

## Rose blooms in Paris as USA II wins Bermuda Bowl

If you run into Rose Meltzer at this tournament and she seems to be on Cloud Nine, there's a logical explanation: she is. "I may never come down," said the person who less than a month ago became the first woman to win the Bermuda Bowl.

The fact that it wasn't easy makes the victory—recorded Nov. 3 in Paris— even more special.

Down 79 IMPs at the halfway point of their Bermuda Bowl final match with Norway, Meltzer and company — Kyle Larsen, Alan Sontag, Peter Weichsel, Chip Martel and Lew Stansby — mounted a comeback that left the teams tied with 32 boards to go. In the final set, the Americans were too much for Norway, winning the championship 286-265.

At the victory banquet that night, a crowd of hundreds sang happy birthday to an overwhelmed Meltzer. "I'm so proud to be a member of the ACBL and to represent the United States in the world championships," Meltzer said a few days before the start of the



Players decide to become ACBL Patron Members for a variety of reasons. For many, it's to take advantage of the program that provides reservations at the host hotels at each NABC — but for patron member Richard Radtke, of Plymouth MI, there was an unexpected bonus to the program. Radtke was the winner of a special drawing for a chance to play one session with a bridge celebrity. For the Las Vegas NABC, that role was filled by expert Billy Miller, known to many for his *Bridge Bulletin* column "Dear Billy."

Radtke, a Ph.D. in Computer Sciences, is retired from the Ford Motor Company but remains active as a software writer for credit unions. He and Miller teamed up in the Sunday morning side game and posted a 58.71% score to finish third in their section.

"It was really fun," said Radtke after the session. "Billy was such a nice partner ... even when I screwed up!" he added, laughing.

## Swedish Juniors lead Life Master Open

Despite a 29-hour trek to attend the Las Vegas NABC, Swedes Johan Upmark and Pes-Ok Cullin led the Life Master Open Pairs after yesterday's two-session qualifying round. Upmark and Cullin scored 2151.30 matchpoints to finish the day just ahead of the Minnesota-based pair of Bob Balderson and Peder Langsetmo who turned in a tally of 2117.10.

In third with 2110.35 is the powerful duo of Mike Passell and Michael Seamon.

Today's two-session final will feature the 260 pairs who survived yesterday's cut in the qualifying round from an original field of 568 pairs.

## Moss, Radin lead LM Women's

Sylvia Moss and Judi Radin topped the list of qualifiers after the first day of play in the Life Master Women's Pairs. Moss won the event in 1997 playing with Janice Seamon. Radin, the only woman to have won all four women's world titles, is looking for her first victory in the event.

Moss and Radin, both of New York, led the field with a score of 2058.72, slightly ahead of defending champions Mildred Breed and Shawn Quinn, who posted a 1985.57 total after the two qualifying sessions. Breed and Quinn, both of Texas, are trying to win their third consecutive LM Women's title. In third with 1973.06 are Hjordis Eythorsdottir and Rozanne Pollack.

The field of 146 pairs was trimmed to 72 for today's two final sessions.

## Californians lead Non-LMs

Mac Busby of San Diego 2000 Mini-McKenney Rookie of the Year, and Grant Peacock of Irvine CA have a healthy 22-point lead as they head into today's final two session of the Non-Life Master Pairs. Another California pair, Juerry and Jane Cupps of Livermore, are second. In third place, another 17 point back, are Dixie Adair of Rose Hill KS and Joann Schmidt of Andover KS.

## Zero Tolerance update

The Zero Tolerance program, started in Ontario clubs more than four years ago, is going strong and receiving credit for an exodus of players from intermediate games into open games.

Barbara Seagram, owner/manager of Kate Buckman's Bridge Studio in Toronto, says ZT "has made such a huge difference. We have always provided our less-experienced players with a separate room in which to play, along with their own director.

"This has made for an expensive but flourishing newcomer/intermediate program. The downside was that the players got so comfortable there that they were petrified of moving into the open game in the big room."

