Junior Day

Today is Junior Day. It will be highlighted by the Junior reception, which will take place at 5 p.m. in the Veranda Room at the Marriott. All players who are not yet 25 are invited to attend the buffet dinner meeting.

New members will be inducted into the Junior Corps. Slated to be inducted are Sue Harbour, West Hill ON; Scott Merritt, Champagne IL, and Michael Kitces, Great Falls VA. The Homer Swoop Pre-Teen Scholarship award also will be presented.

Aileen Osofsky, chairman of the Goodwill Committee, once again will be the master of ceremonies. Nadine Wood, chairman of the Youth Undercut Committee, and David Silber, ACBL CEO, will be among the speakers. Many members of the ACBL Board of Directors are expected to attend.

It's also time for Juniors to get their teams together for the 2001 Junior Team Trials next weekend. The round-robin part of the trials will take place next Saturday and Sunday. The top four qualifiers then will play the semifinals and final on Monday. The victors will represent the United States in the Junior World Championships, scheduled for a resort area about 30 miles from Rio de Janeiro, Brazil, in August next year following the Toronto NABC.

Zero Tolerance makes a difference

The Zero Tolerance program, started in Ontario clubs more than four years ago, is going strong.

Barbara Seagram, owner/manager of Kate Buckman's Bridge Studio in Toronto, says ZT "has made a huge difference. We have always provided our less-experienced players with a separate room in which to play, along with their own director.

"This has made for an expensive but flourishing newcomer/intermediate program. The downside was that the players got so comfortable there that they were petrified of moving into the open game in the big room."

ZT has changed that, according to Seagram. "Over the past two years, the atmosphere has improved so dramatically among the open players that there has been a huge exodus from the intermediate games into the open games. We have had to hand out very few scoring penalties for Zero Tolerance, but the fact that the policy is in place seems to keep the players in line and the perception that we are monitoring behavior at all times makes everyone happier.

"The players now never hesitate to report unpleasantness whereas before they considered it part of the game that they had to tolerate."

Seagram added, "We have had to ask several players to take a vacation from our club. They must be subjected to an interview with us before they are permitted to return. The bad ones don't."

Attendance at 1826

Total attendance to date for Anaheim 2000 is 1826 tables. The turnout yesterday was 1304 tables. The remaining tables are the result of play in the Grand National Teams and the Charity events.

ACBL Patron Member Jacqueline DeRouin is accustomed to being around high-level bridge players. Her husband, Allan Falk, has won multiple North American championships. Yet DeRouin, who won the Patron Member drawing to play with expert player and author Larry Cohen during the Charity Pairs Thursday evening, was delighted with the experience.

"Larry was such a wonderful partner," said DeRouin, a Silver Life Master from Okemos MI. "He's so pleasant and supportive. We had a great time."

Cohen has won more than a dozen NABC events, and is the well-known architect of the popular Law of Total Tricks theory.

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Coast-to-Coast final in GNT-A

Two powerful teams representing Districts 9 (Florida) and District 21 (central and northern California) will battle in a 64-board match today, and the winner will reign as the Grand National Teams Flight A champion.

Florida is attempting to defend the championship it won a year ago, and it has the horses to do so. Joseph Shay is the captain, and he is backed by four outstanding stars – Eric Rodwell, Jeff Meckstroth, Michael Seamon and Robert Levin.

But California also has its share of stars. Rose Johnson-Meltzer, the captain, will play with Peter Weichsel, Kyle Larsen, Chip Martel and Lew Stansby.

California had to stage a terrific comeback in the final quarter to advance. District 4 (Pennsylvania) led by 41 IMPs with only 16 boards to go. But California poured it on, scoring 65 IMPs in the final quarter – as much as they had picked up in the first three quarters. They held their foes to just 11 IMPs to win, 130-117.

Florida had an easier time with District 13 (Illinois). They led from start to finish, winning 158-95.

In Flight B, District 19 (the Northwest) and District 15 (Kansas-Missouri) survived two matches yesterday to qualify to fight it out in today's 64-board final.

The finalists in Flight C will be District 13 (Illinois) and District 25 (New England).

Becker, Kamil lead LM Pair qualifiers

Michael Becker of Boca Raton FL and Michael Kamil of Holmdel NJ posted a score of 1681.83 matchpoints in yesterday's qualifying sessions of the Life Master Pairs to lead the event going into today's semifinal rounds.

