Welland squad stuns Nickell

For the second time in 52 matches, the all-star team captained by Nick Nickell finished a loser. The Roy Welland squad (Brad Moss, Marc Jacobus, Fred Gitelman, Magnus Lindqvist, Peter Fredin) overcame a 26-point halftime deficit to win, 172-143. Playing with Nickell were Richard Freeman, Bob Hamman, Paul Soloway, Eric Rodwell and Jeff Meckstroth.

The most exciting match of the day saw the teams captained by Steve Robinson and Howard Weinstein finish in a dead tie at the end of regulation. This forced an eight-board playoff, won by Robinson, 146-134. Robinson held Weinstein to just 6 IMPs in the overtime which finished at 2:45 a.m. Playing with Robinson are Peter Boyd, Kit Woolsey and Fred Stewart.

One of today's matches may be unique – the opponents are both captained by women. Rita Shugart and company will oppose Rose Meltzer's squad.

The other pairings for today's quarterfinals: Welland vs. Schwartz, Cayne vs. Robinson, Baze vs. Jacobs.

Flader, Kinningham are PTDA award recipients

Tournament directors Mike Flader, of Minneapolis, and Alice Kinningham, of Denver, were named as recipients of a pair of awards given annually by the Professional Tournament Directors Association.

Flader received the Tom Weeks Memorial Award, given to the director who shows the most improvement in a variety of aspects. Players from the Midwest, especially Minnesotans, are most familiar with Flader. He began directing in 1989 and became a full-time director in 1992. Previously, Flader managed the bridge center in the Minneapolis area.

More recently, Flader has become better known on the national level when he took over the late Brian Moran's column, Ruling the Game, in *The Bridge Bulletin*.

"The process of answering questions for the magazine column has strengthened my knowledge of the Laws, and in turn, people seem to be giving my opinion more weight," said Flader. "I feel more confident, especially when I'm called on to make rulings involving strong, experienced players. That situation can be intimidating even to veteran directors."

Kinningham was named as the recipient of the Fred Friendly Award, given to the director who most embodies the qualities of courtesy and friendliness shown by the late TD Paul Stehly who was nicknamed Fred Friendly.

Kinningham began directing in 1982 and became full-time 1992. She frequently directs tournaments in District 17 (Colorado, Rocky Mountain area).

"I was thrilled to win the award. I didn't expect it," said Kinningham. "The thing I love best in life, next to my family, is bridge. I love what I do. It's nice when my peers recognize my zeal for what I do. It's also nice to be recognized for a task that I like to do anyway."

Shaffer, Hayden top IMP Pair qualifiers

Barry Shaffer of Frisco TX and Garey Hayden of Tucson AZ are atop the NABC IMP Pair qualifying list. Their score of plus 105 puts them in first. Two other pairs have scores in three digits: Stephen Landen of Rochester Hills MI and Pratap Rajadhyaksha of Powell OH with plus 101; Kevin Collins and Patricia Tucker of Atlanta GA who scored plus 100.

In today's two-session final, 156 pairs will compete.

Blustein, Bruno lead Fast Pairs

Maurice Blustein of Bellevue WA and Steve Bruno of Peoria AZ topped the field of 152 pairs in the first day of play of the inaugural NABC Fast Open Pairs. Blustein and Bruno scored 1973.25 matchpoints to finish slightly ahead of Jiang Gu of Edison NJ and Ruoyu Fan of Richmond VA who posted a 1947.00.

Sixty-four pairs survived yesterday's cut. Today is a two-session final.

Wei-Sender battles Hamman in Wagar final

Maybe Bob Hamman didn't make it in the Spingold, but his wife Petra has reached the final in the Wagar Women's Knockout Teams. Hamman, Joan Jackson, Peggy Sutherlin, Robin Klar, Mildred Breed and Shawn Quinn led from start to finish yesterday against the team captained by Connie Goldberg. Playing with Goldberg were Rozanne Pollack, Beth Palmer and Lynn Deas. The final tally was Hamman 145, Goldberg 107.

