## Goodwill honors chief directors

The Goodwill Committee honored the directors who run the North American championships at yesterday's Goodwill Day reception.

The first director called forward by Goodwill Chairman Aileen Osofsky was Bobbie Shipley. "I remember the first time I was one of the head directors," said Bobbie. "I was supposed to work with Tom Quinlan back in 1990 – and I had never worked with him before. But it worked out beautifully! We had to put it together in Las Vegas during the biggest bridge tournament ever held – but we clicked -- we worked great as a team."

When Quinlan took the podium, he was quick to point out that it took six directors to replace him and Bobbie. In a way, that's true – there are teams of two who run each of the three NABCs. But after the laughter died down, Quinlan conceded that the move was a change of policy, not a necessary three-way replacement.

Now it was time to introduce the three teams. Spring – Chris Patrias and John Ashton; Summer – Sol Weinstein and Doug Grove Fall — Millard Nachtwey and Betty Bratcher. Each of the teams already has had the experience of running an NABC, and all three teams have done well as the chief directors.

Bobbie had special remarks concerning Patrias and Weinstein. "Chris worked his first tournament for me. At the time, it never occurred to me that either one of us would run a national tournament. And Sol was just a kid when we first worked together – I believe he was only 20 back then."

Quinlan called Ashton a "rustic Oregonian. He was always a fine player and now he's a helluva director."

Osofsky has the highest admiration for Jeff Johnston, NABC operations manager. "He never gets

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## Special game highlights ABA/ACBL Day

Today is a big day for United States bridge – we are building bridges for bridge. For the first time ever, the American Bridge Association and the American Contract Bridge League are co-sponsoring a major event at a North American championship tournament. Today's two-session stratified pairs game is the ABA/ACBL Stratified Open Pairs. That's the highlight of ABA/ACBL Day.

Anyone playing in this game can have any points won credited to either their ABA or their ACBL record. All each player has to do is enter the player number of the organization to which they want their points credited.

But ABA/ACBL Day goes further than that. Any player competing in an event that begins and ends today has the same right of choice as to where his points will go. That's true for the morning games, the side games, the Senior event and all the novice-intermediate events. It does not apply to multi-day events like knockouts and North American championship games.

There will be a special reception for ABA members and their partners immediately after the second session in the Presidential Suite (Room 1917 at the Marriott).

As reported here yesterday, key persons in both organizations have been working closely for many months to make this day a reality. Both organizations have the common goal of becoming part of the United States Bridge Association, which is in the process of being formed. It will be through the USBA that we will make our application to the United States Olympic Committee en route to bridge becoming an Olympic sport. The ACBL cannot make such an application

## Opening day receipts to go to Education

Starting with next year's Spring North American Championships in Kansas City, the proceeds from the opening night games will go to the Educational Foundation instead of the Charity Foundation. The motion passed by the Board of Directors at last week's meeting reads as follows:

"The NABC opening night Charity game shall be renamed shall be renamed the Educational Foundation game with all net proceeds from that game going to the ACBL Education Foundation." The foundation will pay administrative costs of such events. This will amount to approximately \$15,000 per NABC – \$45,000 per year that will go to education rather than charity.

In addition the Charity game held during future NABCs will be renamed the Educational Foundation Pairs, and all proceeds will go to the Educational Foundation. This applies only to the game played at the NABC. Charity games played at clubs on the same day will continue to be charity games, with all proceeds

## Outfoxing partner

The following deal occurred in the evening session of Sunday's Flight A Pairs. My partner was John Fox.

Undaunted by previous poor results caused by my repeated failure to observe one of my partner's rules ("Never play me for anything I haven't bid."), I achieved a one-deal vindication on this board.

Possibly I violated another of "Fox's Rules" by passing the North hand in first seat, but I haven't had time to read all 75 of them. After John opened 3♥ and my right-hand opponent overcalled 5♠, I bid six of my shorter, but more solid, suit. LHO raised spades, hoping to make the slam. I reopened with 7♦ on the premise that partner's hand quite probably contained a singleton club. East doubled, probably to tell his partner not to bid 7♠.

If I didn't get too careless in my excitement, 7♦ was cold: ruff the spade lead, play one high trump, lay down the ♣A, ruff clubs three times in dummy reentering my hand with heart ruffs, draw the last trump and claim the remaining three small clubs.

We scored plus 1630 for a top on this board, but John likely regrets my success in his anticipation of future zeroes when I break more of his rules.

