Zero Tolerance Policy -- Be Nice!

To establish an atmosphere which promotes the enjoyment of bridge as both a competitive and a social game, the ACBL has adopted a policy of courteous behavior.

The ACBL stands for American Contract Bridge League and Always Courteous Behavior League. For tournaments to be fun, cooperation from all (players, organizers, officials, staff, volunteers) is necessary. Please report conduct that is unacceptable while keeping in mind that we must be tolerant of other people in general and bridge players in particular. Also, conduct that is especially outstanding or refreshing should be reported.

Commendable

- ✓ Being a good "host" or "guest" at the table
- ✓ Greeting others in a friendly manner
- ✓ Praising the bidding and/or play of the oppo-

nents

✓ Having two clearly complete convention cards readily available for the opponents (This is a regulation, not a nicety.)

Unacceptable

★ Badgering, rudeness, insinuations, intimidation, profanity, threats or violence

 Negative comments concerning opponents' or partner's play or bidding

* Gloating over good results

 Constant and gratuitous lessons and analyses at the table

★ Loud and disruptive arguing with a tournament director

Conditions revised for KO Teams

Effective immediately at this NABC, the General Knockout Team Conditions of Contest have been revised.

In knockout play, any player meeting the individual participation requirements will receive the full overall award earned by his team. However, the rules by which an individual player fulfills his participation requirement have changed.

To fulfill the participation requirement, a player must meet each of the following conditions:

1.For any given overall award, a player must play at least 50% of all the boards played by the team at the time he (and the team) earned that award. (As in previous editions of these conditions, no player may play in a match past a time when he is unable to meet this condition.)

ACBL Charity Foundation gives to two District 20 organizations

CASA (Court Appointed Special Advocations), a Portland OR child advocacy program, and the Assistance League of Reno/Sparks were presented \$2500 checks Thursday by the ACBL Charity Foundation.

Diane Cullen, one of the NABC co-chairmen, accepted a check from Foundation Trustee Don Moeller on behalf of CASA, a volunteer-based program whose advocates are trained community volunteers appointed by a judge to speak up for abused and neglected children in court.

The advocates serve as the eyes and ears of the judge and work alongside attorneys and social workers as appointed officers of the court.

The Assistance League works with juveniles as well as adults, said Peggy Etchemenedy, chairman of the organization's ways and means committee. She Continued on page 4

Sukoneck and Cole win close NAOP-A

Ron Sukoneck and Bill Cole, representing District 6, won a close victory Thursday in the North American Open Pairs Flight A. Their winning margin was 10.05 matchpoints on a 13 top.

In fact, the margin between first and fourth was only 17.32 matchpoints -- the closest finish in the 19-year history of the NAOP-A.

Sukoneck and Cole scored 407.37 -- the only pair to top 400 -- to 397.32 for runners-up Marshall Tuly and James Cunningham, who won the event in 1990. Third were Roger McNav-Troy Horton with 394.84.

followed by Steve Cohen-Beverly Rosenberg, 390.05.

Sukoneck describes the partnership as "a regular one that just plays locally" but they won the local competition and were on their way.

Sukoneck, a retired legal administrator and parttime bridge teacher, won the Men's Swiss Teams in 1988 and the Spingold in 1992.

An ACBL Grand Life Master and a World Bridge Federation World Master, he placed third in the Rosenblum Teams in 1990. He also represented the ACBL in world play in 1986 and in the Bermuda Bowl in Santiago. Chile in 1993.

Cole, an engineer for Bell Atlantic, won the Master Mixed Teams in 1982. He and Lynn Deas developed the Cole 2C Bid and Deas Over Notrump. He is *Continued on page 4*

Dick Shaver, ACBL's 1997 Goodwill Member of the Year, died at his home in Reno Jan. 24. He was

Longtime friend Sheila Wimer remembered Shaver as "working tirelessly to get people out to play pridge. When he moved to Reno, he saw the need for new blood and worked very hard getting the teachers nvolved in offering free bridge lessons. The people came and he was always there with donuts and enouragement for students and teachers alike.

"Many a club game saw him playing with these lewer players, encouraging them and -- as was alvays his aim -- having fun at the bridge table. Many time he would have his wife, Gloria, drive him to a lub game just so he could play with someone without a partner.

"How lucky those partners were and how pleased by were that they had a chance to play with him. u see, Dick was such

pleasant and enjoyable rtner everyone wanted play with him.

"Dick was a man of vision. It was his idea to old several newcomer games -- at reduced cost - at our sectional tournaments to get the newer olayers into the bridge vircle.

"He was always here with his truck to help move tables to the ournament site and back

to the bridge center after the tournaments. He was always helping with anything that needed to be done at the bridge center. A great friend to all and a man with great ideas who wasn't afraid to get involved and do whatever was needed."

Shaver was remembered as "one of the main forces in revitalizing the goodwill culture of our club" by Myrlen Ann Knafele, president of Unit 473 (Reno). "Part of this revitalization came out of the basic truth that Dick was a darn nice guy who helped new players."

In her letter nominating Shaver as Goodwill Member, Knafele continued: "Dick makes sure he plays a session or two a week with a new player. New players say to each other, 'Ask Dick!'

"As a direct result of Dick's energy and ideas, we now have a central bridge-playing facility."

Young players vie for second Silodor Trophy

Two of the youngest players ever to win a North American championship -- playing for the first time as a partnership -- will try for a second win in Open Pairs , which gets under way with two qualifying sessions today. The two-session final will take place tomorrow.

