Dress up tonight! Tonight is the night to look your best. The first Saturday evening of each North American tournament is special because it is the one night when the players come to the table dressed to the nines. Carry on the tradition!

Starting times for the Summer North American Championships in Anaheim have been set. Anaheim will have the same starting times as used in Boston. Generally afternoon sessions will begin at 1 p.m. and evening sessions at 7:30 p.m.

Today is Junior Day and Junior players are invited to dinner and a short meeting from 5-7 p.m. in the Wellesley Room at the Marriott.

Win cash and points in the Jackpot Pairs which will be held Monday, November 22, concurrently with the Stratified Open Pairs. There will be a cash prize for first and second overall in Flight A only, as well as cash prizes for section tops in Flight A (for those pairs not receiving an overall cash prize). Member's entry fee is \$90 per pair (\$44 regular entry fee plus \$46 for the prize pool).

We need caddies! Want to make a few bucks? NABC Caddy Master Jackie Matthews reports that she needs caddies for all games. Interested individuals should contact Matthews in the Brandeis Room, in the Marriott, 3rd level next to the UMass Exhibit Hall.

Important notice! The mall that connects the Marriott and the Westin closes each night at 2 a.m.

All-day parking is available on weekends, Thanksgiving Day and the day after Thanksgiving for only \$8 at the John Hancock parking garage. You must get your parking ticket validated at the Hospitality Desk at either hotel. Validation hours: 10:30 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. and 6:15 p.m. to 7:30 p.m. at either hotel each day. There is a \$6 rate after 5 p.m. – validation is necessary. The John Hancock garage is two blocks from the Marriott on Clarendon Street on the right-hand side, one block past the Hard Rock Café.

Excellent attendance was the order of the day yesterday. We broke the 700 mark in both the afternoon (718 tables) and the evening (715 tables). Total attendance to date is 1813 tables as compared to the estimate of 1492 tables.

Glenn Smith is 2000 ACBL president

District 8 representative Glenn Smith of St. Louis was elected 2000 ACBL president in Board meetings earlier this week.

Smith has served District 8 on the ACBL Board of Directors for six years, and has been ACBL treasurer for the past four years. He has also served a three-year term on the ACBL Charity Foundation. Smith has been active in his home unit (143) where he has served on the unit board as treasurer.

Smith is a graduate of St. Louis University, where he earned a B.S. degree in marketing from the School of Commerce and Finance. He worked 36 years for Laclede Gas Company in St. Louis, specializing in accounting, tax and finance. Smith retired in 1992 as Senior Vice President of Finance.

A Gold Life Master, Smith began playing bridge in college in 1952.

Smith and his wife Marjorie have been married for 45 years. They have five children.

Also, the Board elected Jim Kirkham, District 22, to the newly-created position of Vice President.

A full interview with Smith will appear in the January issue of The Bridge Bulletin.

Charity Foundation reelects Anderson

Virgil Anderson, District 15 representative to the ACBL Board of Directors, has been reelected president of the ACBL Charity Foundation. Jayne Thomas is the new vice president, and Don Moeller will serve as secretary-treasurer.

Louis Greenwood was elected to a three-year term as trustee, replacing Jim Zimmerman. Howard Piltch will serve a one-year term as the replacement for Glenn Smith, who resigned to take over duties as ACBL president in 2000.

The foundation made several grants: \$10,000 to United Cerebral Palsy of Midsouth; \$5000 to VZV, a research foundation; \$20,000 to the Emily Dorfman Foundation for Children.

Defending champions top qualifiers in LM Open Pairs

The husband-wife pair of JoAnna and Lew Stansby, winners of the 1998 Life Master Open Pairs, lead the 1999 edition of the event after the qualifying round. The Stansbys topped the field of 444 pairs with a score of 1672.84.

The European pair of David Levey, France, and Mike Goldsmith, England, were second, trailing the Stansbys by some five matchpoints.

In third, with a score of 1630.33 are Midwesterners Tom Kniest and Don Stack. Rounding out the list of qualifiers who scored in excess of 1600 matchpoints are Perry Johnson – Jeff Meckstroth and Jeffrey Blond – Ranald Davidson.

The two final sessions of the event will be played today.

Internationalists top LM Women's qualifiers

If you want evidence that the NABCs attract the best players from all over the world, look no further than the 1999 Life Master Women's Pairs. The Chinese pair of Ya Lan Zhang and Ling Gu led the pack of 167 entrants after the qualifying round with a score of 2476.54.

