Three other seeds bit the dust -- teams captained by Jo Ann Sprung, Susan Miller and Mary Jane Farrell. Taking their place in the Round of 16 (original entry of 34 teams) were teams captained by Rebecca Clough, Julie Rowe and Lois Lightner.

## First 30 seeds survive in Spingold

One hundred nineteen teams entered the Spingold Knockout Teams yesterday, and 64 of the squads have survived to today's round. The top nine seeds received byes in the first round of play.

The highest-seeded team to make an early exit was the #31 squad of Steve Levinson, Joyce Sillins, Glenn Eisenstein, Jonathan Greenspan, Mark Molson and David Better. They were defeated by a team of Swedish Junior players (see story below) by a score of 204-153.

Each match is a 64-board contest. Play in the event will continue through Sunday.

ior team, while others have been to the U.S. before to play in previous NABCs.

There is even the possibility that the six young men will be allowed to play in the U.S. Junior Team Trials scheduled to begin Saturday.

# Searching for a Queen

While the Spingold entries were being seeded and the Life Master Pairs was concluding in a photo finish, I was sitting in the South chair of the last round of the Swiss Teams playing my heart out for fourth place. It's moments like these when you have to stop yourself and ask, "Why am I here?" Fortunately, we bridge players don't do this -- otherwise we might never locate the queen.

The auction can be explained. I opened 1♣ in third chair and over 1♠ decided to keep the bidding alive with 1NT, because if partner held ♠A-Q-x-x-x and ♥Q-x-x-x-x, we were on a finesse for a game. Don't ask why I thought of this (my wife has long since stopped asking). My partner raised, and now I considered bidding 3NT with my good spot cards. But I passed. (This is the trouble with my game -- I don't follow through.)

West led a heart, and from the looks of dummy it was a "one-or-three" hand (similar to a "five-or-seven" hand -- if the finesse works you make two extra tricks and you're a damn fool if you're trying to score 500 or 1,000 points less by being in two or five). In other words, I had three spade tricks, two hearts, and two top clubs: seven tricks. If I located the ♣Q, I probably had nine tricks, not just eight.

But I was in TWO notrump, not three, so the stakes were that much smaller.

I put up the ♥10 and let the queen hold. East returned a heart to my ace and I led the ♠J. East quickly won and returned his last heart. I won and cashed my spades as West discarded a club and then a diamond, not without first making a comment, "Oh." Oh. I wondered what that meant. He was a top-notch player and there's nothing I love better than trying to decipher those top-notch "oh's". Now where was the ♣Q? I had pitched a club on the fourth spade (I wanted to make sure I'd make only eight tricks if I did manage to guess the queen -- didn't want to feel bad about making nine in 2NT).

Time to count. What were the cards the opponents had been forced to reveal so far? West showed two spades and five hearts. East showed four spades and three hearts. Curses, seven known cards for each of them. Indeed, it looked as if West might have started with 2-5-3-3 and East with 4-3-3-3. There was not much to go on there. Then I heard West muttering something again.

In my experience the person who makes sounds at the table generally does not have the queen, and the silent one does. On the other hand, these two were high-class gentlemen and, therefore, capable of using reverse psychology on me. In the meantime, I apologized for taking so long and West said, "Oh, never mind, it's OK," while East said, "It's OK." Again, note East's brevity.

How would my students play it? I thought. (Or, what do I teach them?) Well, play the hand with longer clubs for the queen. But I can't find the longer clubs.

Another idea I teach is to lead the jack. If East doesn't cover, win the king and finesse back the other way. This is a strategy reserved for lesser opponents, however. Another thought is "queen over jack." After all, we did deal these cards ourselves. I wondered

if there was any merit to this -- actually I've been wondering about the merit of this concept for years. Then I realized it had been at least two or three minutes and I still hadn't played a card. I realized it more when West spoke up again, saying, "If he misguesses now, he'll really look bad."

Those were fighting words. Good grief, what pressure! I began to sweat. I had to find the thing now. But there were no clues -- no clues! I took a deep breath. Why was I there? Why was I so concerned about finding this stupid queen? Why when my four-year-old boy loses his stuffed dog, I search for about a minute and then give up, telling him to go to bed without it. But now, when the stakes are so much less, why am I so desperately trying to locate a queen!