The qualifying round cut the field to 208 pairs. Approximately half of the remaining field will be eliminated in today's play.

In second is the pair of Ruoyu Fan of Richmond VA and Jiang Gu of Edison NJ with a score 1643.99, while Zia Mahmood and Michael Rosenberg, both of New York, are narrowly in third with a score of 1643.68.

Anaheim deals are online

Deals from most of the top-flight events in Anaheim are being made available online by e-bridge, one of the newer players in the online bridge market. The deals will be accessible through the ACBL webpage.

Rich Laufer, director of marketing for e-bridge, said, "By the end of the tournament, we expect to have some 850 - 1000 hands from events such as the Grand National Teams, the Life Master Pairs, the Spingold Knockouts and the Mixed Board-a-Match Teams. Players from around the world will be able to play these deals at home shortly after the conclusion of these respective events, and can they compare their scores to those actually achieved here in Anaheim."

Players will also be able to follow how top players handled some of the deals, since bid and play records will be provided. Expert commentary will be given online by Drew Cannell, Rich Colker, Sami Kehela and Billy Eisenberg.

"We've received a great response so far from people who have visited our website," added Laufer.

e-bridge promotional booths are located in both the Marriott, lobby level, and the Hilton, on the second floor.

ACBL and e-bridge have collaborated on the project to ensure that no security risks arise from the deals appearing online.

Last month, ACBL CEO David Silber and e-bridge CEO Pinhas Romik agreed to a joint venture whereby e-bridge would develop an online bridge game for ACBL. The site will bear the ACBL logo and will give players the opportunity to earn masterpoints.

"We intend to have two types of games on the site," said Silber. "There'll be an informal, social game where players can drop in or out freely. We'll also have a more structured game with a set duration."

The ACBL Online bridge game is scheduled to become operational later this year.

She made it easy for her partner

"I was able to make two of my favorite plays on one hand!" That was Laurie Kranyak's exclamation after Thursday evening's Charity Pairs. She and her partner collected 10 of the 11 matchpoints available for their efforts on Board 10.

The auction suggests a heart lead, but North avoided that and led a club instead. Declarer won the ace and cashed the trump ace. Kranyak followed with the queen! When she followed with the 3 on the next trick — a trump lead to the king — she certainly had gained her partner's attention. Declarer then cleared trumps, putting North on lead. On the third trump Kranyak played a discouraging heart. She knew the heart switch was imminent, but she realized that this might cost a trick.

Partner got the message and led a diamond instead. Declarer won in dummy and ruffed a club to get to his hand. He too had seen Kranyak's series of plays, but he really was left little choice but to hope for a favorable heart position. He led a heart to the king, but Kranyak won the ace and returned a heart to partner's queen-10 to defeat the contract with three hearts and a trump.

It was an excellent example of partnership cooperation. Kranyak had information her partner needed and was able to convey it with a combination of plays. She knew the clubs and diamonds wouldn't run, and she had a heart holding that was not conducive to partner's breaking the suit.

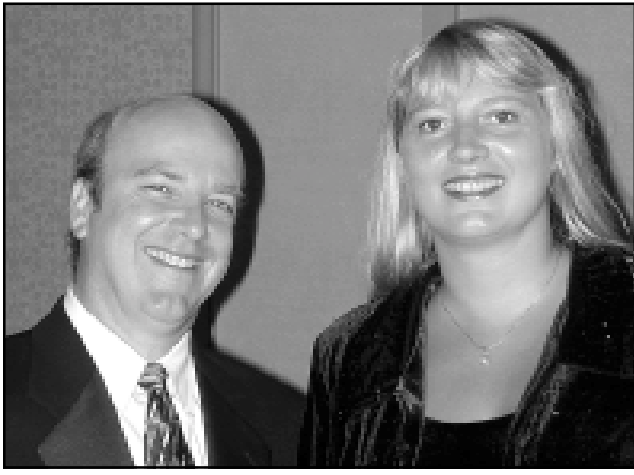

Poignant quotes from Hall of Fame ceremony

Yes sir, Col. Lix: District 20 Director Bob Lix, with wife Sally, attended the dinner smartly attired in his Air Force Officer's mess jacket. Lix retired from service some 25 years ago as a full colonel. "More impressive than the medals is the fact that I can still fit into the jacket after all these years," quipped Lix.