ZT has changed that, according to Seagram. "Over the past two years, the atmosphere has improved so dramatically among the open players that there has been a huge exodus from the intermediate games into the open games. We have had to hand out very few scoring penalties for Zero Tolerance. The fact that the policy is in place seems to keep the players in line and the perception that we are monitoring behavior at all times makes everyone happier.

"The players now never hesitate to report unpleasantness whereas before they considered it part of the game that they had to tolerate."

Seagram added, "We have had to ask several players to take a vacation from our club. They must be subjected to an interview with us before they are permitted to return. The bad ones don't."

## Turn 'em off!

Cell phones, audible pagers or any similar communication equipment may not be operated or operable in the playing area during a session of play at NABCs except for health-related equipment or by permission of the director-in-charge of the tournament or event.

The above is the resolution passed by the ACBL Board of Directors, meeting before the start of the 2000 Summer NABC in Anaheim. While the resolution applies only to NABCs, the Board urged that "sponsoring organizations of other ACBL-sanctioned events are strongly encouraged to adopt this policy."

## Luella Slaner

Luella Slaner, whose Cinderella teams nearly won two major team events in the Eighties, died Nov. 3 at her home in Scarsdale NY. She was 82.

Slaner was an expert golfer, a former mayor of her hometown and an authority on fusion energy. She became Marty Bergen's bridge student in 1978. "She was a gutsy lady," recalled Bergen. "Playing against good competition really brought out the best in her."

Slaner and Bergen, along with teammates Warren Rosner, Mark Cohen and Jerry Goldfein, finished second in the 1982 Vanderbilt Knockout Teams, losing to the George Rosenkranz team (Eddie Wold, Mike Passell-Jim Jacoby, Jeff Meckstroth-Eric Rodwell).

The following year, Slaner's team (Bergen, Cohen, Goldfein, Larry Cohen and Brian Glubok) finished second in the Spingold Knockout Teams. "We had lost to Jeff and Eric in Niagara Falls," recalled Bergen. "When we drew them the next year, Luella said, 'Good, I've got a score to settle with them'."

She did, taking over the #1 seed. "Both times when Luella finished her half, we were dead even or ahead," said Bergen. "She had one of the best records in the world against Jeff and Eric."

Slaner advanced to the final but lost to the Malcolm Brachman team (Ron Andersen, Bob Hamman-Bobby Wolff, Bobby Goldman-Paul Soloway).

Bergen summarized: "Although Cinderella never became a bride, in her two adventures as a bridesmaid, grandma had a blast as the belle of the ball."

Survivors are daughters Eugenia Ames, Barbara Winslow and Deborah Slaner Larkin and grandchildren Alexander and Juliet Ames, Jessie and Samantha Winslow and Margaret Larkin.

## Life Master Women's Pairs compete for Sobel Trophy

The Life Master Women's Pairs continues play today with the Helen Sobel Smith Trophy going to the winners. The trophy recognizes Helen Sobel Smith, the first woman elected to the Bridge Hall of Fame and universally considered the best woman player of all time.

She won 35 North American titles -- the Vanderbilt twice, the Spingold five times and the Reisinger four times -- and the McKenney Trophy (now the *Barry Crane Top 500*) three times: in 1941, 1942 and 1944.

When Smith died of cancer in 1969, the *Bridge Bulletin* remembered her as a player "without a peer among women and very few peers among men. Helen played like a man, it was true. But she also played like a lady."

Most Wests led a spade or a diamond, which resulted in 10 quick tricks for declarer. Quinn felt she needed to find something in her partner's hand that she could help.

She decided hearts provided the best chance, even though she had only three. As a result, she and Breed took the first four tricks, holding declarer to plus 600, an excellent matchpoint result.

## Meyers, Garner try for 2nd LM Open Pairs title

Jill Meyers and Steve Garner will see if first-time magic works a second time. The longtime friends won last year's Life Master Open Pairs as first-time partners, finishing more than a board ahead of runners-up Zia Mahmood and Chuck Burger.