## Pseudo guess

Jim Griffin and Keith Garber produced one of my favorite variations on a pseudo squeeze to give declarer a vicious problem on this deal from the first semifinal session of the Life Master Pairs:

2♣ on a trump lead looks tough, but the defense has only four top tricks so life isn't easy for them either. Declarer captured the ♠Q with the ace, and played a heart to the king and ace. He then ruffed a heart, and led a low diamond. Garber hopped up with the ace (declarer did not unblock the ♦K) to play the ♠K and a diamond to the king. Declarer ducked a heart to West who exited with a trump. Declarer drew trumps to produce this ending:

It looks as if declarer must get two tricks. Indeed, if he had called for a heart from dummy at this point, he would have scored two tricks in the ending. But declarer called for the ♠K, and so fell victim to an odd squeeze.

Griffin carefully ducked, but won the ♣Q on the next round and cashed the ♥J. Declarer was now forced to guess whether to keep the ♠J or the ♦Q for his last card. Playing for clubs to have been 4-3, he kept the diamond. Down one.

## Open Trials in future

All Trials during which United States representation in international events is decided will be run in an open format in the future. This regulation was passed by the Board of Directors last week. Previously teams wishing to compete in a Trials had to go through a review process before they either were accepted or rejected.

## Zero Tolerance in Indiana

Bob Knight will continue to coach Indiana basketball but under a "zero tolerance policy" announced recently by university administrators.

## Elegant defense

Arnie Malasky and Dick Wegman found an elegant defense to convert a small penalty into a very significant one on the following deal from the Life Master Pairs.

Wegman was on lead against 4♦ on a hand where 3♥ his way was touch and go. So plus 100 against 4♦ might not be good enough. He decided to lead clubs. With the ace-king likely to be on his left, he elected to lead a small club, not an honor. Declarer quite reasonably put up dummy's ace and a led a trump to his queen and Wegman's ace. Wegman led a top club for his partner to ruff, and Malasky put his partner in with the ♥A. Now Wegman could cash his ♠J and lead a fourth round of clubs, guaranteeing partner a trick with his ♦J. Down two was an excellent matchpoint result.

## How could it matter?

Jim and Scott Lewis were playing against Fred Gitelman and Brad Moss when Scott was confronted with a play which appeared to be irrelevant. But it turned out to be critical.

A club lead leaves declarer struggling, but quite reasonably Moss suspected that his opponents had a 4-4 spade fit, so he led the ♠A. Of course declarer expected this to be from the ace-king and length, but he sacrificed his ♠J, more for general routine principles than for any devious reasons. But look what happened.

Moss led a spade to partner's king and Gitelman returned a diamond, letting Scott win in hand. Now came the ♣Q to the ace and a club ruff, the ♥K-Q and a spade to the 10 for another club ruff. Scott then cut loose with a third diamond. It did not matter which defender won this - Scott could win the return in dummy, draw the last trump and claim the rest for plus 620.

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because the League is international and the application must be national.

The World Bridge Federation is working with the International Olympic Committee with a goal of having bridge as an exhibition sport at the Winter Olympics in Salt Lake City in 2002 and a full-fledged Olympic sport in 2006.

Today's event could well be the first of many such special days. Already on the schedule is an ACBL/ABA Day at the ABA Nationals in Reno next March.

The two men who did most of the original planning, Ed West of the ABA and Howard Piltch of the ACBL, also took advantage of the opportunity to play as partners in the Open Pairs at the ABA National in New Orleans. This is the hand they most enjoyed:

Piltch didn't really like the idea of overcalling at the two level with a four-card suit, but he didn't want to pass with so much stuff. West's redouble of the negative double encouraged Piltch to name his second suit, and West took it one level higher when West bid 3♠.

West led a spade to dummy's ace, and Piltch led a club to his king and West's ace. West switched to the ♥Q to declarer's ace, and Piltch ruffed a spade. He led a diamond to his king, won by West with the ace, and West continued with another spade, ruffed. Piltch cashed dummy's ♥K, pitching a diamond, and ruffed a heart. After cashing the ♠K, he led another spade, and this put the spotlight squarely on West. If he ruffed in with the jack he would be endplayed. If he discarded a diamond, Piltch would ruff and play on diamonds - the trump jack would be the only remaining trick for the defense. If West sluffed a heart - (best) - Piltch would have to ruff and hope for the best in diamonds.

West found the right discard - a heart - but it did him no good because it was easy to pick up diamonds, what with the jack being doubleton with East. Making 4♣ was worth all 17 matchpoints. Even if 4♣ was beaten a trick, it would have been a good board because most East-Wests were scoring plus 140 in either hearts or spades. Yes, with perfect defense both 3♥ and 3♠ can be beaten. But that seldom actually happened.