Tom Sanders had to practice his Lou Bluhm speech at home to get used to the emotion he felt as he talked about his dear friend. "After a while I was able to say the words without breaking down," he said. There was an emotional edge to his voice as he spoke Thursday evening, but he did a magnificent job of letting everyone know how he felt about Bluhm.

Some excerpts from Tommy's speech were included in yesterday's Daily Bulletin. Here are additional Sanders comments:

"Lou was always known for his high standard of deportment and ethics. These outstanding characteristics are the essence of class and the epitome of the consummate expert."

"He faced the awful dilemma (inoperable cancer) that fate dealt him in the summer of 1989 as if it was a tough bridge match. He moved to Tennessee and started a series of experimental protocols designed to improve his chances. All told, he was in the hospital seven times.

"Lou didn't have medical insurance. Because of a broad spectrum of bridge friends who contributed significant amounts of money to a special fund, he was able to afford these treatments. Many of these friends are here tonight. Once again I want you to know Lou knew of your participation and was overwhelmed by your generosity.

"Lou would have wanted me to acknowledge some others who were important to him during his ordeal: Peter Weichsel and Alan Cokin for organizing the fund; Bart Bramley, his then regular partner, for his vigilance in keeping in touch almost daily; and of course my wife Carol for the meals she cooked and all she did to make Lou more comfortable."

Near the end, Tommy realized that Lou's short-term goal was to play in the Vanderbilt to help his team defend. "Amazingly, considering how bad he felt some days, he not only made it to Fort Worth, but, according to his teammates, he played as magnificently as ever."

When Lou was near the end, Tom dropped by to see him. He told Lou he had a hand for him to bid. After a long time Lou said OK. "I gave him the hand. After an even longer pause, he finally made a bid – and then he closed his eyes and went back to sleep. I don't remember the hand or the answer, but what I will always remember is – he got it right! Isn't that something? Probably the last words he uttered were a bridge bid, and true to his genius, it was the right bid."

It was a very emotional evening for George Rosenkranz as well. "Edith is my beloved wife and bridge partner. Without her I wouldn't be standing here tonight. I also owe much to people like Eddie Wold, Miguel Reygadas, Roger Bates, Mike Passell, Bobby Wolff, Dan Morse and of course Kerry Sanborn. I also received much encouragement and many suggestions from Alan Truscott.

"And of course there was my wonderful mentor, John Gerber. He was a tough taskmaster, but he taught me elegance and humility."

George told an interesting anecdote about the time he played in both the Men's Pairs and the Women's Pairs in the same session. "There was a call for a doctor in the women's event, and a doctor in the men's event got up to take care of the woman. The director asked me to fill in for the doctor, so I did. The woman was in bad condition and had to be taken from the playing area. After this was taken care of, the doctor came back and took his place. But now they needed someone to fill in for the woman, and once again they asked me."

George recalled the articles he wrote about coping with old age at the bridge table. "Really, what you have to do is make bridge pleasurable for everyone. That's the key," he said.

This was Sidney Lazard talking: "My only regret is that I didn't play a helluva lot more bridge." Like Rosenkranz, he credits Gerber with his early progress in the game. "John took me under his wing when I was 18. He taught me ever so much about defense and tactics." Sidney also credited Freddy Berger for the help he got in learning to bid accurately and Louis Rosen for helping him understand the ethics of the game.

Bart Bramley told of a hand, a slam in diamonds, that Lazard played. "It was the best bidding and best played hand I ever heard of," said Bramley. "I hope the Daily Bulletin will carry the hand one of these days. *Editors's note – It sounds very interesting, Bart. Drop by and we'll be happy to let our readers see such a hand.*

Defenses to 1NT

At this NABC, in General Convention Chart events, the Board of Directors has voted to allow constructive defenses to 1NT openings, even when those defenses do not contain a known suit. In order to help players counter these methods successfully, the tournament is making available copies of an article on the subject, written by Marinesa Letizia, that appeared previously in the ACBL *Bridge Bulletin*. Look for "Counter-Defense to Interference vs. 1NT Opener" in the rooms where General Convention Chart events are played.

Smoking

The state of California strictly enforces its smoking ordinances. Players are reminded to observe rules regarding the restricted smoking areas. ACBL regulations already ban smoking in the playing area as well as in the main entrances and exits to the playing area.