Meyers and Garner got to 6♣ on this deal and Garner kidded Meyers about her pre-game remark: "You can take my two-level overcalls to the bank."

East opened 1♦ and Meyers (South) overcalled 2♣. "I was trading on the vulnerability," she said. West passed and Garner, remembering the "take 'em to the bank" promise, suppressed his six-card heart suit and drove to the club slam.

A trump lead would have beaten the ambitious contract but West, hoping his partner had either the ♥A or the ♣A, led his singleton ♥3. Meyers won dummy's ♥A, played the ♦J to her ace, ruffed a diamond and cashed the ♠A K, pitching a heart. She ruffed a spade, ruffed her last diamond with dummy's ♣A and ruffed a spade back to her hand. She drew trumps and conceded a heart for plus 920 -- and all the matchpoints.

\* \* \*

Before 1963 the event was restricted to National Masters and players of higher rank. It was a men's event until 1990 when it became an open event.

At stake is the Bobby Nail Trophy, designated by the ACBL Board of Directors to honor the diminutive Texan (1925-95) who won this event in 1974 with longtime friend and partner Gerald

Michaud.

Nail, inducted into the Bridge Hall of Fame at the Summer NABC in Toronto, won four other North American championships and represented North America twice in the Bermuda Bowl. His team was second in 1963.

2001 Fall NABC. She and her team are in Las Vegas to vie for major championships.

Although few pundits underestimated the Meltzer team at the world championships, the squad would not have been a handicapper's favorite. There were several strong teams in the Bermuda Bowl field, including the defending champions, led by Nick Nickell. That squad had obliterated Brazil in the Bermuda Bowl final in Bermuda last year.

There were also Italy, the reigning Olympiad champions, and the formidable team from Poland, which took Italy to the wire in the Olympiad final in Maastricht last fall. Norway, with the redoubtable Geir Helgemo, was also among the favorites.

The Meltzer team played well in the round-robin, finishing third, just one Victory Point behind Poland and Norway, who tied for the lead. The Nickell team was fourth.

USA II drew France in the quarterfinal round and had little difficulty with the host squad, dispatching them 276-178. Meltzer and company were slated for a semifinal match with the Nickell team if USA I could get past Italy. That matchup never happened as Italy, in a virtual tie with USA I after four sets, ran roughshod over the Americans in the final two sessions, winning by a cumulative score of 124-9. The final score was 262-146.

Next up for Meltzer and teammates was Poland, which had a 3-IMP carryover for the semifinal round. Norway would meet Italy in the other semifinal match. The morning line no doubt forecast a rematch between the Olympiad finalists, but Norway and the Meltzer squad had other ideas.

USA II started strongly against Poland and never let up, emerging with a 169-133 victory. With each step, Meltzer gained confidence, and she seemed to relax despite the mounting pressure of the world championship. "Once we got to the quarterfinal," Meltzer said, "I felt like a winner, and when we made it to the final, in my mind I had already won the Bermuda Bowl. I thought to myself, 'I look pretty good in silver.'"

In the championship round, USA II faced Norway, a team of confident young players who had held off a final-round charge by Italy to win 194-189.

Norway started against the Americans as though they would repeat the USA-Brazil blowout from January of 2000. At the halfway point of the Bermuda Bowl final, Norway had a 164-85 lead. It looked as though Meltzer would not fulfill her hope of becoming the first woman to win the most prestigious prize in bridge.

The match, however, was 128 boards – not 64 – and four of Meltzer's teammates have been in championship rounds before and emerged as winners.

In the fifth set, Meltzer and Larsen teamed with Stansby and Martel to try to get back into the match. They did just that, clobbering the Norwegians 69-28 to shave the deficit to a manageable 38 IMPs with 48 boards to play.

This deal was one of the keys to the American comeback.

