## Norwegians capture Open Pairs I title

Joergen Molberg and Boerre Lund once had a regular partnership. They don't play much together any more, but when a friend from their home town of Trondheim, Norway, suggested they give the 2002 Spring NABC a try, they happily agreed to make the trip to Houston.

Saturday night, the two were thanking their friend Geir Helgemo - for his suggestion as they enjoyed congratulations for winning the Open Pairs I by slightly more than half a board.

The winning score was 2125.68 with a 64 top. Run-ners-up, David Berkowitz and Larry Cohen had 2092.3. In third place were Nick Nickell and Richard Freeman.

Molberg, 33, teaches math, gymnastics and science at a middle school in Trondheim. Although he helped countryman Glen Grotheim write The Viking Club about the strong club relay system popular in Norway, Molberg and Lund played a natural system in Open Pairs I.

## Montreal to host largest World event

## If being part of the largest World Championships

 ever in North America appeals to you, it's time to make plans for the tournament scheduled for Montreal Aug. 16-31.The tournament will also feature an ACBL regional - with masterpoints for many winners from the ACBL and the World Bridge Federation. The regional begins Aug. 16 and concludes Sept. 2.

ACBL President George Retek, whose home town will host the World Championships, advises players to book reservations soon because hotel rooms even now are becoming scarce.

Substantial discounts are available to those who travel to the tournament via Air Canada.

For information about the playing schedule and hotel space, see the 2002 Spring NABC Daily Bulletins of Saturday, March 9, and Tuesday, March 12. You may also contact Retek at the Westin Oaks Hotel.

Retek said that because of the favorable Canadian exchange rate, Montreal is now one of the least expensive destinations in the world.

The tournament schedule includes four "national" events - players must be from the same country - the Rosenblum and McConnell teams, the Open Pairs and Women's Pairs. Other events will be "transnational" pairs and teams need not be from the same country These include the Mixed Pairs, Zonal Teams, Senior Teams and the IMP Pairs.

Participants in World Championship events will receive registration bags and invitations to the opening and closing ceremonies. The closing ceremony includes a sit-down dinner and entertainment.

The World Championships also feature mult-screen

Nicholas and Alex Vickers They're starting bridge really early
Nicholas and Alex Vickers of Houston played in the BridgePlus+ game yesterday. Why is that news? Well, Nicholas is 10 years and Alex is only 7. Their parents, Charles and Kitty, taught them the game, and the boys play every chance they get. "Bridge is fun!" said Nicholas.

They enjoyed the free lesson offered by Audrey Grant yesterday. They were excited to meet Audrey, the author of the book they're studying (The Club Series).

Despite the difference in age, both boys are in the third grade. Nicholas is a Vietnamese boy whom the Vickers adopted two years ago. "The only English words I knew when I was adopted were USA and hungry," said Nicholas. He has a good command of English now and is beginning to move up through the grades in school.

Alex is a mathematical whiz. After finishing the first gade, he told his parents that he was bored in school. "Teach me about multiplication and division." It took him about an hour to nail these concepts. He skipped the second grade, but even third-grade math was too easy. "Teach me about algebra," he asked. His dad asked him what is $x$ if 2 plus $x$ equals 5 . Without hesitation Alex said, "Three."

West leads the $\downarrow \mathrm{K}$ and continues with the A and a low diamond to East's queen. Plan the play. Thanks to Eddie Kantar for the problem.


West leads the $\quad$ 3. East wins the king and shifts to a low diamond. Which diamond should you play and why?

Kantar's answer: You should play the $\downarrow$ K. Why? Because you can see East has the ace, silly. No, that's not the reason! In order to make the contract you must assume the $\boldsymbol{V}$ is onside. If that is the case then East needs the A to justify his opening bid.

There's quite a lesson to be learned from this deal. When you absolutely need one particular card (the $\geqslant \mathrm{K}$ in this case) to be in one particular hand to make a contract, assume it is, and then try to place the other important cards from the bidding.

## Three in a row

In England they say of the No. 73 buses that you wait all day for one to come along and then three come all in a row. On looking through the hand records from the first qualifying session of the Open Pairs I, I found little to report until the end of the set when - yes, you guessed it! This was board 27.