DeRouin was able to show her hand nicely with the second-round double. Cohen was in control after that, competing first to 3♥, and then doubling 3♠ to discourage a further advance from DeRouin. The four-level correction was also doubled by Cohen.

North began by leading the singleton club to South's ace, who returned a low club (suit preference) for Cohen to ruff. He then continued with a heart to the queen and ace, ruffed by declarer.

The ♦A dropped the stiff king, and declarer continued with a low diamond toward dummy. Cohen won the queen and played another heart. The king won as declarer pitched a low spade. The ♦J drew the last trump, and declarer called for the ♠10. DeRouin rose with the ace and played the ♥J, locking declarer in his hand. DeRouin eventually scored the ♠Q to defeat the contract two tricks, plus 300.

Grand National Teams Flight A now a U.S. event

The GNT was originally a North American contest with all 25 ACBL districts participating. With the advent of the Canadian National Team Championships, the Grand Nationals was changed to a U.S.-only event. Only the 23 United States districts compete. In 1985 the event was subdivided into three separate events. The winners have their names engraved on the Morehead Trophy, donated by *The New York Times* in memory of Albert H. Morehead, its longtime bridge editor.

Albert H. Morehead

Ely Culbertson hired Morehead in 1932 because of his outstanding ability as a player and analyst. He proved so valuable that in 1934 he was made general manager of all Culbertson enterprises. He was only 25 when he played on the Culbertson team that defeated the British in the second international match for the Schwab Cup.

Morehead was the first bridge editor of *The New York Times* with a Sunday column from 1935 and a daily column from 1959. He resigned from the *Times* late in 1963 to devote full time to writing, editing and publishing of the dictionaries, encyclopedias and thesauruses that made him one of the foremost American lexicographers.

During those years, Morehead found time for tremendous service to organized bridge. He was an officer of the United States Bridge Association when that organization amalgamated with the American Bridge League in 1937.

He became a governor of the newly formed ACBL and served as president in 1943 and chairman of the board from 1943 to 1945. He was named *ACBL Honorary Member* in 1946.

Morehead was a member of the National Laws Commission and was in charge of production of the International Laws of Contract Bridge. He was also the author of the constitution of the World Bridge Federation -- the first formal definition of the scope, structure, powers and duties of that organization.

Morehead was named to the ACBL Bridge Hall of Fame in 1996.

Some insight into the man behind all this talent can be found in his obituary in the November 1966 issue of the *Bridge Bulletin*. Editor Dick Frey wrote:

"No one ever saw him lose his temper at the bridge table or heard him speak an unkind word to a partner. He smiled often, but the only player he ever laughed at was himself.

"Rarely if ever did he turn down a plea for help. Writing this, I am proud to acknowledge the debt I owe him and to claim that he was my best friend. The secret of his greatness was that there are scores of others who will truly say exactly this of Albert Hodges Morehead."

Sheinwold and Mac Nab honored in GNT events

Qualifications for Flights B and C of the Grand National Pairs were earned in the grassroots event earlier this year. Flight B winners have their names engraved on the Sheinwold Trophy while the names of Flight C winners are engraved on the Mac Nab Trophy.

Alfred Sheinwold

Alfred Sheinwold (1912–1997) was one of the greatest bridge writers in the history of the game. He was inducted into the Bridge Hall of Fame in 1996.

His syndicated bridge column was considered by many to be the best – he had a knack for getting his point across to even the least experienced players. He managed this by making sure that every column had only one main point, making it easier for his readers to focus.

"You could read a Sheinwold column and know in an instant that nobody else could have written it," said Frank Stewart, co-author of the column. "He enlightened and entertained players through seven decades and earned millions of fans."

Sheinwold was an editor of *The Bridge World* from 1934 to 1963 and was editor of *The Bridge Bulletin* from 1953 to 1958. He was also the author of perhaps the most successful bridge book ever written, *5 Weeks to Winning Bridge*, a book that sold in the millions.

Sheinwold served as chairman of the ACBL Laws Commission from 1964 to 1975, as chairman of the appeals committees at NABCs and as chairman of the ACBL Board of Governors from 1970 to 1973. He was named *ACBL Honorary Member of the Year* in 1983.

Robin Mac Nab

Robin Mac Nab (1915–1985) served as a member of the ACBL Board of Directors from 1956 to 1981. He was ACBL president in 1965. He was a past president of the Western Conference, a member of the ACBL Laws Commission and a member of the executive council of the World Bridge Federation.