Then I had a great thought. Where was the board played at the other table? If it was 3NT, South will almost certainly finesse clubs by leading the ace and playing the jack. That way he takes four club tricks easily for nine winners. Therefore, if the queen is on my right, and I score 120 in my precious 2NT contract, I will achieve minus 480 points (600 - 120) for my brilliance. I must, by this sound reasoning, assume the ♣Q is with talky on my left (even though I don't believe it is, psychologically speaking), so that he (my counterpart at the other table) will be down one in 3NT while I will score 120 and earn 6 IMPs for my team.

So I led the ♣J (ala my class notes), East played low, I went up with the king and finessed the 10 the other way. It won! Ecstasy! I tabled my cards. Plus 120. Put me in a straight jacket, but I felt wonderful.

A final thought: They played 1♠ at the other table, making four after a club lead, and that made mince-meat of my analysis. But I did hold the loss on the board to 2 IMPs. And we did manage a tie for fourth overall. And, most important, it's the next day and I still feel great about finding the queen. This is why bridge is a fantastic game. Nevertheless, I'm sure that locating my four-year-old's stuffed dog is more important. Maybe I will try harder to look for it next time.

# BAZE begins defense of Spingold championship

The team captained by Grant Baze returns -- almost intact -- to defend the Spingold title they won last year in Albuquerque, defeating teams captained by Nick Nickell in the semifinal and Jimmy Cayne in the final.

Regular Baze partner Tipton Golias, who won his first major title in last year's Spingold, will not be on hand here in Chicago. Golias, founder of Helena Laboratories, a \$100 million company whose primary business is blood analyzers, is attending a medical conference.

Another regular partner, Michael Whitman, will play with Baze. Their teammates will be Polish professionals Adam Zmudzinski, Marek Szymanowski, Marcin Lesniewski and Cezary Balicki.

BAZE won last year's Spingold by knocking off NICKELL, the clear favorite to win their fifth straight Spingold, 162-129. They eliminated CAYNE in the final 152-116.

## Spingold repeats

Nickell's all-star squad is the only team to win four consecutive Spingolds. Nickell and teammates Richard Freeman, Jeff Meckstroth, Eric Rodwell, Bob Hamman and Bobby Wolff won in Washington DC in 1993, San Diego in 1994, New Orleans in 1995 and Miami Beach in 1996.

The only four-man team to win two consecutive Spingolds -- Canada's all-time greats Eric Murray, Sami Kehela, Bruce Elliott and Percy Sheardown -- won in Toronto in 1964 and Chicago in 1965.

C.C. Wei's original Precision Team came close in 1970-71. Tom Smith, Steve Altman, Joel Stuart and Peter Weichsel won with David Strasberg in Boston in 1970. With Gene Neiger replacing Strasberg, they took the championship in Chicago in 1971.

Jimmy Cayne, Chuck Burger, Hamman, Wolff, Mark Lair and Mike Passell won the Spingold in Chicago in 1989 and defended their title successfully in Boston in 1990, with Lew Stansby and Chip Martel replacing Lair-Passell.

## History of the Spingold

The Spingold Master Knockout Teams, first known as the Challenge Knockout Teams, was contested for the Asbury Park Trophy in the early days.

The runner-up team in the regularly-scheduled portion of the event had the right to challenge the winners to a playoff. This right was never utilized.

In 1934, 1936 and 1937, the Masters Teams-of-Four and the Asbury Park Trophy were separate events, providing two sets of winners.

In 1938 the event became the Spingold Master Knockout Teams and a part of the Summer NABC.

At one time, the Spingold was a double elimination event usually lasting nine or 10 sessions. It was scored by International Match Points and was restricted to players with 100 or more masterpoints.

In 1965, the double elimination method was replaced by three qualifying sessions (subsequently reduced to two), followed by single elimination knockout matches. The preliminary qualifying session were dropped in 1970.

The Spingold Trophy, donated by Nathan B. Spingold in 1934, and the Vanderbilt Trophy, awarded to the winners of the Vanderbilt Knockout Teams at the Spring NABC, are ACBL's most highly prized trophies.

Spingold (1886-1958), a New York publicist, motion picture executive and patron of the arts, was one of the most influential men in bridge administration from 1937 to 1943.