In second with a score of 2410.59 was the Venezeulan-Japanese partnership of Morella Pacheco and Ayako Amano.

The top-scoring North American pair was Kitty Munson and Carol Simon, while fourth place was occupied by another pair from China, Zhuang Yu and Wang Wen Fei.

In fifth are the New Jersey duo of Lisa Berkowitz and Joann Glasson.

The event concludes today.

New York pair leads Non-Life Masters

Buoyed by a large first session, the pair of Aviv Shahaf and Igor Sauchenko, both of New York City, lead the Non-Life Master Pairs with a score of 786. Close behind with 783.18 are Ryerson Schwark, West Linn OR, and Andrew Binstock, San Carlos CA.

Anaheim to feature new event -- Fast Pairs

The Anaheim Summer North American Championships will feature the Fast Open Pairs as an experimental NABC+ event. The Fast Pairs has been a popular secondary event at North American Bridge Championships for many years.

In Anaheim, the Fast Open Pairs will consist of two qualifying sessions on Thursday and two final sessions on Friday of the second weekend. It will run opposite the NABC IMP Pairs.

The Fast Open Pairs sessions will begin at 1:00 and 4:30 p.m. The IMP Pairs will be staged at the usual times, 1:00 and 7:30 p.m. In the Fast event, only 11 minutes will be allowed for each two-board round.

District 7 on a roll

District 7, the leader for three straight years in funds collected during ACBL's Junior Month, is challenging other districts to match their participation in attendance and contributions during ACBL's fourth annual Junior Month, scheduled for February 1999.

"For the last two years, District 7 players have led ACBL in contributions to the Junior program," noted District 7 director Bruce Reeve. "Junior Month is an excellent way to contribute to this worthwhile cause voluntarily and to win more masterpoints, supporting something very worthwhile for the future of bridge. District 7 intends to work hard to lead ACBL again and we invite other districts to meet our challenge."

Junior Month is scheduled at clubs throughout the ACBL -- and for just \$1 extra, all players will be eligible to win masterpoints at sectional rating.

Clubs may run as many Junior Fund games as they have sanctioned sessions. Games may be reported on ACBLscore or a special reporting form included in a December mailing.

In addition, clubs may now schedule up to four Junior Fund games every month. For more information, contact Charlotte Blaiss, ACBL Junior Programs coordinator, at (901) 332--5586 Ext. 214.

Proceeds from this year's games will fund Junior Bridge Camps and Junior team training. Canadian funds will go toward CYBORG (Canadian Youth Bridge Organization).

Last year's Junior Month games raised \$25,610 for Junior Bridge Camp and for other Junior projects in the U.S. and Canada. Games were played at 286 sites where 6166.5 tables were in play.

District 25 history

District 25 was formed in 1972 and consists of the six New England states -- Connecticut, Maine, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, Rhode Island and Vermont.

Planning for the new district began in 1970 when the ACBL Board of Directors voted to form two Canadian districts out of Quebec, the Maritimes and Ontario with the U.S. portions of Districts 1 and 2 becoming District 25.

Bill Keohane was elected the District Director with Monroe Magnus as First Alternate and Ed Gould as Second Alternate. Keohane, who was to serve a one-year term, died in September 1972, shortly before he was to have attended his first board meeting. Magnus therefore assumed the office of District Director and Gould became the First Alternate.

Gould won election the following year and represented District 25 on the Board of Directors from 1973 to 1991. He was ACBL president in 1990 and Chairman of the ACBL Board in 1991.

Gould, chairman of most New Hampshire tournaments for about 30 years, did not seek reelection in 1991.

District 25's present director, Howard Piltch of Andover MA, took office in 1992 and is now serving his third term. He was ACBL president in 1997 and Chairman of the Board in 1998.

Piltch and his wife, Barbara, are co-chairs of this Fall NABC.

Westcott was NE's leading player

Frank Westcott of North Attleboro MA, who had served as ACBL president in 1960 while the District Director for District 1, was named ACBL Honorary Member for 1968. He was non-playing captain of the North American team in the 1961 world championship and the U.S. team in the 1964 Olympiad.

Westcott, Life Master

#152, was New England's highest masterpoint holder at the time of his death.