2 was Precision, showing six or more clubs or five clubs and four of a major. In $3 \boldsymbol{o}$ on the lead of the 4 Q I won in hand and overtook the Q with the K as East showed an even number of clubs. Back came a club, and at that point the deal was almost a doubledummy problem. The secret is to pitch two spades on the J 10 , then lead a heart to the queen and pass the $\checkmark 10$ to West. This would be the position:


If West returns a low heart, you know enough to run it to dummy's 9 , and you lose only a diamond at the end. If West returns a diamond, you make 11 tricks, and if West returns a club you ruff in dummy with the 9 (discarding a diamond) and finesse again in hearts, losing only one trick. Judi Radin found this play in partnership with Zia - it was especially critical to her since she was in game.

It was perhaps 30 years ago that the Bridge World published an article about when it was right to play the weaker trump fit than the strong one. It was referred to as "The Vondracek effect." Board 28 was a perfect example of the effect.

$5 \boldsymbol{e}$ is a cheap save, but not if the major-suit games are not making. As you can see, 4@ has no play. 4 was not exactly laydown either, but Justine Cushing

had no problem on the $\$ 10$ lead. The defense cashed two diamonds then shifted to the $\boldsymbol{\$}$. Justine won and cashed the $\boldsymbol{A}$ and $\vee \mathrm{K}$. Then she ran the spades to pitch his club loser while West impotently followed suit. Note that has no play on an early club shift. Even on a club lead, Justine can get two discards in time before West can ruff in.


## 3NT All Pass

(1) One-suited hand.

We played this deal against Bob Hamman and Sam Lev. Justine led a low spade to the 9 and jack. Hamman drove out the A, and now Justine had to decide whether to try to cash out the spades or to exit passively, and with what? The answer lies in the Smith Echo. If North echoes in diamonds, it should show better spades than suggested to that point (clearly the 109 doubleton), so the suit should cash.

If North does not echo in diamonds, how does South know whether to exit in hearts or clubs. Both look safe enough, but could the 9 be significant? Look at the full layout and you will see that this is the case. On the 9 play declarer has a chance for 11 tricks. Declarer wins the A and plays the 3, forcing North to split his club honors. East wins and throws North in with the fourth club, and North must exit with the $\boldsymbol{v}_{\mathrm{K}}$ to get one more trick for the defense. I'm pleased to say I was not put to the test. When my partner won the A, she broke up my tension in the ending by shifting to the $\$ 8$ instead of leading a club. Now plus 630 was clearly the limit on the deal.

## Paul Lewis Strati-flighted Swiss Teams

## By his son, Everett

My Dad was born in Granite City IL on Halloween, 1915. Having taken violin lessons for four years and teaching himself to play the guitar and sing at 14 , Dad seemed more inclined to study music than play cards. He did, however, play a game called "Rook" and other simple games that he says did not enhance the critical thinking skills required for bridge.

In the late twenties and early thirties, he was one of several kids who walked across the Mississippi River bridge into St. Louis to watch Cardinal games through a punched out knothole in the fence.

After graduating from high school, he spent six months in the CCC. Then, he went on to college at the University of Illinois. In January 1935, his first semester at Illinois, his housemother "forced" him to take up bridge so they would have a "fourth."

I don't imagine she had to twist his arm very hard. Between playing bridge, wrestling and various other interests, he acquired a degree in geology.

After college, Dad joined the Army Air Corps. Two weeks later, Pearl Harbor was bombed. Throughout WWII, Dad worked in Army Air Corps Intelligence.

His job in the post-war period lead him to study German at the language school in Monterey CA and Russian at Columbia, in New York City. He stayed in the Army Air Corps, then later the Air Force for a total of 20 years and six months; continuing to play bridge and entertain friends and acquaintances in Germany with his guitar playing and smooth tenor voice.

When he retired from the Air Force, he had to make a decision: manage a junkyard for used auto parts or go into the business of playing bridge. This decision was a "no-brainer" -- he chose to make bridge his second career. He bought into the San Antonio Bridge Club and became partners with Bobby Wolff and Joe Musumeci.