Getting back to Bob Hamman – he may have lost in the Spingold but he's still in contention in the Wagar. He's the non-playing captain of his wife's team.

Kathie Wei-Sender and company will be the opposition for Hamman in today's final. Wei-Sender also led from wire to wire against the team captained by Cheri Bjerkan, winning 178-143. Playing with Wei-Sender are Juanita Chambers, Jill Levin, Betty Ann Kennedy, Janice Seamon-Molson and Tobi Sokolow. Bjerkan's teammates were Sue Weinstein, Renee Mancuso, Pam Wittes, Judi Radin and Sylvia Moss.

Wei-Sender and Hamman will play a 64-board final today.

In-Laws win 199er Pairs

Trevor Warren of Simi Valley and his father-in-law Cobe Venner of Boulder CO benefitted from a last-minute score correction to win the National 199er Pairs by half a matchpoint.

Warren is a high school mathematics teacher; Venner is a financial planner. Warren and Venner posted a score of 256 on a 216 average in the two-session event.

In second place was the father-son pair of Clint and Scott Gorsuch of Berkeley. Clint is a retired systems analyst, while son Scott is an options trader.

Forty-one pairs played in the contest. The National 199er Pairs is open to players with fewer than 200 masterpoints.

ACBL teams set for World Olympiad

Teams representing all four Zone 2 nations – United States, Canada, Mexico and Bermuda, will fly to Maastricht, the Netherlands, this week to compete in the World Open Team Olympiad and the World Women's Team Olympiad. The tournament will start on Saturday, August 26, and conclude on Saturday, September 9.

Russell becomes Grand Life Master

John Russell became an ACBL Grand Life Master today, but he probably never would have made the grade if it weren't for his wife Anita.

When John and Anita first started dating each other back in the late Seventies, Anita was quite interested in social bridge, and she wanted John to get involved as well. John tried the game, but he wasn't happy with his poor results. His solution: he went to the local bridge club and played to get some practice for the social bridge game.

He finally was doing OK in the social game, but he found that he enjoyed the competition of duplicate.

The rest is history. He won his 10,000th masterpoint yesterday in the Morning Knockouts in partnership with Chuck Said, a regular partner over the years. Their teammates were Ross Rainwater, Jackie Jarigese, Jim Murphy and Dave Adams. That fulfilled one of the qualifications for Grand Life Master. He fulfilled the other back in 1997 when he won a North American championship – the Silver Ribbon Pairs, also in partnership with Said. He came close to another NABC victory in 1996 when he and Rob Crawford finished third in the Open Board-a-Match Teams, three-hundredths (!) of a point out of second and only five points behind the winners.

Russell, a certified public accountant, finds the time to play in about two tournaments a month. He has won about 75 regional events, "and I think have just about the same number of seconds."

What about Anita? Is she still playing bridge? Yes, but she still prefers the social variety. She belongs to the ACBL and has a few gold points, won with John, to her credit. But social bridge is her first love.

To reopen or not to reopen

When you reopen after the opponents stop at the two level, sometimes your foes discover something favorable about their hands and bid on to game, making. Then again sometimes the reopening goads the opponents into game when they should have given up at the two level. Vivian Kilstrup decided to reopen on this deal from Wednesday's pair game, and the opponents quickly pushed forward into game.

 West's opening bid was a bit on the strong side, so he was willing to bid on to 3♠ after Kilstrup reopened. East had only 5 HCP, but he liked his distribution and carried on to game.

Kilstrup found the killing club lead, ruffed by Ron Sukoneck. Since his partner had led the 10, Sukoneck returned a heart and got a second club ruff. He fired back a diamond, and Kilstrup led another club. Declarer didn't want to see another club ruffed, so he ruffed with the king. The defenders never got their second heart trick, but they got a trump trick - the queen-jack now produced the second undertrick for plus 500.