Combine your chances

While a fair percentage of the E-W field reached 4♠ on this deal, with mixed success, 2♠ was a sensible partscore.

Board 12 **♦** J 10 4 Dlr: West **♥** A 10 4 Vul:N-S **♦** J 8 2 ♣ A 10 8 4 **♦** 8 5 **♠** A K 7 6 3 2 **♥** Q 5 **♥** 8 3 **♦** K 10 9 6 **♦** A Q 3 ♣ KQ932 **♦** 0 9 **♥** KJ9762 **♦** 7 5 4 **♣** 6 5

The ♣6 was the usual lead from South, and declarer usually put up the king to muddy the waters. When North takes the ace, he has the problem of whether to play for a ruff or to cash the hearts. It looks reasonable to return a club, I think.

Now declarer takes the ♣J and has to decide what to do next. Obviously he has two potential winners in dummy for his heart losers. If diamonds are 3-3 he might emerge with 11 tricks, but if he plays for 11 he might finish with only nine winners. For example, if he tests diamonds and the suit is 4-2, he might not get the club discard in time.

The best play is to enlist the opposition's help by leading the ♦Q before cashing the ♠A-K. Both defenders can be relied on to give count, assuring their partner has the A, and when the suit seems to be 3-3, declarer can cash the top spades, unblock the diamonds and follow up with the $\clubsuit Q$. When the same hand is long in both black suits, declarer can get both his hearts away for a valuable extra trick.

How low can you go?

What's the cheapest overcall you can make? 1♦, right? Not according to Dave Treadwell who reports that he made a 1 vercall at the recent Lancaster Regional.

"My right-hand opponent opened 1♣," said ACBL Hall-of-Famer Treadwell, "but I didn't see the bid card. So I 'overcalled' 1♣. LHO now bid 1♠. My partner, who was confused for some reason, called the director who instructed us to continue the auction since LHO accepted my 1♣ call. So partner passed, and RHO bid 2♠ which ended the auction."

The result?

"My 1♣ call got partner off to the lead of the ♣K from K-x. Later, he was able to get a clubruff to beat 2♠ one trick."

Bid Box Alerts and Announcements

When using bid boxes, ACBL suggests that players tap the Alert strip and say "Alert" at the same time.

When making an announcement, use the announcement word -- such as "transfer" -- and tap the Alert strip at the same time.

A player who Alerts or announces a bid should make sure his opponents are aware that an Alert or announcement has been made.

An awkward problem

Many #3 seeds were confronted with a very awkward problem on the first deal of the Charity Pairs. A typical auction:

West	North	East	South
			2♦
2♥	Pass	3♣	Pass
3NT	Pass	6♥	All Pass

Holding a flat 7-count, you dutifully lead a low diamond. This is what you see:

Dummy **♠** A 9 7 6 **♥** A 5 4 **\Delta** ---♣ KJ7642 **★** K 10 8 5 **♥** K 7 6 **♦** J 8 7



Declarer ruffs the first trick and leads a low heart to the 10. Over to you!

Well, at least one many-time U.S. champion diag-

nosed the position, figuring declarer for **♦** Qx **♥** Q109xx **♦** Axxx ♣ Ax.

He decided the time was right for a dramatic shift to the king of spades, dislodging declarer's last sure entry to dummy. Declarer would win the ace of spades, unblock in trumps, then cross to the ace of clubs. Next he would draw the last trump and finesse in clubs -- and go down two! However, this was the actual deal:



Alas, as you can see, West had got just about everything right except for the location of the minor black- suit honors. As the cards lay, declarer could follow the same line, but he would emerge with 12 tricks at the end of the day as the club suit ran for six tricks.

There is a winning defense of course-- duck the king of hearts! Now with the defense all set to cash the diamond ace, declarer can draw trumps and the hand falls to pieces.

There is actually more to the hand than that, as was apparent at our table. Assuming North can apply the brakes in 4♥, on a low diamond lead declarer could pitch a club (not a spade, which gives the game away) at trick one. East should nonetheless win the ace of diamonds and shift to spades. Now declarer has to guess very well to realize 11 tricks. He wins the spade ace, crosses to the club ace and advances the heart queen. If this is not covered, declarer can draw a second trump and then turn his attention to clubs for 11 tricks easily enough.

But if North covers the heart queen with the king (a very unnatural looking play), I do not think West can bring home more than 10 tricks, can he?


