Easy-going Zeke enjoys columnist role

In a long and varied career involving bridge, politics, the stage and even a construction company, Zeke Jabbour is now doing something for the first time – writing under his own name.

The experience – his column, *Winsome and Loath-some*, is now a regular feature in *The Bridge Bulletin* – has been nearly overwhelming.

"The reaction has been unbelievable," says Jabbour, a five-time North American champion, former *Barry Crane Top 500* winner and one of the competitors at the Cincinnati NABC. "People stop me and ask if I'm Jabbour, or they want to know if I'm still lost (a reference to an anecdote in his debut column)."

It's enough to make a calm man nervous – except that the easy-going Boca Raton FL resident is the epitome of composure (as long as you give proper respect to his beloved Michigan Wolverines).

In fact, when Jabbour teaches bridge, relaxation is one of his key messages. He tells students that to be successful, they must study, practice, relax and concen-

Most top seeds advance in Vanderbilt Teams

All but two of the top seeds in the Vanderbilt Knockout Teams survived the first day to play in the round of 64. The highest seed to fall was No. 18, captained by Roger Bates. His squad was knocked off by Michael Kovacich, Patricia Tucker, Kevin Collins, Robert White, Samuel Marks and Dwight Meredith.

In the Spingold Knockout Teams at the Summer NABC in San Antonio last year, Kovacich, Tucker, Collins and White combined with two other players to pull off several upsets before being eliminated in the round of eight.

The other high seed to fall was No. 28 (John Rengstorff). They lost to a four-member team led by Diana Tenery. Her teammates are Andy Stark (New York), Fred Zhang and Qing Yang. They were seeded No. 101.

Lynn's bridge interest still as strong as ever

Being confined to a wheelchair has changed many things in the life of Lynn Deas, but it hasn't reduced her interest in bridge – if anything, it has increased her dedication and enjoyment.

"I still love to play," said Deas, "but I get special enjoyment when one of my pupils makes the grade. I like to work with experienced players and help them rise from the intermediate to the expert range."

She has been doing this more or less on an individual basis, but she is planning to expand her base in two ways. "I want to get on the Internet and form small classes – four to six players – to work with. I believe I can be instrumental in improving their game.

"In addition, I have been making copious notes over the past few years, and I think they might well be the basis for a book that will enable dedicated upper intermediate players to find the necessary strategies to rise into the expert world."

Deas couldn't stress strongly enough how important it is to realize that bridge is a partnership game. "You can't afford misunderstandings. Go over your convention card carefully with your partner and make sure you're both on the same wavelength. For instance, your partner overcalls 1NT after the bidding goes 1 - Pass - 1 - What

Coon and Walsh lead Silver Ribbon Pairs

Charles Coon of Marshfield MA and Rhoda Walsh of Los Angeles had two strong sessions in the Silver Ribbon Pairs qualifying to lead 78 pairs into today's two-session final. They outdistanced the field, finishing approximately three and a third boards ahead of runners-up Glenn Smith of Creve Coeur MO, current ACBL president, and Wayne Hascall of Grandville MI.

Coon, a runner-up in the Bermuda Bowl back in the Sixties, and Walsh, one of America's top woman players for many years, topped their section by a wide margin in both sessions.

Two former presidents of the ACBL – Richard Anderson of Regina SK and Cecil Cook of Long Beach CA – were third, less than one matchpoint behind.

Educational Foundation okays Bridge Camp 2000 grants

Players 16-25 who are ACBL members may attend. The price is \$425 per person.



When North opens 14 in third seat, the auction 1♣ - Double - 1NT leaves South well placed to make at least seven tricks (double dummy he is due 120) but I overcalled 2♠ as West and bought the hand there. The defense led and continued trumps, and I was in dummy to lead a diamond to the queen and king. North neatly led a club to the ace for a third trump lead (if he does not I get to ruff two diamonds in hand to make seven tricks easily). Now to the ending:



The hearts are very likely to be 4-2 since South appears to be 4-4 in the minors and we know he has three spades. Whatever his doubleton (unless it's the 5-4), we have the intrafinesse available to bring in a second heart trick. Lead a low heart to the 8 (covering South's card if necessary). Then duck a heart, unblocking the 8, and finesse to the king-7 to escape for minus 100. The fall of the 10-9 offers a chance, anyway, if you play the suit from the top, but the play indicated is a sure thing if South's doubleton is less significant.