Double squeeze

Mark Itabashi pointed out this interesting layout from Wednesday's Stratified Open Pairs:

Dlr: South ♠ Q 2
 Vul: Both ♥ A Q
 ♦ A K 10 7 3
 ♣ A J 4 2

♠ 9 8 ♠ J
 ♥ K J 10 9 4 ♥ 8 7 6 3 2

Cover the East-West cards and take the South hand as declarer in 7♠. What's your line of play on the lead of the ♦6?

Itabashi found a great line: win the ♦A, cash the ♣A and ruff a club. Play the ♠A, cross to the ♠Q and now make the key play of cashing the ♦K. Ruff a club to re-enter the closed hand and finish the trumps. This is the position:

When you play the last trump, West must discard a heart to protect the ♠Q. When you pitch the club from dummy, East must also discard a heart to protect the ♦Q. At this point, it doesn't matter which defender has the ♥K since it will drop on the ♥A. On the actual layout the ♥K will "pop up" when you play a heart to dummy.

Of such things dreams are made

This hand, from yesterday afternoon's Swiss, is another example of the dictum that many an opportunity awaits an enterprising declarer who runs a long suit:

West led the ♦9 a trifle too quickly, allowing South to read it as a singleton. After winning the ♦A, declarer drew trumps with the ace, king and queen and threw a club from dummy. Prospects were dim but the diamond pips suggested there might be a way home provided the East hand could be stripped of his black cards. The only deficiency in this plan was that there seemed no safe way of doing this. If he played a spade or a club, the defenders would mount an attack in spades and destroy any potential endplay. Eventually declarer saw that two more rounds of trumps would trouble East if he had started with either at least four spades or at least two spade honors. After declarer threw another club on ♥9, these cards remained:

When South played the ♥7, West could not afford to part with a spade (if he did declarer could set up a spade trick), so he threw a club while dummy parted with a spade. East had no winning discard but the ♠6 seemed safest. However, declarer now exited with a club to the ace, giving East two unpleasant choices.

The first was to cash the ♠Q before playing the ♣10 which South would ruff leaving:

This would winkle a spade trick if West rose with the king or force East to win and broach diamonds. Either way, declarer would have his tenth trick.

You may be curious as to why I have not named the declarer. Alas, was not as above in real life. East, rather than I, held the ♦8.

What a comeback!

The team captained by Walter Fontaine of North Providence RI was having serious problems in their opening match in the Tuesday-Wednesday Knockout Teams. At the halfway mark, Fontaine, David Metcalf, Michael Yuen and Pony Nehmert were down 43 IMPs, 48-5.

They pitched a shutout in the second half, outscoring their foes, 44-0. That gave them a 49-48 victory, and they went on to win Bracket 2 of the event.

It certainly looks as if best defense makes life impossible for declarer. Whether declarer covers the first trick or not, West can shift to a heart, and now two rounds of hearts tap dummy. However, declarer can still succeed on accurate play.

He ruffs the second heart and plays West for a 5-5-2-1 shape with the ♦A by ruffing a club high, then leading a diamond to the queen. If West wins to lead another heart, declarer ruffs in dummy and can cash the ♠A and the ♦Q, then ruff a club with the 9 to draw trumps. If West ducks, declarer takes the ♦Q to ruff another club high, then crosses to the ♠J to ruff another clubs. Then he goes back to the ♠A to draw all the trumps and cash the club. That makes three club tricks, six spades in hand and one ruff in dummy.

Excellent guess

How would you play 6♥ on a passive lead?

♠ A 7 4
 ♥ A 9 6
 ♦ K Q 5 3
 ♣ A K J

I guess you lead a diamond from hand at some point. If West takes his ace you are home; if not you could always try to ruff out the ♦A tripleton before falling back on a club finesse.

All right, how about 6♥ on a low diamond lead, after South has shown a weak 2♥ with a spade feature? Now the ♦A seems to be marked as offside – but you have an attractive alternative – run the diamond to your 10! Now you make if West has led from the ♦J. If East has both the ace and the jack, then you fall back on the club finesse.