Boston hosts fourth NABC

This Fall NABC is the fourth held in Boston and hosted by the ACBL and District 25. Previous NABCs were held in the summer: 1970, 1981 and 1990.

Here's a look back at the 1990 tournament which drew a total of 15,325 tables.

Duck, Part I

Eddie Wold lured declarer into taking a second, disastrous diamond finesse on this deal from the Life Master Pairs.



(1) Transfer to spades.

The opening lead was the ♥K. Declarer won and took the diamond finesse. East (Wold) ducked smoothly. He ducked again when a spade was led from dummy.

Declarer won the ♠K, cashed the ♣A and ruffed a club to lead another spade. Wold won the ♠A and led a

Ethel Keohane, the grande dame of New England bridge and the ACBL Honorary Member for 1982, was a champion player, administrator and a major force for goodwill.

She was the first New England player named to the National Goodwill Committee. Her appointment came in 1955 when New England was still a member of District 1.

**Nachana* (1901, 1905) get her stort in bridge has

Keohane (1901-1995) got her start in bridge because her husband Bill played duplicate regularly and she decided to find out why he found it so enchanting. She bought a Culbertson book, studied it and ventured forth into duplicate in 1939.

When Eddie Marcus, one of the top players of that time, told her, "You have the makings of a fine bridge player," Keohane decided to take the game seriously. She became Life Master #151 in 1949. During her six decades of play, she earned status as a Grand Life Master while amassing more than 12,000 masterpoints.

She served as secretary of the Eastern Massachusetts Bridge Association, as assistant chairman of the National Goodwill Committee and was on the executive board of the New England Bridge Conference.

In 1981, Keohane survived a car accident that killed her partner and good friend, Ida Bennett. Almost every bone in her body was broken and doctors, who at first didn't expect her to live, told her she would never walk again.

Daily Bulletin editor Henry Francis recalled Keohane's determination in a 1995 story. "When my wife and I visited her in the rehabilitation hospital in

the summer of 1981, we had to follow Ethel around as she worked on strengthening her legs – she never stopped moving during the hour and a half we were with her," Francis wrote.

"First she advanced to a walker and then to a cane. Finally she was able to walk without any artificial aids."

Keohane was honored at the Spring NABC in Atlantic City in 1991 when March 12

g y 2 odwill Day Honoring Ethel

5a

was designated Goodwill Day Honoring Ethel Keohane.

Keohane, who would celebrate her 90th birthday later that month, walked unaided to the microphone, thanked her friends and announced that she would continue as a regular on the tournament circuit.

"She never stopped playing bridge," noted Francis in 1995. "As soon as she could move, she was back at the bridge table – winning more often than not. She was the only woman in the history of New England bridge to win more than 10,000 masterpoints. She was still playing bridge less than a week before she died."

Remembering Alberta

Albersheim was an attorney and her husband, Dr. Walter Albersheim, was an electronics engineer. They had two natural children and adopted six foreign children who came to the United States to study.

open up this game," he said. "Individuals are exciting, and with the right kind of promotion and packaging, we can give bridge players a real fun event."

The time was 1960. The Individual, held in January at the University Club, had drawn 39 tables. Bill sent out promotional pieces all over the eastern half of North America, and he got 280 replies.

A year later 360 players answered Bill's invitation – 90 tables. Jerry Baur, a relatively new player, doubled his masterpoint holding by winning the event that used to be only for the masters. The message was getting out you don't have to be a star to win.

In 1963, players from 16 states and three Canadian provinces pushed the table count over 100 - 105 tables in play. And that's when Maury Braunstein came into the picture.

4, by the deadline, but he called Bill and said "Please!" Bill filled out the table and – you guessed it – Sam was the winner.

The word of Bill's magic had spread across the continent by now, and 144 tables turned out in 1965. It would have been much bigger if it hadn't been for the powerful blizzard that hit Boston.

Another blizzard threatened cancellation in 1966, but determined bridge players are not to be denied. 688 showed up - the all-time record of 172 tables. A lighter snowstorm in 1967 held the crowd to 162 tables. Then in 1968 the worst blizzard yet came along, and the table count fell to "only" 149 tables.

The count was back up to 160 in 1969 no snow, no ice — and the winner was a rookie! Leo Weiner tallied an amazing 78.6% in the first final session to win going away.