When Bobby and Joe left for Dallas to join Ira Corn in forming the Dallas Aces, Dad took over the bridge club by himself. During this time, he played professionally, gave lessons and ran the club.

Personal reasons took him away from bridge for a number of years. Unable to stay away any longer, he returned to the game he was "forced" to learn in college 65 years ago and has been playing ever since.

Even though his eyesight had become very limited, he was still one of the finest players in town, if not the state. Among the many things I have learned from my Dad, the single most important is summed up in the following quote, "Once you have berated and embarrassed your partner, you have lost your partner for the day."

The Vickers have a third child - Robin, five years old. She isn't a bridge player yet but she's eager to get started. She is the biological sister of Nicholas.

The parents chose bridge for the boys because the youngsters are so competitive. Like most siblings, they squabble frequently. Well, they didn't exactly choose the game for their kids. "They saw us play," said Kitty."We didn't force them to take up the game. You might say that we let them ask us to teach them."

Bridge gives them the opportunity to be competitive together as a team. They've watched bridge - they kibitzed Hemant Lall at a recent tournament -- and they've played a few times on the Internet, but their first experience playing people other than their mother and father came yesterday. It was the experience of a lifetime for them.
"It was so much fun!" said Alex. "And really exciting!"

Believe it or not, Nicholas told us about a hand. "Let me tell you about a hand. I opened the bidding one spade and it went pass and Alex said two spades. Everybody passed - and I made three!"
"We put a lot of people down," said Alex. "But they put us down some of the time."

During yesterday's Newcomer/Intermediate reception, we met two women who had played against the boys during the game. Doris Meeks and Eleanor Gibbs of Houston both were very impressed. "We were one of the pairs they put down," said Doris.
"Alex impressed me," said Eleanor. "After the round, he got off his chair and shook hands with us. He knew we were unhappy about losing the round, but he told us to remember that winning isn't everything you play bridge for fun."

Bridge is just one of the interests each boy has. Nicholas plays a lot of soccer - "it's our national game in Vietnam." He also has tried the various American games, and his favorite is ice hockey. "But I kind of like baseball, too."

Alex is big on Pokemon and Game Boy, but his favorite is mathematics. He loves to play with numbers.

The parents had to go to Vietnam to adopt Nicholas and Robin. "The first thing that impressed me was the horns," said Charles. "Everyone drives around on motor scooters, and they keep their hand on the horn just about all the time. Away from the city the country seems to be all rice fields. Rice everywhere!
"The other thing that made an impression on me was the poverty - it seems that just about everyone is impoverished. Everything is used over and over until it's gone. Even the new buildings look old. Did you ever hear of a two-meter hotel? The Claudia Hotel where we stayed is a two-meter hotel - the hotel is only six and a half feet wide.I could touch both walls by spreading my arms.'

Charles and Kitty are just as impressed by Audrey Grant as their children. "We understand she does bridge cruises from time to time," said Charles. "I think it would be great if we could go on a bridge cruise with her."

Charles and Kitty are both Life Masters, but they don't play much these days - they're too busy raising the children. "We let the boys take care of the bridge playing," said Kitty.

Children's Center gets $\$ 5000$ Charity check
A public/private agency serving the needs of sexually abused children in Houston is the recipient of a $\$ 5000$ grant from the ACBL Charity Foundation.

The organization was chosen by the Houston unit. A check was presented Saturday night by Virgil Anderson, vice president of the ACBL Charity Foundation. Receiving the donation was Barbara Grace, director of development for the organization.

Grace said the center handles cases of sexual abuse in children up to 18 years of age. The center receives referrals from Children's Protective Services of Texas and from law enforcement agencies. In 2001, the center treated 4753 children.

The center's mission is to provide a professional, compassionate and coordinated approach to the treatment of sexually abused children and their families and to serve as an advocate for all children in the community.

Grace said the forensic interviews are videotaped to reduce the number of interviews necessary.
"We are very child friendly," Grace said. "This is a tremendous service. Children feel very protected."

The Children's Assessment Center has an annual budget of $\$ 6$ million, funded $70 \%$ by Harris County and the rest from the private sector.