Seems good? Not to Joel Wooldridge, who put up the queen at trick one and played successfully to ruff out the ♦A tripleton, rejecting his apparent extra chance.

And right he was. Randy Pettit had led a low diamond from

♠ J 6 5 2

If Wooldridge had misguessed at trick one, he would have sunk like a stone.

Still, the good news from Randy's viewpoint was that his team recovered from a 38-IMP deficit to win this second-round Spingold match.

Suit preference

Fred Stewart and Kit Woolsey had a great hand that demonstrated the truth of the theory that every card means *something*.

North (dummy)

♠ K Q 4 3 2
 ♥ 10
 ♦ A 10
 ♣ Q 10 9 5 3

West (you)

Say you led the ♥A against 5♣ after you have bid and rebid hearts. Declarer produced the ♥K. What should you do?

Well, of course you are entitled to one additional piece of information – what did partner play to the first trick? After all, he must be aware that declarer had precisely the stiff ♥K. That means he can use his four hearts as suit preference!

The ♥8 would show the ♦Q, so you should shift to that suit so that you will be able to cash your diamond winner before it goes away on good clubs.

The ♥4 would show the ♦J. Settle back and play the ♣A and a club, hoping declarer has to lose a diamond in the end.

The ♥3 would deny a diamond honor – exit passively in diamonds and hope declarer, with king-third of clubs, will misguess.

And the ♥2 would perhaps show a singleton club, so play the ♣A and a second club to give partner a ruff.

P.S. Woolsey played the ♥3. Stewart played on clubs and found declarer with

♠ A J 8 6 4 ♥ K ♦ Q 8 2 ♣ K J 2.

The hand was set one trick because declarer had to lose a diamond eventually.

Contract makes if you lead a diamond

This deal from a semifinal of the Grand National Teams, Flight A, was featured by David Bird in his column in England's *Evening Standard*.

North's 3♦ was a Bergen raise showing a normal, sound raise to 3♠. The defenders then had a misunderstanding. Connie Goldberg, East, intended her double for takeout. Since the diamond bid was not natural, Joseph Livezey interpreted the double as lead-directing, showing values in diamonds. Kyle Larsen bid the spade game and Livezey was on lead.

Any lead but a diamond would leave declarer with four unavoidable losers. Thinking that his partner held strong diamonds, Livezey made the "expert" lead of the ♦K! Larsen soon had 10 tricks.

I thought at first that a low diamond lead would have beaten the contract, too, but do you see how declarer can still succeed? He would have to win the first diamond, draw trumps, cash the ♦A, then play a club to the 9. With no diamonds left, East would be endplayed. He could cash three winners, but would have to give a trick to dummy, allowing two diamond discards. If East cashed only two of his winners before exiting, declarer would throw his remaining heart or club on dummy's established winner and later ruff a diamond.

The Facts: 3NT went down two, plus 200 for E/W. At 3NT, West led the ♦7. Declarer called for the queen. It won. Declarer then played the ♠A, ♠K, ♠Q by calling for each. Then he called for the ♦10. Dummy did not play it, but said, "what?" Declarer repeated his call for the ♦10, but a bit softly. Dummy did not hear this call and asked, "what?" again. Declarer then said "ten of diamonds, ten of diamonds, ten of diamonds" loudly. The Director was then called and ruled that the ♦10 had been played.

The Appeal: N/S appealed the Director's ruling. North and West attended the hearing. North explained that South was recovering from a grievous illness that may have affected his speech processes. North said that South was pointing toward the spade suit when calling for the ♦10. North said that was clearly South's intention to play off the spades when he was calling for the ♦10. North likened South's action to a repeated inadvertent designation and cited a Vancouver appeal decision in support of his contention. The facts were not challenged by West. She said that the problem occurred because North wouldn't play the ♦10 when it was clearly designated.

