wednesday.

50TH ANNIVERSARY BERMUDA BOWL. The ACBL supports the World Bridge Federation's selection of Bermuda as the site for the 50th anniversary of the Bermuda Bowl.

NABC APPEALS COMMITTEE PROCEDURES AND GUIDELINES. Effective July 24, 1997 and after input from the C&C Committee and approval from the National Laws Commission, the Board will consider the following during the Summer meeting: In cases other than KO teams, where someone is found to have committed an offense that causes damage, a score adjustment is limited to one-fourth of a board or 3 IMPs, as appropriate, each way in equal amounts. Depending on the severity of the infraction, a procedural penalty shall be assessed to the offending side according to guidelines that will be submitted prior to approval. Additionally, if the Appeals Committee decides the appeal is unjustified, it will also assess a procedural penalty of one-fourth of a board or 3 IMPs, as appropriate.

NON-BOARD COMMITTEE MEMBERS. \$5000 is to be budgeted so the President may have non-Board members assist during Board committees at the 1997 Summer and Fall NABCs.

USE OF MID-CHART CONVENTIONS. The requirement for prior advertising for tournament use of the Mid-Chart in Flight A and brackets of KOs with a designator of 1,000 or more masterpoints is removed. The use of the Mid-Chart in those events is at the discretion of the sponsoring organization and must be posted at the tournament site if allowed.

ST. LOUIS STARTING TIMES. Starting times for the Fall NABC in St. Louis shall be as follows: morning events, 8:45 a.m.; early Senior events, 10 a.m. and 3 p.m.; other regional and national events, 12:30 and 7:30 p.m.; late events, 11:30 p.m.

REGIONAL RESULTS PUBLICATION. The Special Regional Edition of *The Bridge Bulletin* shall be discontinued after the publication of the May 1997 issue.

TRAINING COURSES. A series of training courses shall be created to (1) instruct unit and district officers on the duties and responsibilities of their positions; (2) educate them on existing ACBL programs available to them; (3) provide an opportunity to meet staff personnel face-to-face to discuss problems, ideas, etc. Management will provide a written evaluation report on these courses to the Board at the first opportunity.

COST ACCOUNTING PROGRAM. Management will incorporate a full cost accounting program for budgeting and financial management purposes. Implementation shall be as follows: (1) an estimated full cost analysis of tournament director expenses will be presented at the Summer meeting; (2) estimated full cost statements for the past three NABCs will be prepared by staff and copies mailed to Board members as soon as possible; (3) full cost accounting capabilities using the new accounting software will be accomplished by year's end.

CONDITIONS OF CONTEST INTERPRETATION. In interpreting Conditions of Contest, the statement, "Lack of knowledge does not constitute cause for exception" is considered to be part of each ACBL Conditions of Contest. As soon as can be completed by Management, this statement will be included in all Conditions of Contest.

FIRST-TIME MEMBERS. First-time new members may provide, from the preceding 12 months, club rating point receipts and/or references to points won at tournaments. Upon verification, the points won, to a maximum of 20, at clubs and/

or tournaments will be credited to the member's record upon joining the ACBL. No other masterpoint services will be provided to non-members.

GOODWILL COMMITTEE. A reception for all lifetime members of the Goodwill Committee will be held at each NABC (usually between sessions on Goodwill Day). The yearly catering budget shall be \$15,000.

CRUISE SHIP SANCTION FEES. Pricing for bridge cruises shall be left to the discretion of Management with the commitment of Management to implement the following guidelines until further notice: (1) whatever parties receive the sanctions will be expected, within the constraints placed upon them by the cruise lines, to promote the ACBL actively for the purpose of recruiting new members; (2) that the ACBL will not entertain exclusive fee-splitting agreements with any party; (3) a \$150 fee will be charged for sanctioning bridge on a ship for the entire year, with the ACBL providing promotional literature; (4) a \$100 fee will be charged for sanctioning bridge cruises of from 8 to 30 days; (5) a \$50 fee will be charged for sanctioning bridge cruises of from 1 to 7 days; (6) the ACBL will send a letter to each cruise line asking who within their organization has the authority to give approval to conduct bridge events on their cruises.

RENEWAL NOTICES. Management is authorized to conduct surveys via annual renewal notice mailings when and if they choose to do so.

AUDIT OF DISTRICTS AND UNITS. All units and districts are strongly urged to conduct an annual audit of their financial records.

THIRD PARTY HOUSING BUREAU. Management may use its discretion in contracting with a third party housing bureau for NABCs.