Born in Chicago, he became a reporter on *The Chicago Examiner*, *The Chicago Record Herald* and *The Chicago Tribune*. Spingold's interest in show business brought him to New York City in the Thirties.

In 1932 he joined Columbia Pictures in a public relations capacity. He was named to the board of directors in 1940 and three years later was appointed vice president in charge of advertising, publicity and development. He became a vice president of the company in 1954.

Active in bridge from its earliest days, Spingold was named ABL Honorary Member in 1936. He was instrumental in effecting a peaceful merger between the American Bridge League and the United States

Bridge Association in 1937 and became president of the newly formed American Contract Bridge League the following year.

He served for many years on the League's Board of Governors and Board of Directors. Spingold was also president of the Cavendish Club in New York.

## Bean: Mad, Mad World of Bridge

Players in the Red Ribbon Pairs will compete for the Percy X. Bean Trophy, which honors the 1972 ACBL president and longtime champion of less-than-expert players.

Bean (1916-1992) represented District 19 on the Board of Directors from 1964 until 1988 and served as president of the ACBL Charity Foundation from 1974 until 1981. He was a member of the ACBL Goodwill Committee and the National Board of Governors and general chairman of arrangements for the World Team Olympiad in Seattle in 1984.

Bean and his wife Anne were named ACBL Honorary Members for 1992, the first time that honor was bestowed on a husband-wife combination.

Bean was the editor of *Mad, Mad World of Bridge*, a publication that strongly championed players of less than expert class.

Here's a sample:

*A couple was playing and having a bad night. By the time they got to the last table, Charlotte had taken about all the lessons she could stand and when Bob started in again, she rushed away from the table in tears.*

*Bob and his two opponents sat for a while in silence and then Bob said, "Sorry, fellows, but the state my wife is in, she may not return at all. Just to get this last board over with, why don't we leave my wife's cards in the board and I'll bid both of our hands. Charlotte's hand will remain concealed until the bidding is over."*

*Play progressed to the last three cards. The lead was in dummy, three tricks had been lost and the next play was crucial. Bob studied a moment then led, fished and lost for down one.*

*About this time Charlotte had regained her composure in the ladies' room and decided she would finish the tournament if it killed her.*

*She returned to the table at the same moment Bob had to make the critical play. When it failed, he looked up at her accusingly and said, "You just couldn't pass three hearts, could you?"*

*Our good friend Bob had the good fortune to play an event with his good friend Lew Mathe. Bob wasn't awestruck or anything but playing with such an international star gave Bob a case of nervous prostitution.*

*After flubbing six or seven hands, and suffering the tortures of the damned Bob misplayed still another. He looked up at his partner and groaned, "Oh God."*

*Lew, with just a note of pity in his voice, replied, "You can call me Lew."*

## Thinking back to '97 as Senior Swiss starts

The team captained by Harry Ross took advantage of a hefty carryover to win last summer's first-ever NABC Senior Swiss Teams by a fraction of a Victory Point.

Ross was playing with Jerry Gaer and their teammates were Helen and John Gustafson, Marilyn Hemenway and Mike Albert.

They scored 118.94 VPs to 118.48 for Steve Lawrence, Bob Luebke, Ed Groner and Richard Holmes.

Going into the final round, Ross and company were in the lead with 104.9 VPs. The Lawrence team was second with 101.5. Ross won by 10 IMPs, giving them 14 VPs. Lawrence did better, winning by 17 IMPs, but it was not enough. They needed to win by 20 or more IMPs to take the championship.

Ross benefited from a carryover from the first two qualifying sessions of 13.94 VPs. The Lawrence squad's carryover was 8.48.

This deal contributed to the winning team's only blitz of the day. Considering their slim margin of victory, the blitz was needed.

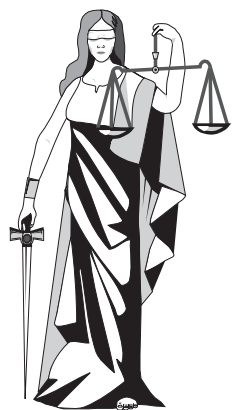

**The Appeal:** E/W appealed the Director's ruling and were the only players at the hearing. E/W stated that the auction had indicated probable extra values and it would be safe to play at the five level. The West hand had a superb minimum (8 HCP, but two aces) for the auction.