## Goodwill Message

We'd like to think that everybody we meet at this NABC will add to our enjoyment. Realistically, of course, we know that won't happen.

The key is our response. Continue to be polite, friendly - whether it's an opponent or your partner. It's calling rubbing out a problem with kindness.

Osofsky also congratulated Charlotte Blaiss for her work in making the ACBL Bridge Camp earlier this month a major success.

## Zero Tolerance: Don't be a victim!

No matter how high a rank a bridge player achieves, there is a point at which none of it means anything, a point at which a high-ranking player feels that players of lower status can be treated as if they were anonymous. In some circles it seems to be acceptable to harass those with less knowledge of the game.

I have tried putting these ideas into perspective, apologizing for the inconsiderate minority of bridge-playing clods. I ask myself, "What happened to Zero Tolerance?"

My answer to each of you is simple. We are the cause of table problems — you and I. We allow ourselves to be treated badly and walk away from the table mumbling under our breath. We share stories with partners, other bridge players and friends. We feel upset and at times think we do not want to return to a game we love. Yet we (you and I) can conquer this and other problems at the bridge table by calling, "Director, please" whenever we are unsure of an improper procedure of any type (ours, our partner's or our opponents') at the table.

Please do not go home upset. Do something about problems when they occur. Don't be afraid to call for the director. That's what they're there for.

Remember that four adults are sitting at a table playing with 52 pieces of paper. Put things in perspective. In the greater scheme of life, how important can this be?

## Cell phones restrictions enacted

At its meetings this week, the ACBL Board of Directors has voted to restrict the use of cell phones and other similar equipment. The Board passed the following policy, effective immediately: "Except for health-related equipment or by permission of the Director-in-Charge of the tournament or event, cell phones, audible pagers, and similar electronic equipment may not be operated or operable in the playing area during a session of play at NABCs. All other ACBL tournament sponsors are strongly encouraged to adopt this policy."

## Educational Foundation

Overall this means that the Charity Foundation will receive approximately \$215,000 a year instead of the present \$275,000. The Educational Foundation will receive approximately \$175,000 instead of present \$115,000.

Dave Treadwell thought he might pick up a few IMPs for making 1♥ doubled — plus 160. As you realize, 160 is a rare score. But it was duplicated at the other table for a push.

## George felt lucky

George Pisk came by to tell about a very unusual Swiss match result — seven straight pushes. "But I was lucky," he said. "If it had been board-a-match we would have lost because we got 100 on one board and our opponents got 110."

# Americans win Venice Cup rematch

Imagine the New York Yankees inviting the Atlanta Braves up for a weekend to replay the World Series. How about the St. Louis Rams asking the Tennessee Titans over for a rematch of the 2000 Super Bowl? Or the Los Angeles Lakers issuing an invitation for "seven more" to the Indiana Pacers?

Never happen, you say? That's right, but the bridge equivalent did take place in July when the Dutch team that defeated the United States in the 2000 Venice Cup in Bermuda invited the American team over for another go.

The informal rematch was the brainchild of Peter Sisselaar, owner of P.J. Sisselaar BV, a Dutch real estate company. Sisselaar "is a much appreciated sponsor, not only in bridge circles but sport in general," explained Hans Metselaar, who owns a bridge club in The Hague and who organized the rematch.

A few weeks after the Dutch returned from Bermuda, said Metselaar, "Peter Sisselaar came up with the idea of the rematch as an additional tribute to our ladies. He told me to get things organized and I have been at it, with great pleasure, ever since."

Metselaar's organizational skills went beyond bridge: he arranged that all the U.S. team members who flew into Amsterdam were met at Schiphol Airport and driven to The Hague; he arranged trips to Zeeland, Vollandam and Amsterdam; he arranged dinners during the rematch and he cheered on both teams.

Jill Meyers, a member of the U.S. team, noted, "This is the first time that a second-place team in a world bridge tournament has been invited to the country of the first-place team for a rematch. It was billed as THE REMATCH and there were posters all over the city, as well as much press and TV coverage. One would have thought it was a rematch between two boxing behemoths."

The 108-board match was played July 7-9 in The Hague.

The U.S. claimed victory when they posted a whopping 85-8 win in the sixth session and took the lead for the first time. After their big sixth session, the U.S. team held on for three more sessions to post a 424-405 win.

The Dutch team received an appearance fee of 25,000 Dutch guilders (about \$18,500 in U.S. funds) from Sisselaar and Arboned. In addition, the winning team received \$12,000 (U.S.) while the runners-up got \$8,000 (U.S.).