THE BRIDGE BULLETIN. There will be four 132-page and eight 148-page issues published annually. Management is directed to design a mock-up and/or prototype of a full magazine-sized *Bulletin* for presentation at the Summer meeting. The presentation is to include a cost analysis.








UNPAID LIFE MEMBERS. Management will transfer Life Members who have moved out of a unit to an unknown location or unpaid Life Masters who have had no contact with the ACBL for at least two years into a special "holding" unit, not associated with any of the 25 districts.

MULTI-MEETING CONTRACTS. Management may enter into multi-meeting agreements, i.e., agreements for two or more NABCs, with hotels in premier destination cities.

Bridge on Internet: intro to OKbridge

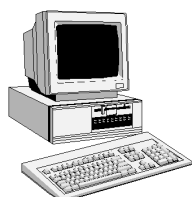

East led the ♣J and West overtook with the queen and shifted to a spade. Smith (North) won his ace and returned a club. Another spade came back and Smith won the king as East's queen dropped.

Smith ruffed a club in dummy and led the ♦K, covered and ruffed with the ♠7 (not the 3!)

Smith, reading the position perfectly, exited with the ♠3 -- giving West a spade trick but insuring an entry to dummy. (On this trick, East pitched a diamond -- a move he would later regret.) West could cash the ♥A and lead another heart -- or return a diamond. Either way, Smith had an entry to dummy and nine tricks for plus 140 and a near-top score.

Test yourself: a Vanderbilt quiz

It's not as if you should pay attention to my analyses -- I'm no longer playing in the Vanderbilt. But perhaps you'll agree that these are interesting problems:

1. Both vul, Dealer South. South holds:
♠ K Q J 9 8 7 5 ♥ -- ♦ Q J ♣ A Q 7 2

The auction so far has been:

2♣ was Michaels -- hearts and a minor; 4NT was "bid your minor." Your call.

2. Both vul, Dealer West. You are South, declaring 3♠ after this bidding:

♥ K Q 2
♦ K 5 4 3
♣ Q

*Negative double

LHO leads the ♦10 to the ace, and RHO cashes the ♥A and continues with the ♥10 to your ♥K. Plan the play.

3. E-W vul, Dealer East. You are South, defending 4♥:

♥ 5 2
♦ K Q 3
♣ A Q 10 3

♠ 7
♥ A 10 9
♦ J 10 7 5 4
♣ J 9 5 2

You lead your stiff spade, partner produces the ♠10, and declarer wins the ♠A. Declarer now leads ♥J from hand. Do you win or duck?

You should duck. Partner can't have two fast entries, so you can get only one ruff anyway. Partner wins the ♥Q and returns the ♠Q. Declarer puts on the ♠K, and it's your play.

Answers

1. Surely you gave no serious thought to defending 5♦ doubled. The opponents must have no less than a 9-card diamond fit (LHO promised at least 5 diamonds, and RHO must be at least 4-4 in the minors to bid 4NT), and you have 11 or 12 spades in your partnership. So you are going to compete to 5♠. But shouldn't you bid 5♥ on the way?

If over 5♠ they compete to 6♦ and North does not lead a heart, they either score 1540 (against a spade lead) or you collect only 500 (after a club lead, club ruff, heart ruff you're out of Schlitz), not

so good when you are entitled to 650 in 5♠.

2. RHO is known to have at least six diamonds and two hearts. To be trying for a heart ruff, RHO must have two or three spades (with four spades, RHO has a stiff club and would be trying for a club ruff; with a stiff spade you are going down and the bidding might also have been different). You also know LHO has the ♠A, the only significant card left.

So play two top spades, then cash your remaining heart honor (if RHO ruffs, you lose only the ♠A. You can ruff a diamond at leisure after knocking out the ♠A to throw your remaining diamond loser on the ♠K), cash the ♦K (if LHO ruffs claim again), then ruff a diamond, ruff dummy's last heart, and now lead your ♠Q. LHO can win the ♠A and cash the ♠Q but must now play a club to dummy's ♠K, allowing you to shed your last diamond. LHO's hand:

♠ Q 10 3 ♥ J 9 4 3 ♦ 10 ♣ A 10 5 4 3

3. From the spade play so far, you know declarer started with ♠A K 9 and that partner has a spade winner to cash. But from the bidding that means RHO is 3-6-0-4. If you ruff with ♥10 and lead a diamond, declarer ruffs out partner's ♦A, crosses to ♠A, pitches a spade on a diamond picture, ruffs a diamond, and leads a trump, claiming. If you ruff with ♥10 and return a club (you know partner has a singleton club), declarer leads ♦K from dummy, ace from partner, ruff, and now a trump leaves you on lead.