**The Committee Decision:** The East hand was minimum for its previous bidding and had a probable wasted ♠K. This player, mis-evaluating his values, might well have bid the 27% slam, but Law 16 made allowing further action after the break in tempo inappropriate. The contract was changed to 4♥ made six, plus 680 for E/W.

became primarily a social player. "I'll do anything I can to stop such bad experiences so that people who try duplicate will find it the thrilling game that it is."

Aileen Osofsky, chairman of the Goodwill Committee and mistress of ceremonies for the meeting, told about the efforts that are being made to bring the American Bridge Association and the ACBL closer together.

Aileen also told of the youngster who plays bridge every chance he gets. When his father was asked how well the boy keeps his grades up, the father replied, "If he doesn't do his chores and doesn't get good grades, he can't go to bridge games and he can't play bridge on the Internet."

"I can't believe how much improvement in behavior there has been in my area of California since Zero Tolerance was instituted," said Alan LeBendig. He strongly believes that directors should give more penalties and fewer warnings -- "the penalty IS the warning," he believes. He expressed his gratitude to Barbara Seagram for coming up with the idea.

Several friends spoke about Bobbie Shipley before Bobbie took the podium. The first was Tom Quinlan, with whom she has been working in the tournament head office for many years. Tom likened their work together to a bridge partnership.

District Director Harriet Buckman called Bobbie her mentor and her adviser. "Bobbie is one of the most capable persons I have ever had the pleasure of knowing." Noting that, as a Board member, she has the right to appoint members to the Goodwill Committee, Harriet announced that her first appointee will be Bobbie Shipley.

Daily Bulletin editor Henry Francis told how he and Bobbie used to arrange their days off together when Henry was a director so that they could play bridge together. "She could play a mean game of bridge," Henry said. He also told about her extensive family -- seven children and 21 grandchildren. Thirteen have worked as caddies -- enough to staff a good-sized regional tournament.

In Texas, where she works a good part of the winter, she is known as Bobbie Sue, Henry revealed. "Texans think Bobbie doesn't sound Texan enough," he said. Dean, Bobbie's husband, is known as Bubba Dean.

Tournament Director Stan Tench recalled the day many years ago when Bobbie showed up at his club in Ottawa. Stan had the privilege of introducing Bobbie to duplicate bridge.

Husband Dean remembers Bobbie as "a lady who really knew how to play cards." He used to play cards with Bobbie's grandfather, and finally one day he asked her for a date. "Cards brought us together," he said, "cards have kept us together. I have something that no one else in this room has -- a true romantic love for Bobbie."

## From the depths to the heights with our new CEO

It happened on the very first hand David Silber played after he became out CEO. He was doubled on the first hand of the Charity Pairs last Thursday evening, and he went down six vulnerable tricks -- minus 1700. He looked across at partner George Retek and said, "Does Zero Tolerance include tolerance for zeroes?"

It got a lot better after that -- they wound up with 53%, and there was no further need for tolerance of zeroes. The most exciting deal was the following.

Retek echoed the ACBL's confidence in our new CEO by redoubling, a rare action in matchpoint pairs. Here's how David scaled the heights.

He won the ♥K opening lead and took an immediate finesse to the ♣Q. When he led a diamond, West climbed with the king and failed to find the killing switch to a trump. Instead he tried to cash a heart, ruffed by David. He cashed the top diamonds and ruffed another heart. Next came the ♣A and a club ruff. When that worked he ruffed still another heart. He still had a natural trump as well. Count them up -- one heart, two diamonds, two clubs, three heart ruffs and a club ruff and a trump -- that adds up to 10 -- plus 1080.

That's the right direction -- from the bottom to the top.

## The ace of diamonds



Dave Treadwell tells us that the ace of diamonds was a key card in two incidents that took place Sunday.

Against 3NT Dave had six hearts to the ace-king and the doubleton ♦A. He led his fourth-best heart, and partner discarded a diamond. He suddenly discovered he had a heart, so the diamond became a penalty card. When he won a trick later on, of course he had to play his penalty card. That let Dave win his ace, cash his hearts and beat the contract three tricks.

Two hands later David's partner led a diamond out of turn. After hearing his options, the declarer decided to demand a diamond lead. So Dave led the ♦A and continued the suit. Believe it or not, his partner ruffed!