Cindy and Bob Burnstein had two fascinating boards to deal with Saturday in Open Pairs I. On one Cindy had to find a way to make eight tricks playing in her wide-open six-card spade suit opposite a void. On the other, Bob had to find an extra trick in notrump so that he could outscore all the pairs who were playing in the more likely game contract in hearts.

Naturally most pairs played this board in 4♥. Cindy, South, decided her hand was too strong for a heart overcall, so she made a takeout double. She was quite surprised to hear husband Bob bid 1NT. East made a bold bid of 24, and Cindy could have stopped off here to double, but she wasn't sure the defense could collect the necessary 500-point penalty to cover the non-vul game. She decided to go for notrump because Bob had shown some scattered values with his 1NT

On the diamond opening lead, Bob put up the queen to win. He realized he would have to take 11 tricks to get any kind of matchpoint score because the heart bidders were going to take 11 tricks. He also saw that transportation was going to be a major problem. After a little thought, he cashed the ♥A, then led a heart and finessed the 10! When this worked he was in good shape.

He led a club to his king, winning as expected – East couldn't afford to rise with the ace. Then he led a diamond to set up a trick in that suit. East won but had no effective return. He tried a spade, but Bob finessed, led a heart to the queen to cash dummy's good diamond, then came back to hand with the A to take the rest of his hearts. That made 11 tricks - six hearts, two spades, a club and two diamonds.

Cindy, West, wasn't at all happy when she saw the spadeless dummy. However, she figured lots of other players would be in the same position, so she went about making the best of a bad situation. North's ♣Q won the first trick, and North switched to the ♦9. Cindy put up the king and was happy to see it hold. She crossed to her singleton ♥A and led another diamond, North rising with the ace. He had no good return, but he tried the VK. Cindy could have ruffed this, but she discarded a club. Next North tried the \$\Delta J\$, but Cindy let this hold the trick.

Now North was in trouble. He decided to lead another trump to partner's king and Cindy's ace. She cashed the trump queen and got out of her hand with a trump to North's 10. But North was now down to all red cards and had to put her in dummy. She was able to get rid of her last two clubs on the good cards to score up eight tricks for a fine score. She lost only two trumps, a heart, a diamond and a club.

Roy Green is enjoying working for OKbridge

Roy Green, former CEO of the ACBL, now lives in Carlisle, Massachusetts, but he spends 10 days every month in San Diego. He has embarked on a new career – he is executive vice president of OKbridge.

"I miss the ACBL," said Roy. "I miss all the great people that I worked with in Memphis, and I miss all the contact I had with the players. I still go to most of the NABCs, so I still have some contact with the players. But I don't miss the stress. There is far less stress in my new job.'

Green's major OKbridge duties are to supervise the Internet World Bridge Championship, to work up a pilot program to provide field representatives in major metropolitan areas, and to take care of other tournament affairs.

Green feels that OKbridge is bringing in people of a demographic age group that is needed in the bridge world. "And do you know what's going to happen with these young people whom we're introducing to the game? I believe a good many of them will branch out and be playing tournament bridge soon "

Green likes his work with OKbridge, but the days he really enjoys are those when he walks three quarters of a mile down the road to play with his three-and-a-half year old grandson Parker Zimmerman. "Those are the golden hours. And my wife Mary is thoroughly enjoying grandmothering. We play some bridge at the local clubs, too, but not as much as Mary would like."

Passing a conventional bid sometimes works

It isn't recommended that you pass when partner makes a conventional bid, but on rare occasions it turns out right. Look what happened on this deal from the first final session of Open Pairs I. Lenny Ernst, South, a retired bridge writer for one of the Chicago newspapers, made the conventional bid; his partner, Ken Gee, passed, and opponents Larry Cohen and David Berkowitz were the victims.

Gee felt quite sure he knew what his partner's suit was going to be, so he decided to take his chances and pass. Ernst got a heart opening lead to the ace, and he immediately went after diamonds - king, ace, ruff setting up the suit in dummy. Then he led to the ♥K and ruffed dummy's last heart. He cashed the ♣A and got back to dummy by ruffing a spade. When he then called for a club. Cohen perforce won with the king. Ernst ruffed the return, drew the last trump with the queen and claimed - FOR TWELVE TRICKS!!!