Mac Nab, a graduate of Cornell University, was a member of the U.S. Olympic track and field squad in 1936.

Cell phones restrictions enacted

The Board passed the following policy, effective immediately: "Except for health-related equipment or by permission of the Director-in-Charge of the tournament or event, cell phones, audible pagers, and similar electronic equipment may not be operated or operable in the playing area during a session of play at NABCs. All other ACBL tournament sponsors are strongly encouraged to adopt this policy."

A painful experience

Failing to qualify in the GNT can be a painful experience, one that you would wish to put out of your mind as quickly as possible — particularly when you miss out by 2VPs on the final board.

However, as it happened, my New York teammates produced a couple of nice plays to keep us in contention, and I missed my chance for a big pickup that would have made our life easy. So in the spirit of contrition, and as a partial apology, here are three relevant deals:

My partner, John Solodar, won the opening lead of the ♦Q with the king, played the ♣Q, crossed to the ♠A and cashed the clubs, hoping that the heart finesse would give him nine tricks. When the finesse failed and a spade came back, John carefully unblocked the ♠7 and won dummy's ♠K. Now he led a third spade from dummy and when East produced the queen, John unblocked the ♠10, letting East cash the ♠6. Then, however, East had to lead a heart and concede two tricks to dummy.

Of course, John could have cashed the ♥A (instead of taking the finesse at trick seven) and then played a spade to set up his ninth trick that way, but this was far more elegant.

In the other room, my teammates did not bid with the East-West cards, and also led the ♦Q against 3NT. Declarer ducked, and Brady Richter continued in tempo with the ♦J. Declarer thought he might need to duck this trick, but was swiftly disabused of the soundness of this idea. 12 IMPs to the good guys.

In our room, we defeated 2NT by North on a heart lead, which went one down after less-than-stellar defense.

Sue Picus was faced with a slightly more challenging task when partner Alex Ornstein found an ebullient approach to the North cards.

The defense found a friendly low club lead to Sue's ♣10. A low spade from hand saw West take the ♠K and shift to the ♦9. Imagine East's dilemma. He chose to duck and now Sue won in hand and cashed all the black-suit winners to reduce to this ending:

Sue cashed the ♥A and exited with a heart to collect plus 630. Had East won the ♦Q (when West switched to the 9), cashed the ♦A and cleared the suit, Sue would have been forced to play West for a singleton heart honor by ducking a heart to the ♥Q. Now, after getting a count on the hand by cashing the black-suit winners, Sue would have a subsequent heart finesse to provide the ninth trick.

After a slightly pushy auction, we reached an excellent 3NT thanks to those convenient club spots.

After a club to the ♣K and a low heart shift to the ♥K (West playing an encouraging 8), I decided to run the ♦10 — maybe not best, but not absurd either. Randy Joyce (West) put up the ♦K. I won in dummy, and cashed the ♠A K to remove some inconvenient exit cards from the defender's hands. Now I played the ♣10 which the defense had to win or else I would have nine easy tricks by clearing the diamond suit. Kay Joyce (East) cashed the ♥A and played another heart to set up the suit. I pitched a spade and a diamond from dummy. This was the ending:

I needed to work out what was going on, so I elected to cash the ♣Q and take the diamond finesse, playing West for an original 4-4-3-2 shape. But in retrospect, East's decision to play the ♥A and another heart should have tipped me off to my opponents' patterns.

The winning line is to cash the ♦Q and the ♠Q and then exit with a diamond to endplay East in clubs.

And note that East could have found the devious shot of underleading her ♥A rather than cashing it! Now I might well have been forgiven for playing East for the 2-4-2-5 shape I actually did anyway!

Glossary of bridge terms

New members of ACBL are often confused by the array of terms they hear: knockout teams, red points, rookie. Here's a list of terms and their meanings:

Knockout Teams: an event in which a team (of four, five or six players -- with four playing at a time) plays another team. The losers are eliminated or "knocked out" while the winners play other winners until only one winning team remains. The length of a KO match may vary from a single session to a full day (the Vanderbilt and Spingold) to a multi-day event (the Bermuda Bowl).

Bracketed Knockout Teams: a KO event in which teams are divided into groups -- usually of 8, 16 or 32 teams -- based on their masterpoint holdings. The top group -- Bracket I -- and all other groups compete in a separate event with their own set of winners.