But the heart play tells you partner started with ♥K Q doubleton. So ruff with ♥A and return ♥10 to partner's ♥K, allowing pard to cash the ♠J for one down. Partner's hand:

♠ Q J 10 8 2 ♥ K Q ♦ A 9 8 6 2 ♣ 4.

Here's hoping you'd still be playing in the Round of 8!

West led the ♠Q and Roberts won the ace in his hand. He led a heart to dummy's ace, cashed the ♠A and ruffed a spade with the 9. Now he played a heart to the queen and ruffed a spade with his jack. When the ♠K fell, he drew the last trump with his king and claimed plus 1510.

At the other table, declarer won the ♠K and cashed the ♥A. He then played the ♦K-A and tried to ruff a third diamond low. East overruffed for down one and 17 IMPs to the McMahan team.

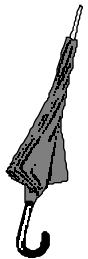

West "not only doubled me," said Silver, "but he got off to a devastating lead -- the five of hearts."

Looking at all four hands, we'd all play the ♥10 but naturally, Silver assumed split heart honors. No matter -- he had to get the clubs going. He won dummy's ace and led the ♣K.

West won and continued the heart attack by leading the queen. Silver won his king and cashed the ♣Q-J, pitching the losing heart from dummy. He was reasonably certain, based on the double, that spades were 4-1. If he led the ♠A-J, West could win his king or queen and force dummy to ruff a heart. Silver could return to his hand with the ♦A and lead a high club but West could ruff low. Silver could overruff in dummy but would have no way back to his hand to cash the long club.

Silver's solution? He led the ♠J! West could win his king or queen and force dummy to ruff a heart but Silver had the extra entry he needed.

He returned to his hand with the ♠A, leaving West with the king and a low spade. Now when Silver led a high club, West could ruff low and Silver could overruff and return to his hand with the ♦A.

If West ruffed with his king, Silver would simply discard dummy's losing diamond.

NAOP Flight B begins play today

Competition begins today in the North American Open Pairs Flight B, a grassroots event limited to players with 1500 masterpoints or fewer.

The first stage is conducted at the local club level and qualifiers advance to unit competition. Those qualifiers then advance to the district finals where at least two pairs qualify for the North American final.

The winners will have their names inscribed on the Baldwin Memorial Trophy and will also receive a certificate of recognition.

The trophy is presented in memory of Col. Russell J. Baldwin (1889-1969), army officer and expert on tournament procedure who was ACBL *Honorary Member of the Year* in 1943.

One of the leading American bridge personalities, he was active as an organizer from the earliest days of contract bridge and became a director and treasurer of the American Bridge League shortly after its founding in 1927.

A member of the ACBL Laws Commission (originally Committee) from its founding in 1933, Baldwin was primarily responsible for the first Duplicate Code issued in 1935. He played a considerable part in formulating subsequent codes.

He was the author of the McKenney-Baldwin schedules for Howell movements and constructed other movements.

His contributions to tournament procedure include the official ACBL method of dealing with fouled boards.

Baldwin was active as a tournament director from 1927 until 1941. After service in World War II, he was ACBL business manager from 1946 until 1951.

He was recalled to military serve at the outbreak of the Korean War and retired from the U. S. Army in 1957. He rejoined ACBL in 1958 and was in charge of tournament scheduling until his retirement in 1963.

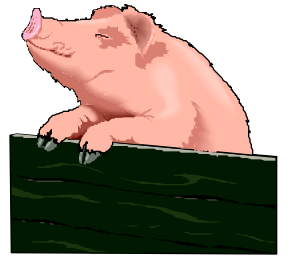

Board 30 of the Tuesday afternoon set of hands provided a good opportunity to focus on the critical issues of a hand.

The weak-two bid style we were playing just about guaranteed that partner would not have six hearts unless they were bad, and the diamond support figured to be at least three and probably four cards in the absence of a negative double. But enough attempts to justify my hand-hogging. 4♥ was easy, 5♦ more challenging.

On the lead of the ♠K you have to win and play the ♥K. You take the club return and ruff out the ♥Q. Then a spade ruff to dummy and run the ♦Q covered all around. What now?

Well, South surely has only two spades. The best line is to cash the ♦J now. When North shows out, simply play two more rounds of diamonds, throwing South the lead with the last one. South must give dummy the rest of the tricks.