The Committee Decision: The ACBL and the bridge legislators have tried to create as level a playing field for all players as they can. The game is nonetheless a game for thinkers. When plays are made carelessly, the carelessness cannot be excused and the laws themselves superseded. Law 47C says: "a played card may be withdrawn without penalty after a change of designation as permitted by Law 45C4b." Law 45C4b says, "a player may, without penalty, change an inadvertent designation if he does so without pause for thought. . ."

The Laws Commission's San Antonio meeting minutes contain the following note regarding Law 45C4b. "It was clear to the Laws Commission that: (1) The presumption must be that the card named was the one intended. (2) The burden of proof is on the declarer. (3) The standard of proof is 'overwhelming.' (4) In judging 'without pause for thought,' if the declarer has made a play after an inadvertent designation, a 'pause for thought' has occurred." In this case,

despite the irrationality of the play of the ♦10, declarer's repeated insistence on playing it made clear that its designation was intentional and not, therefore, subject to withdrawal.

The Committee briefly considered an Appeal Without Merit Penalty Point for the appellants but decided against it for two reasons: (1) This appeal was based on a player's health handicap and how the laws must be interpreted with regard thereto. While accommodation for handicap has been brought before committees before, the general public's knowledge of the standards is suspect. (2) This appeal, based on Law 45C4b, had some similarities with the much publicized Vancouver appeal, which, though successful, had less merit than this one. In effect, this Committee believed that the Vancouver decision cast doubt in the bridge public's minds about what constitutes cause for permitting the withdrawal of a designated card. Since the public's confusion exists in part because of the National Appeals Committee's own actions, it would be wrong to punish a player for bringing an appeal which was based on the Committee's own published statements.

The Facts: 7♥ made seven, plus 2210 for E/W. The opening lead was the ♦9. The Director was called after the 7♥ bid. There was no disagreement that there had been a break in tempo. The Director ruled that passing 6♥ was not a logical alternative for West (Law 16). The table result was allowed to stand.

The Appeal: N/S appealed the Director's ruling. The total time taken to make each bid by E/W was disputed. 6♦ had taken from 10 to 30 seconds, 6♥ had taken from 30 to 60 seconds and the 7♥ bid had taken from 10 to 30 seconds. The 6♦ bid was directed to a spade control. There were no slow bids earlier. East's pause over 6♦ was partly based on his surprise that he had the ♥Q and could not understand why West had not asked for it. West confirmed that his final thought was still about whether to bid 7NT. E/W were a partnership of three to four years who have played together

on average once a week until recently. West has approximately 3500 masterpoints, East approximately 6000 masterpoints.

The Committee Decision: The Committee found it easy to determine that East's failure to bid 7♥ was a serious bridge error (he could see that his diamond loser would go on a spade.) That being the case, there was no reason to stop West from playing bridge. While there was a very small sample of hands where East could not make 7♥ (♠— ♥QJ109xxx ♦Qxx ♣AKQ), the grand slam would still be somewhat better than a ruffing finesse. If partner produced an eighth heart or a fourth club the grand slam would be excellent. If partner had a spade the grand slam could not be worse than a spade finesse and the jump to 4♥ indicated a very good hand. Accordingly, while the hesitation had been established and pointed toward a 7♥ bid, the Committee could find no logical alternative to West's raising to 7♥. Therefore, they allowed the table result of 7♥ made seven, plus 2210 for E/W, to stand.

Geoff Hampson found a devastating opening lead – the ♦A. He got a positive signal from Erico Greco, so he led a diamond to Greco's ace, and Greco gave him a diamond ruff. Now Hampson led a heart, and the rest was up to Meltzer. She rose with the ace and tested trumps, discovering the 4-1 break. She went back to hearts, cashing the king and leading the jack. She let this ride, and it worked – the 10 was pinned.

She had to do this to get a push because North at the other table did not find the diamond lead.