This is what Brian Senior, assistant editor of the daily bulletin in Paris, had to say about the decisive deal:

When Martel could rebid his spades freely at the four level, Stansby took charge by asking for key cards then inviting seven. Martel's 6♥ denied the ability to bid the grand slam himself and also denied a minor-suit king. Stansby had no reason to bid the grand now and signed off in six. Martel won the heart lead while throwing a diamond from hand, then laid down the ♠A. He had got the trumps wrong but in a safe manner.

Martel continued by ruffing the low heart, cashing the ♠K and playing on clubs. Whether Helgemo ruffed in at some point or waited to be thrown in with the ♠Q, Martel had avoided the diamond finesse. He duly scored up plus 1430.

More from Senior:

Meltzer's weak jump overcall added momentum to the auction. Boye Brogeland began by showing a good raise to 4♠ and Erik Saelensminde invited seven over Larsen's 5♥ barrage bid.

Looking at some many key cards, it was no surprise when Brogeland accepted the invitation.

Saelensminde also won the heart lead and laid down the ♠A. He failed to find the endplay, perhaps not having sufficient enthusiasm to look for it when he was already down in a grand slam.

Eventually, he took the diamond finesse and finished two off for minus 200 and 17 IMPs to USA II.

The Americans seemed to gain momentum from the surge in the fifth set, and they followed with another explosive round to tie the match at 195 with 32 deals to go. At that point, Meltzer began to believe.

"When we tied the score," she said, "my warriors were armed for battle. I've never seen them so ready."

Norway won the seventh set by 2 IMPs, but USA II could not be denied in the final round, winning by 23 IMPs to seal the victory.

Meltzer said the Norwegians were gallant in defeat and showed their sportsmanship with hearty congratulations for the new Bermuda Bowl champions.

Said Meltzer: "Geir came up to me and said, 'This was the only time I wanted you to come in second, but I'm very happy for you.'"

At the victory banquet, Weichsel grabbed the microphone after the medals were presented. Weichsel, now a three-time world champion, congratulated Norway for their fine play. "We had destiny on our side," Weichsel told the crowd, "or they surely would have been victorious."

## ABA/ACBL Pairs event

The American Bridge Association and the ACBL will co-host the two-session Stratified Open Pairs on Wednesday. Players will have the option of choosing ACBL or ABA masterpoints.

### Approved Defenses Mid-Chart methods

Players who use methods allowed under the Mid-Chart (permitted in NABC+ events, unrestricted Flight A regionally rated events and any bracket of a bracketed KO which contains no team with a bracketed designator of less than 1000 masterpoints) are responsible for providing an approved defense from the online ACBL Defense database to those methods.

Since this regulation just recently went into effect, copies of the approved defenses may be available at the supply tables (while supplies last). In the future, players will be responsible for downloading these defenses prior to the events in which they are to be used.

**If you want to play Mid-Chart methods, download the appropriate defenses in advance.**

West leads the ♠9. East overtakes with the 10 and you ruff. Everyone follows to the ♦A. What next? Here's Kantar's answer:

Enter dummy with a club and lead a diamond to the jack. If the finesse wins, the most you can possibly lose is two heart tricks. If the finesse loses you will be able to discard dummy's hearts on your clubs and ruff a heart in dummy.

The only way to lose the hand is to play off two top trumps and then start clubs. East ruffs early and plays a heart, a most unhappy ending for you.

## Balancing Act

In 3♣ on the ♥Q lead, South (Roger Chitty) won two heart tricks then led the ♠K. West, Jill Levin, ducked, won the spade continuation and led a diamond to the queen to play a trump.

Roger hopped up with the ace, cashed the third spade and led a fourth club to promote the ♣10 for his partner Margaret Chitty for down two.

But since we had done well just to get to 3♣ (a fair percent of the field defended 2♥ or found less salubrious spots than 3♣), plus 100 scored North-South only a 35% result — an unsatisfactory result for nice play.