New Life Master

DAEDRIE KLEPPE of Milwaukee became a Life Master playing in the 299er Pairs. Her partner was Carol Rushman Meili, also of Milwaukee.

Well, it's easy. All you need is the Rueful Rabbit sitting South, and you are in trouble.

Yes, South did bid 1NT. No, he did not see my 1♠ bid.

As you can imagine, that really fixed me in the play. I won the opening heart lead with dummy's ace and knew it was right to develop the diamond suit. I led a low diamond toward my hand, and North put up the ♦K. Now I led a low spade up to the 10 with confidence. South had to have the king for his 1NT bid.

Horrors! North won the ♠K, played a diamond to partner's queen, got a diamond ruff and exited with a club. Another trump back left me with seven tricks and an overwhelming urge to hide under the table.

On the very next deal, I was again the sacrificial victim.

Looking at all the cards, you would expect to win the opening spade lead in hand and develop the clubs for at least seven tricks. No way. Not with Martin Sklar on lead. He started with a heart, and Mitch Dunitz won the ♥K to lead a low heart. When my ♥Q held I really thought I'd been given a gift, which showed how little I knew Sklar took the \clubsuit K, played a heart to North, who cashed out the suit and exited with a diamond to set me a trick. Result: miserv.

Active Ethics

Our opponents were in 44 doubled as a sacrifice against our vulnerable 4♥. I scored it as down three - minus 500. But Bob Gookin, the declarer, said he went down four for minus 800, converting a poor score for us into a clear top. When we questioned him about what tricks he lost, he proved that he went down four. We were gratified to see the practice of such Active Ethics.


TOURNAMENT APPEALS

In order to keep the bridge public informed of appeals results in a timely fashion the NABC Daily Bulletin staff publishes write-ups. Every effort is made to ensure that these reports are accurate and complete. However, before they are published in the NABC Appeals Casebook revisions may be made.

Appeals Case 1

Subject (Tempo):

Event: NAOP Flight A, March 8, First Qualify-



- (1) Alerted; 4th Suit Forcing
- (2) Disputed break in tempo

The Facts: 3NT made five, plus 460 for E/W. N/S called the Director at the conclusion of play and was told that East had broken tempo before the 2♥ bid, E/W denied any break in tempo. The Director ruled that there had been a break in tempo which had made 3NT more attractive than 4♥ and that 4♥ was a logical alternative. The Director changed the contract to 4♥ made five, plus 450 for E/W.

The Appeal: E/W appealed the Director's ruling. E/W played a weak notrump (12-14) and fourcard majors. The opening 1♦ bid promised at least a four-card suit. 2♥ was artificial (4th Suit Forcing) and forcing for one round. East's 1♠ rebid promised either (1) a five-card diamond suit, (2) a threesuited hand, or (3) a balanced or semi-balanced hand too strong to open 1NT. E/W believed that 3NT was clear because if East held three hearts and one club he would convert 3NT to 4♥.

Regarding the alleged break in tempo, East said he put the Alert card on the table, looked at his cards for about a second and then bid 2♥. The Committee questioned E/W about their system. West said the 1♠ rebid promised a five-card diamond suit by inference because East did not open or rebid 1NT. E/W had their convention card available at the hearing, and the Committee accepted as true their statement that East had to hold at least five diamonds to bid 1♠ over West's 1♥ response.

Upon further questioning West admitted it was possible, if unlikely, for him to hold only a fourcard heart suit with five clubs. N/S said that East had clearly broken tempo. They suggested that without a break in tempo it would not be clear whether West should bid 3NT or 4♥. The break made 3NT a more attractive alternative.

The Committee Decision: The Committee considered the testimony and determined that it was more likely than not that there had been a break in tempo before East bid 2♥. The Committee then considered Law 16A. They believed that the break in tempo made it more likely that East held a doubleton heart and that 4♥ would be a more attractive contract if East held three-card support.

Also, since it was possible for West to hold only four hearts, it was unclear that East would convert 3NT to 4♥ even if he held three hearts and a singleton club. Therefore, it was not clear that West would always bid 3NT in the absence of the extraneous information from the break in tempo. Since that extraneous information also made 3NT more attractive than 4♥, the Committee changed the contract to 4♥ made five, plus 450 for E/W.