Incidentally the program is set up so that any unusual results are highlighted so that they can be checked for mistakes.

Your percentage at the local club no doubt will be different from your percentage worldwide. At the club you will be matchpointed only against others at the club. Worldwide you will be matchpointed against everyone everywhere.

This will be the second time this special software program will be used for a worldwide event. The first time was for the Worldwide Bridge Contest sponsored by the World Bridge Federation in June. Here are some interesting statistics from that event:

Number of pairs reporting – Friday 8964, Saturday 6549.

Number of countries – Friday 61, Saturday 49.

Number of clubs – Friday 485, Saturday 335.

Top on a board – Friday 7742, Saturday 5646.

Biggest score on a board – 4000 both days for a redoubled contract, once down seven vulnerable and once down eight not vulnerable.

There were some obvious errors that were caught by the program. For instance the score on one board was 33,980! That turned out to be a telephone number. Then there was the board that had hundreds of 170s and one 1700. That looked like a typo, but it turned out that the 1700 was real.

The worldwide interest that existed was proven by the number of hits on the server concerning this event – more than one and a half million!

IMP Pairs up for Lebhar Trophy

The four-session IMP Pairs began yesterday, but defending champions George Jacobs and Ralph Katz aren't defending their title – they are still competing in the Spingold Knockout Teams.

Lebhar Trophy

Players will compete for the Lebhar Trophy, donated by Bertram Lebhar Jr. in 1948 in memory of his wife Evelyn. The trophy was previously given to winners of the Mixed Teams but re-designated for the IMP Pairs by the ACBL Board of Directors.

Lebhar (1907-1972), under the name of Bert Lee, earned a national reputation as a sportscaster and later as a bridge player and administrator. In private life, he owned radio and television stations in Florida.

Perhaps his greatest achievement arose from his work as ACBL treasurer from 1945 to 1947 and as a member of the Steering Committee. In the late Forties, Lebhar was instrumental in the modernization of ACBL. He was named *ACBL Honorary Member* in 1963.

Lebhar was one of the founders of the Greater New York Bridge Association and was elected its first president in 1948.

Lebhar was also a player: he won the Spingold in 1940 and the Master Mixed Teams in 1946. His team was his wife Evelyn along with Samuel Katz and Alicia Kemper. Lebhar was second in the Chicago (now the Reisinger) and the Vanderbilt in 1946 and 1947, the Spingold in 1953, the Life Master Pairs in 1945 and the Men's Pairs in 1936.

Internet World Bridge Championship update

*** Internet World Bridge Championship 2000 ***

Here is an up-to-date report on the Internet World Bridge championship. Last year's champions, the Simson team from the United States, captained by Doug Simson, have reached the quarterfinals in the second annual Internet World Bridge Championship sponsored by OKbridge. They defeated the Warriors, an American team captained by Ray Raskin.

Four other regions have produced champions. In Region 1, Celtic Posse of Ireland, captained by Tom Hanlon, defeated Spain (Madrid -- Ignacio Torres captain), 123-39. This is the only region in the eastern hemisphere to produce a winner so far. A battle royal is raging in the match between Israel (Desert Storm - Michael Barel captain) and Sweden (Swedes -- Lars Larsson captain), with Israel out front by 2 IMPs at the halfway mark. The same can be said for the match between Australia (DBBC All-Stars - David Stern captain) and China (Hefei - Wofang Mau captain). With six boards to go, China leads by only 2 IMPs.

The fourth match between Russia (E95 -- 1999 runner-up, Alex Petrunin captain) and Romania (Romanian Beauty -- Catalin Popescu captain) is the only regional final match for which we have no report.

In the western hemisphere, three teams from the United States and one from Argentina remain. In one of the American matches, Team Bundy, captained by Peggy Kaplan, toppled Salukis, captained by Glafkos Galanos. The third American team to make the quarterfinals was the Florida Kees, captained by Jay McKee. They eliminated the Knowledge Engineers, captained by Peter Friedland. The third American team is Simson, the defending champions. The fourth match in this area pitted the south, Argentina 1 captained by Luis Palazzo, against the North, the Indigent Imps from Canada, captained by Wayne Timms.