# NABC + Las Vegas = record every time

There's something about North American Bridge Championships and Las Vegas that always produces record attendance.

Consider:

- Las Vegas' first NABC, held in the fall of 1973, drew 13,464 tables – a record for the fall and the fifth largest ever.
- Las Vegas' next NABC – Summer 1979 – set a summer record with 18,517 tables.
- That record held until the Summer of 1985 when Las Vegas broke its own record with 19,828 tables.
- The all-time attendance record – a whooping 24,221 tables – was set in Las Vegas in the summer of 1991.

The all-time attendance record for a Fall NABC belongs to Orlando which attracted 14,980 tables in 1992. Any bets on this year's attendance – and another record for Las Vegas?

Most pairs bid the notrump slam on this deal and the matchpoint score depended on whether declarer took 12 or 13 tricks.

West led the ♥10 and Kaplan won with dummy's ♥Q. He immediately led to his ♦K to guard against all four diamonds being with West.

At the 1979 Summer NABC in Las Vegas, Ralph Katz and Ken Schutze claimed their first North American championship when they won the Life Master Pairs.

On this deal from the final session of the 1991 Life Master Pairs, Lynn Deas drew the right inference. She was playing with Beth Palmer.

Palmer's 5♠ bid asked about the quality of Deas' trumps. They were reasonably good and Deas went on to slam.

East led the ♥7 and Deas won the jack with her king. She led a spade and West won the ace. A heart came back to the 10, queen and ace.

Deas pulled the last trump and ruffed a heart. As she considered her next move, Deas realized that a successful diamond finesse would see her home but she doubted the hook would work.

"West is a good player," she said, "and I drew the inference that if he held the ♦K, he would have led from it – instead of from queen-empty fourth of hearts."

Deas backed her judgment by cashing the ♦A and running trumps. East was caught in a vise, unable to guard clubs and hearts. Deas was destined to take her 12<sup>th</sup> trick with the ♣7 or the ♥5.

Deas' plan would have succeeded even if West had originally been dealt three clubs instead of two. On the run of the spades, East would have to guard hearts while West would have to cling to the ♦K. Neither could hold three clubs, and the slam would come home on a double squeeze.

## Faster, faster!

Slow play, as opposed to careful or thoughtful play, is discourteous not only to your at-the-table opponents but to the entire field.

In duplicate bridge, a consistently slow pair can delay the entire game by minutes -- that seem like hours.

*The Official Encyclopedia of Bridge* lists these causes of slow play, some or all of them violations of the Proprieties of duplicate play:

- Delay in coming to the table after a round has been called .
- Discussion of boards previously played .
- Failure to pass at least one completed board promptly, or pass one board if the other has not been completed .
- Inattention during the bidding necessitating frequent reviews of the auction .
- Post-mortems, particularly those involving the player whose duty it is to score the board just played .
- Failure (in the event of an infraction) to accept a director's ruling pleasantly and promptly. .
- Blaming previous opponents for present tardiness instead of concentrating on finishing the present deal .
- Waiting for a miracle to change opponent's aces to deuces so that a bad contract will not receive its deserved result.

## Smoking policy

This is Las Vegas, so smoking regulations are very lenient in hotels and casinos. But remember that once you cross into the convention area of the Hilton, you are in ACBL country and there is no smoking in the playing areas or pre-function areas. If you are playing in any Pavilion room or the Barron or Conrad rooms, the fastest smoking access is outside on the patio. Those playing in the ballroom may want to head toward the casino for a smoking break.

## A no-loser suit

Sometimes the matchpoint game produces amusing results that would be completely ignored at IMPs. Look at Board 7 from the first qualifying session of the Life Master Open Pairs for instance:

With the East-West cards, we bid to 4♠, maybe not as good a spot as 3NT by East, but normal enough.