Eric Greco and Geoff Hampson scored 2602.19 matchpoints, the only pair to top 2600 points, in their win last year. It was the first NABC victory for Greco, a former King of Bridge who won the Youth Player of the Year masterpoint race (for players 19 and younger) five years in a row.

Hampson, a former Canadian who plays professionally, closed out his career as a Junior player in 1994 by winning the Junior Player of the Year title -- for the second time -- and the Gold Life Master of the Year title.

He won the North American Swiss Teams in 1992 and the Mixed Pairs in 1994.

Greco earned his side a good score on this deal:

East led the H6 to West's ace, and West returned the H2 as Greco won his gueen and discarded a low spade from dummy. Five rounds of diamonds followed. West followed to one round and discarded the S2, the C7 and two hearts.

Now Greco cashed the CA and exited with his HJ. West could cash two hearts and the SA but was forced to lead into dummy's CK J. Plus 150 was good for 62 of 77 matchpoints.

Silodor Trophy

The Silodor Trophy -- presented in memory of Sidney Silodor, winner of the Bermuda Bowl, the McKenney Trophy and more than 30 North American championships -- is awarded to the winners of Open Pairs I.

Silodor, a member of the team that won the first Bermuda Bowl World Championship in 1950, won the Vanderbilt eight times, the Spingold, the Open Pairs and the Master Mixed Teams three times each and the Mixed Pairs five times -- a record.

At the time of his death in 1963, Silodor was third on the list of all-time masterpoint holders with a to-

tal of 6,450 -- a figure great enough to hold that place until a year later when his total was surpassed by Norman Kay, who had been his regular partner.

Silodor was an original member of the Bridge Hall of Fame, elected in the Sixties when the institution was the province of its creator, The Bridge World magazine.

The trophy was presented in 1963 in memory of Silodor and made retroactive to include winners of the event, which began in 1958.

tournament director immediately. If you feel that there was a very serious breech of discipline, in addition to the resolution by the tournament director at the table, please discuss the problem directly with the Director-in-Charge of the tournament.

Should it become necessary to call a tournament director, you may simple state: "This player is interfering with my enjoyment of the game.

The director will then attempt to determine the facts. If he establishes there was unacceptable behavior. an immediate 1/4-board disciplinary penalty (3 IMPs in team games) shall be assigned to all offenders.

This may involve any one or all four players at the table, regardless of who initiated the unacceptable behavior. If both members of a partnership are guilty, the penalties are cumulative (1/4 board each =1/2 board or 3 IMPs *each* = 6 IMPs).

If it is determined that a second offense has occurred in the same event, the offender(s) shall be ejected from future competition in that event.

An offender removed from an event shall be deemed not to have played in the event, no masterpoints will be awarded and no refunds will be made.

In the case of a serious offense and in the case of multiple offenses (three) during a tournament, a disciplinary committee may determine whether the offender(s) should be allowed to play in other events at the tournament and/or whether additional sanctions may be appropriate.

Warnings are strongly discouraged and will be given only when there is no clear violation or in cases where the facts cannot be determined. Offenders are to receive immediate penalties. Regardless of who may have initiated unacceptable behavior, all offenses are punishable. Retaliatory behavior is a punishable offense. Frivolous accusations will also be considered as offenses under this policy. \Box

2.For any given overall award, a player must have played at least 50% of the boards in the match in which the team earned that award.

3.For a first-place award when the team wins the final, a player must also play at least 50% of the combined boards in the semifinal and final matches.

Combining the logic of conditions 2 and 3 means that a first-place award requires a player to play at least (a) 50% of each of the semifinal and final matches, or (b) all of the final match.

Players are reminded that a player may not enter any concurrent championship event while his team is participating in any match of the knockout.

In practice, this means that a player may miss an entire match without prior permission at any time during the event. However, depending on when a team is eliminated, a player who has sat out an entire match may not be awarded the overall position earned by the rest of his team members.

A chart listing the circumstances which will reduce an individual's position will be posted in the Knockout venues this week ...

a Diamond Life Master with many regional wins.

Play in the North American Open Pairs Flight A -- a grassroots event that began last summer at the local club level -- began Wednesday before the start of the Spring NABC in Reno.

Qualifiers at the club level advanced to unit competition and those qualifiers advanced to district finals. Two pairs from each district qualified for the North American final.

Winners in flights A and B will have their names inscribed on the Baldwin Memorial Trophy and will also receive certificates of recognition.

The trophy is presented in memory of Col. Russell J. Baldwin (1889-1969), U.S. Army officer and expert on tournament procedure who was ACBL Honorary Member of the Year in 1943.

One of the leading American bridge personalities, he was active as an organizer from the earliest days of contract bridge and became a director and treasurer of the American Bridge League shortly after its foundation in 1927

A member of the ACBL Laws Commission (originally Committee) from its foundation in 1933, Baldwin was primarily responsible for the first Duplicate Code issued in 1935. He played a considerable part in formulating subsequent codes.

He was the author of the McKenney-Baldwin schedules for Howell movements and constructed other movements.

His contributions to tournament procedure include the official ACBL method of dealing with fouled boards.

Baldwin was active as a tournament director from 1927 until 1941. After service in World War II, he was ACBL business manager from 1946 until 1951.

He was recalled to military serve at the outbreak of the Korean War and retired from the U.S. Army in 1957. He rejoined ACBL in 1958 and was in charge of tournament scheduling until his retirement in 1963. Winners and runners-up in the NAOP-A:
