Lynch victorious in Senior KO

The team led by non-playing captain Carolyn Lynch built an 80-IMP lead by halftime and held on for a 172-111 victory in the Senior Knockout Teams, denying a comeback effort by Mel Colchamiro's squad.

The Lynch squad was Dennis Dawson, Clement Jackson, John Sutherlin, Bobby Wolff, John Mohan and Dan Morse. Wolff and Morse claimed their second straight win in the event.

Colchamiro's team was John Stiefel, Richard De Martino, Pat McDevitt, John Malley and Daniel Colatosti. Colchamiro, Stiefel, Malley and Colatosti were on the squad that finished second in last year's event.

Dawson and Jackson claimed their first North American win. All the other team members have won multiple North American and world championships.

Seamon, Helgemo claim Blue Ribbon

Michael Seamon and Geir Helgemo, a first-time partnership, led the Edgar Kaplan Blue Ribbon Pairs after the semi-final round and again when it counted: at the end of the final round.

Their total of 1825.36 was almost two full boards (51 was top) ahead of runners-up Eric Greco and Geoff Hampson, who posted a 1730.30 total.

Another 47.67 points back were Varis Carey and Henry Bethe, who finished third with 1682.63.

Zia Mahmood and Jacek Pszczola, the leaders after the first qualifying session, finished fourth with 1680.57.

This was the first victory in the six-session event, considered one of the toughest and most prestigious of ACBL pair events, for either player. It was also the first Blue Ribbon win for a member of the Seamon family (Michael's father, Billy Seamon; his mother, Rita Seamon; his sister, Janice Seamon-Molson, and his aunts, Edith Freilich and Anne Burnstein, have all won multiple North American titles).

Michael Seamon won the World Transnational Teams in 2001 in Paris and placed second in the Rosenblum Teams in 1990. He is an ACBL Grand

Four characters in search of a victory

When you've been eliminated from the Blue Ribbon Pairs, it's hard to get too worked up about a knockout match. We duly got knocked out. But along the way, the following gem appeared.

Dir: East ♠ A 8 7 6

Vul: Both ♥ A 5

♦ 4

♣ 10 9 8 7 6 4

♠ 5 ♠ Q J 3

On the best defense of a diamond lead to the king and the ♥10 switch, declarer can succeed if he reads the position perfectly.

He wins the ♥A, unblocks the ♣A and runs the ♦Q, pitching dummy's heart. Back comes the ♥9 and you ruff, ruff a club and cash the ♦J, pitching a club from dummy. Now you ruff a heart in dummy and East must overruff to produce this ending, in which he has four losing options.

East can lead a high trump, in which case you win on the table and can crossruff, versus a low trump where you win the ♠8, ruff a club, ruff a heart and claim.

Or he can play a club which you ruff and draw trumps ending in dummy. His final option is to give a ruff and discard by playing a diamond. You ruff in dummy and pitch your heart, cash the ♠A and ruff a club back to your hand to draw the last trump.

Lynne Shah of Plant City FL became a Gold Life Master (more than 2500 points) when she won the Wednesday Stratified Senior Pairs with her husband Barat.

Super defense

Rick Logan of Diamondhead MS, playing in the Wednesday Swiss Teams, found a fine defense as West on this deal.

From the bidding Logan reasoned that partner had little or nothing – possibly a jack. He felt it was safe to lead hearts – he thought it likely that declarer had just the ace-king-queen of hearts. Declarer won the ♥K and led a spade toward the board.

Logan asked himself, "Why isn't declarer attacking diamonds?" He finally decided that declarer had bid 2NT on the singleton ♦K and was leading spades to set up a late entry to dummy's diamonds. He saw that the diamond suit could be set up if declarer overtook the king and continued the suit. Declarer's problem was how to get back to dummy to cash the good diamonds.

Logan blocked this plan by playing low and allowing dummy's ♠10 to take the trick. Declarer came back to hand with a heart and cashed his third heart. Next came another spade. Logan played the queen, cashed the ace and led his stiff ♣Q, which declarer ducked. If he won the trick he had no way to untangle his winners. But when Logan led a diamond, declarer was no better off – the defense was bound to get another trick whether declarer played diamonds or clubs. He decided to play clubs, so that "powerful" East hand took the setting trick with the ♣10.

Are they eligible?

The Senior Knockout team headed by Carolyn Lynch won two early matches in which the opponents withdrew because they were so far behind. That brings up a question – is the Lynch team eligible for overall awards? Don't they have to play 60% of the boards? (P.S. - We're only kidding.)

Dennis Dawson will always remember Boards 31 and 32 of the Senior Knockout Teams semifinal. He held the A-10-9-7-4 of spades on 31, and he couldn't believe his eyes when he picked up ♠ A 10 9 7 4 on 32 as well.

His team, whose non-playing captain was Carolyn Lynch of Marblehead MA, picked up 23 IMPs on these two deals – enough to convince their opponents to concede and withdraw.

Dawson didn't relish the vulnerability, but he still decided to overcall in spades. Clement Jackson had enough to make a mixed raise, but of course Dawson didn't go to game. Armand Barfus doubled.

Tornay led a club, his partner's suit, and Barfus took his ace. He cashed the ♦Q and the ♥A and got out with a small heart. Dawson led his ace of trumps and continued with the 10. When Tornay played the jack Dawson claimed, making 3♠ for plus 730 and 12 IMPs.

Wolff and Morse had a fine auction to get to the good club game. They lost just two spades for plus 600. This time Murray Melton bid his spades and Kantor raised, but that didn't stop Wolff and Morse.

If it works once it'll probably work again, so Dawson once again overcalled 1♠ with his weak five-carder. Jackson raised over 2♣ and the next two players passed – so far the auction was the same as at the other table. But whereas Morse had

cuebid spades in an attempt to get to 3NT, Tornay supported his partner's diamonds. With both opponents bidding spades, Barfus didn't think 3NT was a likely make, so he passed. The game swing gave the Lynch another 11 IMPs and victory in the semifinal.

Larsen attends caddy reunion

A basketball player from Loyola University here in New Orleans, a former caddy who won a North American championship here, another former caddy who's now an ACBL Tournament Director – all turned out for the Caddy Reunion yesterday afternoon.

Caddymaster Jackie Matthews looked over the group and said, "This is really fun."

She pointed out Jonathan Sims, the Loyola player. Matthews told him about a picture she had taken years ago with Oscar Robinson. "Are you going to be the next Big O?" she asked.

"No," he replied, "I'm a point guard."

One former caddy is Kyle Larsen, Bermuda Bowl champion in 2001 and ACBL Grand Life Master who won the Life Master Open Pairs earlier this week. He showed up for the reunion in suit and tie, and Matthews reminisced, "Kyle started caddying when he was nine and he got \$4 a session. He thought he'd died and gone to Heaven when he got raised to \$5 a session."

Matt Koltnow got more when he caddied at the Baltimore NABC in 1987. He's now an ACBL tournament director.

Others at the reunion were Matt and Rob Meckstroth, Tina Sunderlin and Anne Beye – plus the 60 or so caddies who are working here.

"It's really fun here in the South," said Matthews, who has worked with as many as 216 caddies at the last Las Vegas NABC and as few as six (yes, 6) for the final session at the last Minneapolis NABC. "They're all nice kids but they're so polite here. One of the head caddies was giving instructions and another caddy said, 'Yes, sir'. The head caddy is only 24 and he was somewhat taken aback."

Head caddies must be 18 or older, have worked at least five NABCs and have displayed leadership qualities. They serve as team captains and each team captain is responsible for one or more events.

They direct the other caddies, check in with the director in charge of the event, work with the set-up crew and make sure "their" caddies get the job done.

Matthews has turned the job over to the team captains but admitted, "It's awfully hard not to stick around and make sure it all gets done. It (the team captain system) is good for them and it's good for me."

Then she adds a trademark Matthews statement, accompanied by a trademark Matthews smile: "I just love these kids."

12 tricks – no slam

Richard Lesage and Jean Castonguay got to a neat slam – they had 12 top tricks. But they went down. And they didn't do anything wrong. How could that happen? Read on.