The U.S. players were Jill Meyers, Santa Monica CA; Randi Montin, Napa CA; Janice Seamon-Molson, Miami; Tobi Sokolow, Austin TX; Renee Mancuso, Los Angeles, and Pam Wittes, Venice CA. Jo Morse, Palm Beach Gardens FL, was their non-playing captain. (Shawn Quinn, a member of the Venice Cup squad, was unable to attend the rematch and was replaced by Wittes.)

The Dutch team was Bep Vriend, Marijke van der Pas, Jet Pasman, Anneke Simons, Martine Verbeek and Wietske Van Zwol. Ed Franken was their npc and Chris Niemeijer was the coach.

The rematch used a format new to most ACBL players: unlike the usual table-to-table comparison, three tables were in play. One table was designated the anchor table -- if the U.S. sat North-South at the anchor table, their other two pairs sat East-West at the other tables. Results at the anchor table were compared with each of the other tables. That provided the potential for huge swings.

The Dutch won the first 12-board set 39-18 and 29-15 to lead 68-33.

The U.S. won the second set 31-22 (20-6 and 2-25), thanks in part to this deal:

If Wittes had four key cards, Mancuso could count

13 tricks — and she bid the grand. "I was pretty sure she had four instead of one," Mancuso said later, "but I was going to find out pretty quick if I was wrong."

She won the opening ♥K lead, played one round of clubs and claimed plus 1520. Since this was now the anchor table, the plus 1520 would be compared at each of the other tables.

Simons won the ♦J lead and claimed plus 940 but that was an 11-IMP gain (13 total) for the U.S.

The third session went to the Dutch, 61-35. They defeated a pushy slam bid at the anchor table by Seamon-Molson and Sokolow while their East-West pairs settled in game. That added up to a 22-IMP gain for the Dutch.

The fourth and fifth sessions were quiet. The U.S. won session four, 56-53, and lost session five, 46-44. At this point, the Dutch led, 250-199.

Session six was wild. The U.S. posted double-digit gains on five of the 12 boards. This was the first, and it further illustrated the value of a good result at the anchor table:

Both Simons and Van Zwol led a low diamond, won by their partners with the king. Both shifted to a low spade. Montin and Wittes played along similar lines: winning a spade honor, ruffing a diamond, winning the other spade honor and ruffing their last diamond. Next they led dummy's ♥J.

Simons won her ♥A and returned a low club to the queen and king. Montin led another heart and Pasman won her king and returned a club to dummy's ace. Montin cashed the ♠A, pitching her last club, ruffed a club, drew trumps and claimed plus 420.

At the other table, Van Zwol won her ♥A and returned a diamond, ruffed by Wittes. She drove out East's ♥K, won the club return with her ♣K, drew the last trump and claimed plus 420.

That was good for a 7-IMP gain at each table, giving the U.S. their first lead at 269-256.

The U.S. won the 12-board set 42-5 and 43-3 (total: 85-8) to go ahead, 284-258. It was a lead they would not relinquish.

The next three sets were dull, compared to session six. The Dutch won the seventh session, 60-50, reducing the U.S. lead to 334-318. The U.S. bounced back, taking the eighth session, 40-29.

Going into the final 12 boards, the U.S. led, 374-347.

The Dutch won the final set, 58-50, but the U.S. won the rematch, 424-405.

Jon Wittes and Ross Grabel produced this amusing deal from the first semifinal session of the Life Master Pairs. Playing A-J opposite 9-5-2 for three tricks is quite a feat — but it's easy when you know how.

West led the ♦7. East overtook with the ♦9, cashed the ♦A and played another diamond. (Yes, a heart is better, but a third round of diamonds is completely understandable.)

Grabel ruffed high, cashed two top trumps, crossed to the ♣K and ruffed another diamond. He then crossed to the ♠K to reach this position:

West has been forced to pitch three hearts already. When the last trump persuaded East to part with his treasure, the ♥4, Grabel discarded the ♥J catching West in a vicious crisscross squeeze. West actually chose to pitch a club, so declarer unblocked the ♣A and claimed. If West had instead pitched a heart, Ross could have come to the ♥A, gone back to the ♣A and cashed the ♥9-5.

Making five was a near top, but East could have saved the overtrick by discarding a club in the diagramed position.

South won the ♦K and played a second round of trumps: 9, jack, king, and Rosenberg unblocked the 8 from dummy. North played the ♠4, Rosenberg winning in hand with the 5 as South pitched a low diamond. Declarer ruffed a diamond in dummy and cashed the ♣A to reach this position:

Rosenberg claimed the last two tricks when South was forced to lead into the ♥A J in dummy. Making three, for plus 140.