Appeals Case 2

Subject (Tempo):

Event: NAOP Flight A, March 9, First Final



(2) Break in tempo

The Facts: 3♦ went down one, plus 50 for E/W. The opening lead was the \$2. The Director was called when 34 was bid. After asking the meaning of the 2♦ bid, West hesitated before passing. East suggested the hesitation was one minute. The Director ruled that pass was a logical alternative for East and changed the contract to 2♦ made two, plus 90 for N/S.

The Appeal: E/W appealed the Director's ruling. East said he had a maximum hand with a fivecard suit. He needed West to have the ♣Q to justify his re-opening bid. N/S said that the 3♣ balancing bid is dangerous because it is likely that North does not hold any length in the major suits. He would have tried for a major suit fit.

Against 3♣ the opening lead was a low club, won by the ace in dummy. Declarer led the ◆10 at trick two, which won. A second diamond went to East's ace, who then played king and another club. South ruffed and led the \$K, which won. A second spade went to East's ace, who played a third spade which West ruffed. East's VA took the fifth trick for the defense.

South correctly pointed out that he could not draw trump after ruffing the third round of clubs, but he missed the best continuation. South should have led the ♥K at that point. Whether East wins or ducks, South can avoid the spade ruff.

The Committee Decision: The Committee determined that there had been a break in tempo, and examined East's logical alternatives. The Committee determined that pass was not a logical alternative. East held maximum values, a five-card club suit, shortness in diamonds and his side was not vulnerable. East's logical alternatives were double and 3♣ and the break in tempo did not suggest that 3♣ would be more successful than double. Therefore. East was free to choose either bid. The table result was allowed to stand.



Appeals Case 3

Subject (Tempo):

Event: NAOP Open Pairs I, March 10, Second



- (1) Alerted; 11-14 at least one singleton
- (2) Alerted; penalty
- (3) Break in tempo

The Facts: 3NT made four, plus 430 for N/S. The opening lead was the ♣9. The Director was called after the 3NT bid and was told that there had been a long pause before the 3♦ bid. The Director ruled that the 3NT bid had not been demonstrably suggested by the break in tempo and allowed the table result to stand (Law 16).

The Appeal: E/W appealed the Director's ruling. South did not attend the hearing. E/W stated that South had bid 3♦ slowly. Their understanding was that North could not act on any information gained from the tempo and they believed that North had done so. North stated that South's bid was slow but it was forcing and he believed that 3NT was an automatic bid. It was discovered that 3NT made four because West won the ♣A at trick one and played another club.

The Committee Decision: The Committee believed that North's 3NT bid was not particularly suggested by a forcing 3♦ raise. Therefore, there was no violation of law. The table result was allowed to stand. The Committee considered whether to award an Appeal Without Merit Penalty Point but decided that E/W should be educated about their responsibility to further consider an opponent's action before proceeding with an appeal, (Both East and West, had approximately 350 masterpoints.)

At one point Beth was on her way to get a medical degree, but she left medical school to take up bridge. "I loved bridge so much more than medicine that there was no choice as far as I was concerned," she said. "When you are in medical school, you come across a lot of really intelligent people. My experience in bridge tells me bridge players also are highly intelligent. The big difference is that bridge players are interesting."

Deas' team for the Women's Swiss is a strong one - Beth Palmer, Connie Goldberg and Rozanne Pollack. Her Women's Trials squad also will be powerful - Palmer, Carol Sanders and Hjordis Eythorsdottir.

trate.

With more than 500 regional championships and more than 24,000 masterpoints to his credit, Jabbour seems to have the formula down pat, especially the part about taking it easy.

"I've always been pretty relaxed," he says.

That's hard to imagine if you consider what life was like for Jabbour before his return to bridge in the late Seventies after a hiatus of more than 15 years.

Jabbour was born in Youngstown OH, the fourth child of Lebanese immigrant parents. His three siblings were girls, all considerably older than he. "I had four mothers," Jabbour says.

Jabbour learned bridge as a junior at Youngstown State University, where he was studying macro economics and English. Jabbour's best friend's brother had played a lot of bridge in the Army, so one day Jabbour was recruited for a game. In no time, he was smitten. "Bridge nearly ruined my academic career," he says.