There it is – eight clubs, three spades and a heart on top. Paul Hackett of England, sitting East, found the imaginative lead of the ♦K, no doubt based on his partner's double. After getting a look at dummy, he shifted to a spade!

What can declarer do? If he tries to run spades, Hackett will ruff the third round. The ♣J isn't going to drop singleton. So suddenly declarer has only two spade tricks because there is no entry to dummy. Down one on imaginative defense.

Wold and Meckstroth vie for Crane crown

The following is a letter to the editor from Mike Passell.

We are nearing the end to one of the most exciting masterpoint races in recent memory. Two of the very best players in the world – my close friend and regular partner, Eddie Wold, and another good friend and frequent teammate, Jeff Meckstroth, have gone toe-to-toe since January.

Unlike the old days of Barry Crane and Ron Andersen, this battle has been one conducted in a friendly, courteous but highly competitive nature. Each has played only professionally, with their prospective schedules known to each other.

Jeff's advantage has been a very powerful national team that also won this year's Bermuda Bowl world championship in Monte Carlo earlier this month.

Eddie's advantage was a three-week period when Jeff was in France at the European Championships – where he and Eric Rodwell won the prestigious Open Pairs and received almost no ACBL masterpoints.

All in all it has been a very exciting time for all, and it should have been more widely publicized by the ACBL *Bridge Bulletin*. This is the type of good publicity the ACBL can use. I have had literally dozens of people asking about who was in front and how everyone was doing.

At every tournament I have attended, the *Bulletin* has given literally zero publicity to the players involved and even failed to list the standings in at least one recent issue.

I personally enjoyed the year very much, and I believe the bridge-playing public would have also.

Lynch had a big set in the first quarter of play, claiming an 85-18 lead. They tacked on another 13 IMPs in the second quarter, 38-25, and had a 123-43 lead at the half.

Colchamiro won the third quarter 34-19 to cut the lead to 142-77 going into the final session. Colchamiro won the last quarter 34-30 but it was not enough. Lynch had the title 172-111.

Feldheim led the ♦J to declarer's ace, and declarer quickly cashed the ♦K and ruffed his last diamond. The heart finesse lost to North's queen, and Feldheim shifted to the ♠K, ducked. Feldheim switched to the ♣J, and the finesse lost to South's king. Kinney sent back another club to the ace, and Zeckhauser cashed dummy's ♠A as Feldheim followed with the . . . queen!

Zeckhauser had to work out how to get back to his hand – it had to be with a spade or a club ruff. He decided to believe that Feldheim had only two spades, so he led a club off dummy. He ruffed this, but Feldheim was able to overruff for the setting trick.

Levy feels very strongly on the brown-sticker controversy. Brown-sticker conventions and systems are highly complex and convoluted, and it is very difficult for an opponent to prepare for play against a team using brown-sticker methods. Levy is very much in favor of banning brown-sticker methods. However, this won't happen for a while. The WBF Executive voted to continue to allow brown-stickers at its meeting in Monte Carlo earlier this month.

Levy pointed out that we now have a major presence on the Internet with the newly designed acbl.org website that will soon be released. We have had 125,000 sanctioned tables of online play at acbl-online.

Levy fully realizes how important it is to get young people interested in bridge. "The ACBL has an active school program that supplies bridge material and pays teachers to teach in more than 250 school classes throughout North America," he said. "More than 4000 youngsters have taken lessons this year."

More than 150 pieces of software were given away to young players during the past year, and Levy says there's a lot more – all the young players have to do is ask. He has programs like Bridge Master 2000, Bridge Baron, Jack, Microbridge and Q-Plus.

The ACBL is in excellent financial shape, and the Board is continuing its policy of investing in the future by directing funds to services and marketing.

Speaking on a personal level, Levy said, "I've made so many friends all over the world. I have a real upbeat feeling about the future.

"The magic in our game has the potential to capture the masses," Levy believes. "Bill Gates and Warren Buffett think that everyone should be playing bridge. What an endorsement!"