South innocently led the ♥10 (promising the jack) to dummy's ♥Q and North's ♥6. I drew three rounds of trumps and South pitched a club. Now came the ♥8 and what was South to do? If his partner had the ♣10 and the ♥9 instead of the ♥7, covering the second heart would not be a success. Declarer can then pitch his club loser on dummy's fourth heart.

Accordingly the hapless South ducked the ♥8, giving me the pleasure of playing ♥A-Q-5-3 facing ♥9-8-4 for three tricks and no losers. Of course, if North had the ♣10 the play would have broken even, but when I guessed the ♣Q I had 12 tricks and virtually all the matchpoints.

Miller's opening lead of the ♥3 ran to the 10, jack and king. Declarer played a low club to the king and continued with a club to the closed hand, inserting the 10. Miller ducked. Declarer next unblocked dummy's ♥Q, a revealing play to Miller since when Radtke followed with the 9, declarer was marked with an original heart holding of A-K-7-5. Also, declarer probably held the ♠A to justify his opening call. If that was true, declarer couldn't hold either the ♠Q or the ♦Q since that would give him enough points to have opened 1NT. It was possible that South held the ♠A and that declarer held both queens, but Radtke soon cleared up the position for Miller.

When the third round of clubs was won perforce by Miller's ace, he played the ♦K and noting Radtke's encouraging ♦7, decided that the ♠A was with West.

Miller exited with the ♠6. Declarer played low from dummy, and Radtke made the key play of a middle spade, allowing declarer to win the 10 but blocking access to the now-entryless dummy. This was the position:

Declarer cashed the long club and the ♥A, South pitching a spade and a diamond. After cashing the ♠A, declarer exited with a diamond, and Miller, confident of the layout, went up with the ♦A to crocodile-coup his partner's queen, and claimed the remainder.

For holding declarer to eight tricks, North-South earned 8.5 out of 11 matchpoints.

Note, however, that with careful play declarer could have scored a ninth trick. From the diagramed position, declarer should cash the good club and the ♠A, reducing North to red cards only. Now a low diamond fixes the defense. No matter whether North or South wins the third round of diamonds, he's endplayed — North in hearts, South in spades.

## Calling the Director

*Martha McGhee, co-chair of the 1998 Orlando NABC, was IN chairman at the 1992 NABC. This article appeared in the Daily Bulletin at that tournament.*

Call the who ...? The Director! It's okay to call the director. In fact, if you don't, you may lose your right to call him later if you are damaged.

The director is the one who sold you an entry, the one who passed out the board, the one who passed out the hand records and said, "Duplicate, please." The director is the one who organized the players and the boards so that everything runs smoothly at the right time, the right speed and the right direction.

The director is the one you need help from if and when an irregularity happens at your table. The director gives rulings pertaining to the "Laws of Duplicate Contract Bridge."

In order for the conditions of the game to be fair, everyone has to follow the same rules. The director is familiar with these rules and is responsible for seeing that they are correctly applied.

The director is also the one who calls the rounds when it is time for you to meet your new opponents. The director puts the results of each board into the computer and posts the computer print-out of results after each session.

When you need a director, raise your hand and call out "Director, please" -- loudly enough for him to hear but not so loudly that it disturbs the other players. When the Director arrives at your table, he will listen to what happened and explain to the players the ruling that pertains to the irregularity.

Some rulings have several options so if you don't understand them fully, don't hesitate to ask for them to be repeated.

Since the conditions at each table must be duplicated as much as possible, all the players must adhere to the same set of rules. The Director's main objective is to make the game as fair as possible for all the players involved, while ensuring that everyone has an enjoyable time.

Irregularities that may happen at your table for which you must call the director: a lead out of turn, an insufficient bid, a revoke, a card missing from a hand, a bid or pass out of turn, failure to Alert an artificial bid, changes of call, disagreements of tricks won, claims with trumps outstanding or disputed claims, bidding errors, etc.

The Director is your friend. Do not hesitate to call him or her. In fact, if you don't call the Director, you may have lost the right to call him later when you discover you have been damaged.