If trumps are 3-2, again you can succeed easily. When you cash the next-to-last trump, South with a 2-4-3-4 shape gets squeezed without the count.

When Lair won the ♠Q and cashed his diamond winner, he collected plus 500 and SCHWARTZ had a win by 1 IMP!

Wernher Trophy rewards winners of Open Pairs II

The Wernher Trophy -- donated by one of the originators of the masterpoint system -- will reward the winners of Open Pairs II here at the Spring NABC in Dallas.

The trophy was donated in 1934 by Sir Derrick J. Wernher and presented to the winners of the National Men's Pairs Championship.

The event was contested at the Summer NABC until 1962 and subsequently at the Spring NABC. From 1969 through 1971, it was contested as a three-session championship.

In 1992 the event became Open Pairs II, a four-session event which consists of two qualifying rounds and two finals rounds.

Wernher (1889-1947) was a resident of London, England and Deal NJ. He succeeded to his title in 1912 and lived in the U. S. between the two world wars.

He served as British representative with the International Red Cross in Geneva during World War II and subsequently returned to London where he died.

A leading personality in American bridge in the Thirties, Wernher was one of the originators of the masterpoint system. He was president of the American Bridge League (ABL) in 1933, chairman of its Master Plan committee and a director of the American Whist League (AWL).

Wernher was also a player -- he placed second in the Asbury Challenge Teams in 1936 and won the Reisinger (played in conjunction with the New York regional) in 1930.

Women's Pairs compete for Whitehead Trophy

The Whitehead Trophy, donated by one of the world's greatest bridge authorities, will be awarded to the winners of the 67th annual Women's Pairs competition.

The trophy was donated in 1930 by Wilbur C. Whitehead of New York, a member of the team that won the Vanderbilt Cup in 1928, the first year it was in play.

Whitehead (1866-1931) was president of the Simplex Automobile Company, but bridge held such a fascination for him that he retired from business in 1910 to devote his whole life to bridge.

At the time, he was living in France, where he wrote his first book, *Royal Spades*. A second book was published in London in 1913.

His first book to appear in America was *Whitehead's Convention of Auction Bridge* in 1914.

He was the inventor of many of the outstanding conventions of bidding and play, the quick-trick table of card values, the Whitehead system of requirements for original bids and responses, and the Whitehead table of preferential leads.

Whitehead was instrumental in standardizing procedures in auction bridge and later in contract bridge.

The Women's Pairs was the first national event won by Helen Sobel Smith -- she was Helen White when she and Helen Bonwit won the title in 1934. Smith went on to win again in 1938 and 1939 with Sally Young.

The Women's Pairs was also the first national title for Edith Kemp Freilich, who as Edith Seligman won in 1941, 1942 and 1943 with Mae Rosen. Freilich also won with Sally Young in 1946, Virginia Heckel in 1966, her sister Anne Burnstein in 1979 and Nancy Gruver in 1986.

Kay Rhodes and Margaret Wagar hold the record for consecutive wins in the Women's Pairs -- they won in 1955, 1956, 1957 and 1958.

Open Teams event set for World Championship

The first-ever transnational World Championship Open Teams will take place in Hammamet, Tunisia, starting on Oct. 27. All teams will play four matches a day from Monday through Thursday, and either four or eight teams will qualify for the knockout playoffs. Teams that fail to qualify will play an additional two matches on Friday for placings.

If more than 20 teams made up of seniors enter, there will be a separate senior event. If there are fewer, there will be a special senior category within the Open Teams. There also will be special categories for all-woman and mixed teams as long as a sufficient number of such teams enter.

Highly artificial conventions will NOT be allowed.

Registration bags will be presented to all members of every team in the Open Swiss Teams.

The tournament will feature the Bermuda Bowl and the Venice Cup. The site is a magnificent hotel with three different levels ranging from budget to luxury. The hotel is located in a resort area with a beach front, so it will be worthwhile to make the trip a combined vacation and bridge event.

The official airline is Tunis Air. There will be special fares for North American players. At the moment the rates are not available, but they will be displayed in the *Bridge Bulletin* as soon as they are available.

Those who are interested in competing should contact the ACBL and make their wishes known. The ACBL is required to inform the World Bridge Federation concerning the ACBL's participants.

The entry fee for the Open Teams will be \$600, which works out to only about \$10 per player per session. This is an open event -- there are no restrictions and there are no quotas. Teams can be made up with players from different countries as well. Of course all entries are subject to WBF accreditation.