Two Juniors are playing for Argentina, and one of them is only 13 years old! Here is what Captain Palazzo has to say about young Agustin Madala, who plays on OKbridge as agusm. "He is a great hope. His record is most impressive for his age -- three-time winner of the Argentina Junior Championship, second place in the South America Open Pairs, and many other victories at the national tournament level. I believe his Lehman in OKbridge is 62 or 63."

The other Junior is Pablo Ravenna, Pablor on OKbridge). He is 25 years old. He has represented Argentina in three Junior World Cups, the last in Fort Lauderdale a year ago. He was also invited to represent South America this year at the Generali Junior Individual in Athens. His best result in open competition was his second-place finish in the South American Pairs, partnered by Madala.

For the quarterfinals, the teams have been divided into two brackets -- eastern hemisphere and western hemisphere. Chief Tournament Director Gary Blaiss will seed each bracket. The matches from this point on will be 48 boards played in two 24-board sessions on two different dates. On-site monitors will be required in all these and all subsequent matches. Once again the final will take place at the site of the Fall North American Championships - this time in Birmingham, Alabama, USA, on November 16, 2000. This year there will be a playoff for third place. The American team that called itself the Warriors certainly lived up to their name in their Region 6 semifinal match against the heavily favored Thor team captained by Russ Ekeblad. Two hands late in the match were the keys to victory.

If you decided to lead a spade as East, which would you lead? Steve Weinstein led the 10 - probably the vast majority of players would choose a card from such a sequence. This lead did NOT work. Robert Levin ducked and Gene Gardner's singleton king won. Naturally declarer went after diamonds, and Weinstein continued with the spade jack after winning the diamond ace. When this was covered, Levin took his ace and led a heart. Weinstein could see that declarer had more than enough tricks for his game, so he won the ace and took his spade trick and conceded -- 3NT making three.

Ray Raskin also decided on a spade lead, but he led the 5 instead of a card from his sequence. This lead DID work. Steve Goldstein went up with the ace, dropping the singleton king, and continued spades. Russ Ekeblad won the third spade in dummy and had to set up diamonds. But Raskin was able to cash two more spades and the heart ace when he took his diamond ace for down two and an 11-IMP pickup. The Warriors had trailed by 9 IMPs going into this board, so they now led by 2. They increased their lead to 14 two boards later on an unusual slam swing.

Levin knew the partnership was close to a slam, but he wasn't too happy about the singleton in his partner's suit. He decided to invite with a notrump raise. Weinstein felt he had already shown his hand, so he passed. With both red suits breaking 3-3 he had no problem taking 12 tricks.

Raskin chose an unusual bid at his second turn -- he bid his three-card diamond suit instead of jumping in notrump. Goldstein confirmed the fit by raising diamonds. Raskin attempted to steer the hand into notrump by bidding hearts, but Goldstein persevered in diamonds, asking about key cards. When he got the news about two keys and the diamond queen, he put his partner in 6♦. The defense cashed the spade ace, but the happy break in both red suits plus the fall of the club queen made the slam easy. The Moysian success put the Warriors ahead, 65-51. Thor gained a non-vulnerable game swing on the next-to-last board, but that wasn't enough - the Warriors held on to win, 72-61.

This was neat victory for the Warriors, but they were eliminated in the region final, succumbing to Simson, the defending champions.

Since these are Mid-Chart conventions, it is the responsibility of the pair playing these methods to pre-Alert the opponents and to provide a suggested defense.

In order to help players counter these methods successfully, the tournament is making available copies of an article on the subject, written by Marinesa Letizia, that appeared previously in the ACBL *Bridge Bulletin*. Look for "Counter-Defense to Interference vs. 1NT Opener" in the rooms where General Convention Chart events are played.