He did graduate, however, and went on to the University of Michigan to study for a doctorate in macro economics. He had planned a career in government or academics. Little did he know how far away from that field he would end up.

Jabbour never earned the Ph.D. Family problems arose, and he had to make a living. He did that by starting the Jabbour Building Co., a design and construction business in Ann Arbor, where "Go, Blue!" is the clarion call.

Asked what his role in the company was, Jabbour jokes, "I didn't do anything. I was the president."

One of Jabbour's employees, a salesman named Fred Ouellett, is responsible for Jabbour's stage career

The local theater was putting on *The Diary of Anne Frank* and the director was looking for someone to play the lead role – Anne Frank's father. Ouellett thought Jabbour was a natural for the part.

Jabbour, with no experience as an actor, couldn't imagine doing such a thing, but the director, Jerry Sandler, talked Jabbour into having coffee at his home, where more arm twisting ensued. Sander talked Jabbour into reading some of the script, and the director was sold. It took a little more persuasion, but finally Jabbour signed on, and the rest is history.

Before long, Jabbour was acting, producing and directing. At one point, he was involved in nine different theater companies in North America.

"I was involved with the best repertory company in the history of America," Jabbour says, referring to the Association of Producing Artists. Some of the luminaries he worked with were Rosemary Harris, described by Laurence Olivier as "the greatest actress on the English-speaking stage," Helen Hayes, James Stewart and Will Geer.

Jabbour was thrilled to see Harris in Waiting in the Wings in Boston during the 1999 Fall NABC. "It was a great day," Jabbour says, noting that he also celebrated winning the North American Swiss Teams that day.

Jabbour's activities were not limited to the theater and business. He was also up to his ears in politics, usually behind the scenes running campaigns. "For 10 years," Jabbour says, "I didn't lose an election."

For a brief time in Ann Arbor, he was host of a political talk show and once wrote a political column under the pseudonym of Robespierre, partly because he favored the Democrats but did business with a lot of Republicans.

Jabbour recalls his days in the political world with fondness. "I stood six feet from John Kennedy when he launched the Peace Corps," Jabbour says. "We had such idealism. We were going to change the world."

Jabbour had played bridge in college and during two years in the U.S. Army after college, but once the business was started and the theater and politics took over his life, Jabbour had little time for bridge.

He returned to the arena in the late Seventies

after more than 15 years off.

"It was culture shock," he recalls. "I didn't know what a negative double was. Weak twos were my concession to science."

The old aptitude for bridge returned quickly, however, and Jabbour began winning regularly in partnership with Dennis McGarry. They won every event at a regional in Cincinnati, then repeated the feat in Columbus OH not long after that, although Jabbour concedes that the final victory was somewhat tainted. His team was leading in the Swiss, but the event was called after six rounds because of a bomb scare. "No one would believe I didn't make the call," he says.

1979 was a big year for Jabbour – he was second in two major events at the Spring NABC in Norfolk VA – the Life Master Men's Pairs and the Men's Board-a-Match Teams – "and it seemed we were in contention in every big event."

That performance got Jabbour noticed, and he soon turned professional. "People asked me to play and offered me money. I thought, 'That can't be bed."

Jabbour, borrowing a quote from the late statesman Eugene McCarthy, says, "There are two things you need to be successful at bridge. You have to be smart enough to understand it and dumb enough to think it's important."

When he teaches bridge back home in Boca Raton FL, Jabbour is serious about helping students learn to relax when they play.

"Tension," he says, "is the face of the enemy – on stage and at the bridge table. A little anxiety is good because it's a rehearsal for danger. Too much is paralyzing."

In 1989, Jabbour set his sights on the holy grail of masterpoint seekers – the *Barry Crane Top 500* title. Although he played in only 29 regionals and three NABCs, Jabbour won 71 regional championships on his way to 2468 masterpoints.

Although still very fond of Ann Arbor, Jabbour and Sharon, now his wife, moved to Boca Raton in 1990. "We went down there and discovered that when it rained we didn't have to shovel

A pivotal point in his career, and no doubt his relationship with Sharon, occurred at the 1998 Spring NABC in Buffalo. The two were leading in the national Mixed Pairs when, late in the event, Sharon was declarer in a 4♠ contract. The contract was cold but Sharon went down when she became distracted and underruffed at a key point.