Compact Knockout Teams: a shorter version of Bracketed KO teams.

Swiss Teams: an event in which a team (of four, five or six players -- with four playing at a time) plays other teams in seven-, eight- or nine-board matches. Team A sits North-South at Table 1 and East-West at Table 2 while Team B sits East-West at Table 1 and North-South at Table 2. The results are compared and scored by International Match Points (IMPs).

Pairings for the first round are random. Pairings for succeeding rounds are determined by a team's win-loss record or Victory Point total.

International Match Points (IMPs): the most common method of scoring Swiss Team matches. If Team A scores plus 620 for bidding and making 4♠ on Board 4 and Team B scores only plus 170 (they didn't bid the game), the difference is 450 -- which converts to 10 IMPs. The IMP chart is shown on the inside of your convention card.

Victory Points (VPs): a method of scoring Swiss Team matches. After the scores are compared and converted to IMPs, the IMP total is converted to Victory Points. A team's VP total may be used to determine its next opponents and its final standing.

Continuous/Side Pairs: single-session pair games that pay red points. The Morning Continuous/Side Pairs, for example, is being played at 9 a.m. the first Friday, Saturday and Sunday of this NABC. Pairs may play in one, two or three sessions. Only pairs who play in at least two sessions are eligible for overall gold points.

Flighted pairs: When flighting is used, the field is divided by expertise or experience or both into several separate games. Flight A -- "unlimited masterpoints" -- is open to all players while the remaining flights are limited. Flight B might be 0-500 MPs or 0-1000 MPs while Flight C might be 0-300 or 0-500. Each flight is scored individually, and masterpoint awards are made for each flight.

The masterpoint holdings of the players determine their flight. If one player is quite expert while his partner is new to the game, the pair must compete in Flight A.

In flighted events, you may play up but not down. That means you may play in Flight A or Flight B even if your masterpoint holding qualifies you for Flight C. Conversely, you may not play in Flight B or Flight C if you are a Flight A player.

Stratified Pairs: The idea is to compete against everyone but to be ranked only with your peers.

Each pair is assigned a stratum or "strat" based on the masterpoint holding of the partner with more masterpoints.

Example: A = 1000+ masterpoints; B = 300-1000 MPs; C = 0-300 MPs.

Thus, the most experienced players are placed in Strat A, intermediate players in Strat B and less expe-

"It's good to show how bridge can bring together people from such different backgrounds," Zia added. "It just shows a special magic about the game of bridge."

The opening heart lead was taken with the king and Deas led a spade to her jack and East's king.

Deas won the ♣Q return with dummy's king and led a diamond to her hand. Now she led a heart and East took her ace.

Look what that did to poor West. When Deas ran her red-suit winners, West could not hold protection in both black suits. Deas wound up with 11 tricks and a good score.

If East had ducked the second heart, the count would not have been right for the squeeze and Deas would have had to settle for 10 tricks.

He gave up another club and was forced to ruff another diamond. So Treadwell decided he would go along with the defense — he would continue the dummy reversal and ruff his last diamond.

He came to his hand with a high heart, learning about the 4-0 break, and ruffed his last diamond. He cashed dummy's top heart, came back to his hand with the ♠K and drew the rest of the trumps. He cashed the ♠A for his tenth trick and a fine score.

The game proceeds normally -- the difference comes when the scores are tabulated and ranked.

In a three-strat game, the scores are ranked three times. The first ranking is done as in a regular open game. These are the Strat A results.

If a B or C pair does well in this ranking, they receive full credit for that performance. It is not all that uncommon for a Strat C pair to place first overall and receive the full masterpoint award for that game. *Note:* A pair is eligible for only one set of masterpoint awards and automatically receives the highest award.

The second ranking compares the scores of only the B and C pairs -- the scores of the Strat A pairs are eliminated. Once again, if a C pair does well, they receive points for their finishing position in the Strat B

results.

The third and final ranking compares the scores of only the C pairs -- all the scores of the Strat A and B pairs are eliminated.

Strati-flighted Pairs: The top group plays in a game of their own -- Flight A. The rest of the field is divided into strats and plays as in a regular stratified pairs.

A recent innovation has been stratification within Flight A. Flight A-1 may be listed as 3000+ MPs while Flight A-2 (or Flight X) may be listed as 0-3000 MPs.