The mistake cost them the championship. Naturally, Sharon felt terrible. Zeke did, too, but he felt worse for his partner than for the loss of their first national title. "I didn't feel as bad as I should have, I guess," he says. "Helen Hayes used to say that everything is important to somebody. The win was important, but not as important as Sharon's feelings. Nothing is as important as her feelings."

Bridge is great game, Jabbour knows, but it is, after all, just a game. "It is not," he says, "particularly relevant in the cosmic drama."

Skip bid, sort of

When the director was called to the table, there had been three passes and the fourth player had pulled the STOP card from her bidding box. However, she didn't want to make a skip bid. The director explained that there could be a case of unauthorized information and then allowed the player to make the bid she wanted to make. She opened with 1NT.

Partner bid 2♣ Stayman, but the opening bidder didn't reply to Stayman – she leaped to 5♣!

What was going on? Well, first of all this was in the Intermediate/Newcomer games, and the bidder was a newcomer. She had been taught to open 1NT with 15-17 points, so she felt she had to open 1NT because she had 16 points. This was her hand:

Good card reading

Steve Sanborn executed a neat variation on this deal from the first qualifying session of Open Pairs I. Board 26 • 9 5 4 3

You reach a heart contract as East (actually it does not matter whether it's 4∇ or 6∇). To get a good score on a spade opening lead, your sole problem is to hold your heart losers to one. South had overcalled with Michaels over Sanborn's opening 1∇ bid, and it was clear that South had spades and a minor, so chances were good that the hearts were 3-1.

If you lead a low heart from dummy and North follows low, it seems good percentage to play South for the king or the queen, not the 10 − it's a 2-1 shot. Well, Sanborn improved his odds by leading the NINE from dummy. When North followed smoothly with the 8, unperburbably, Sanborn decided North did NOT have the 10 − he would have covered. So if North had three hearts, as expected, they had to be the king-queen-8. So Sanborn put in the ♥J to make 12 tricks for a very fine score.

Non-playing captains for the Junior teams

ACBL is currently accepting applications for non-playing captains for the two Junior teams who will represent the United States in the 2001 World Junior Teams Championship.

Resumes should be sent before July 1 to Charlotte Blaiss at ACBL Headquarters. "We're looking for a good bridge player who can share his knowledge," said Blaiss. "We need a combination bridge champion, psychoilogist, coach, diplomat and leader."

Non-playing captain is a volunteer (non-paying) position. Volunteers must be willing to commit to a year-long training program for the team and agree to attend the 2001 World Junior Team Chambianship

Names of those who volunteer will be submitted to the ACBL Board of Directors for approval.

Immediately after the Junior Team Trials in August, the two qualifying teams will be presented a list of names approved by the Board, and they will make their selection from that list.

Will 2000 be a Nickell year?

With their overpowering victory in the Bermuda Bowl, observers are wondering if this may be the year the Nick Nickell team finally wins the Vanderbilt Knockout Teams.

It's the only event the team (Nickell-Richard Freeman, Bob Hamman-Paul Soloway and Jeff Meckstroth-Eric Rodwell) hasn't won. This was the team of the Nineties, winning six of the last seven Spingolds. three consective Reisinger Board-a-Match Teams, three International Team Trials and the 1995 Bermuda Bowl. They were second in the 1997 Bermuda Bowl and recaptured the world championship in January.

The Vanderbilt Trophy

The Vanderbilt Trophy for the Vanderbilt Knockout Teams was donated in 1928 by Harold S. Vanderbilt, who won the event in 1932 and 1940.

The Vanderbilt was contested annually in New York -- as a separate championship -- until 1958 when it became part of the Spring North American Championships.

Vanderbilt winners receive replicas of the trophy -- a practice initiated by Vanderbilt from the first running of the event and perpetuated by a \$100,000 trust fund administered by ACBL under the terms of Vanderbilt's will.

On display at ACBL Headquarters in Memphis are replicas donated by the families of Caroline Taylor, who won the Vanderbilt in 1928, and Helen Sobel Smith, a Vanderbilt winner in 1944 and 1945.
