The winners' score of 3016.39 ( 90 top) put them 58.04 matchpoints ahead of Martin Fleisher and Michael Kamil. In third place were Doug Levene and Mark Lair.

Katz and Rosenberg made the date to play last fall. Rosenberg's regular partner, Zia Mahmood, wanted to play with Bob Hamman to practice for their game later this year in the Cavendish Invitational tournament. Meckstroth tops 45,000 points

Jeff Meckstroth, many-time world champion, is in the headlines once again. The man whose image graces the March cover of The Bridge Bulletin recently crossed the $45,000-$ point threshold. He is only the third player ever to do so - Paul Soloway and Mike Passell are the others.

Why is Meckstroth on the cover? He won the Barry Crane Top 500 for the third year in a row by scoring 2749 points in 2002. He averaged 94 points in the 17 regionals in which he played, and his average at the three NABCs was 242 points. He also competed in the U.S. Bridge Championship and the World Bridge Championship in Montreal. He won the Mixed Pairs in Montreal and now has triumphed in all major world championships except the Rosenblum Teams. He just missed winning the ACBL Player of the Year title.

Does Meckstroth plan to shoot for a fourth straight Top 500 ? "No. I never seek to win this contest," he said. "It just happens."

## Bridge is big at Carnegie

Thanks to Noble Shore, bridge is big at Carnegie Mellon University in Pittsburgh. Shore, a 21- year-old senior majoring in computer science and psychology, teaches bridge to his fellow students, and they receive credits for passing his course.

So far he has taught seven classes with eight to 20 students in each class. "Altogether I've taught about 70 students here," he said. "At first the school didn't have a good place for us to gather - they put us in the PE area. But now they have a a stu-dent-taught department, and that's where we study."

Shore is here with four of his students and two others from the univer-

Remember that dues paid in 2002 applied only to the year 2002, regardless of when in 2002 they were paid.

## Turn 'em off

Cell phones, audible pagers or any similar communication equipment may not be operated or operable in the playing area during a session of play at NABCs except for health-related equipment or by permission of the director-in-charge of the tournament or event.

This is the resolution passed by the ACBL Board of Directors, meeting before the start of the 2000 Summer NABC in Anaheim. While the resolution applies only to NABCs, the board urged that "sponsoring organizations of other ACBL-sanctioned events are strongly encouraged to adopt this policy."

## New pre-Alert/Disclosure forms

If your partnership plays pre-Alertable MidChart or Super-Chart opening bids or overcalls in events which permit such methods, you must fill out one of the new pre-Alert/Disclosure forms for each such method that you play and make them available to your opponents before the start of each round or match segment.

This applies to any event, NABC+ or regional, which permits Mid-Chart or Super-Chart methods. Look for the light blue forms on the tables where convention cards and pencils are located.

There was nothing to the play and the superstar duo earned about $80 \%$ of the matchpoints for plus 980 .

Hamman conceded that he didn't read Zia's 4* bid accurately. No doubt he would not have been excited to hear about a diamond singleton considering his holding in the suit. Nevertheless, Hamman said, "I have to do something to make up for Zia's bidding."

## Convention cards - it takes two!

Each player is required to have a convention card filled out legibly and on the table throughout a session. Both cards of a partnership must be identical and include the first and last names of each member of the partnership.

If a director determines that neither player has a substantially completed card, the partnership may play only Class A conventions and may use only standard carding. This restriction may be lifted only at the beginning of a subsequent round after convention cards have been properly prepared and approved by the director. Further, the partnership will receive a $1 / 6$ board matchpoint penalty for each board played, commencing with the next round and continuing until the restriction is lifted. In IMP team games, penalties shall be at the discretion of the director.

If the director determines the partnership has at least one substantially completed convention card but has not fully complied with ACBL regulations, the director may give warnings or assign such penalties as he deems to be appropriate under the circumstances.

The objective of these warnings and penalties is the encouragement of full compliance with ACBL regulations.

## Cover an honor

The rule is: Cover an honor with an honor. Is this always the right thing to do? No! Look at Board 16 from the second qualifying session of Open Pairs I where best defense could give declarer a very nasty problem

The above was the typical auction. On a heart lead to the jack, king and ace, declarer cashed the - A-K and led to the $\boldsymbol{*}$ Q. East took his ace to return a heart. Declarer knocked out the $\bullet Q$ and claimed the rest.

Compare that with what happens if East ducks the first heart. Declarer would be in dummy and would lead to the top diamonds in his hand. Then he would play a club to the queen and ace. East now would lead the $\vee \mathrm{K}$, and declarer would have to win in hand and would be an entry short of bringing in the diamonds.

So what to do? Would you criticize a declarer who played the percentages and took a finesse to the $\& 9$ ? After all, that way you get back to par against all the other declarers who were lucky enough to have East cover with the $\vee \mathrm{K}$ on the opening lead.

If you took the club finesse, don't cry just smile. Larry Holtz made the nice play of ducking, in partnership with Tobi Sokolow, and he was duly rewarded when declarer took the club finesse.

The first thing about this deal is that no NorthSouth pair went minus - although there were five pairs with plus 190 who might just as well have been in the red. Looking at all four hands makes one wonder about that score. Equally, plus 640 with the South hand doesn't figure to earn many matchpoints (it didn't - 8 out of 64 ).

The scores ran the gamut - in fact, there were 14 different scores, the best of which was plus 2330 ( $7 *$ doubled), followed by 2230 ( 6 redoubled with an overtrick) and 2140 (a pedestrian undoubled, minor-suit grand slam).

There were also plus 1390 ( 6 undoubled making seven), plus 1740 ( 6 doubled with an overtrick) and plus 1430 ( $6 \vee$ making - no overtrick missing QJ1093 in the trump suit). One NorthSouth pair scored an unusual plus $1800(5$ redoubled, making seven).

The penalty numbers in favor of North-South ranged from plus 500 all the way to 1700 .

Here's how Brad Moss and Fred Gitelman arrived at the top spot.

One genius actually passed with the South hand, making a takeout double after $1 *$ by West, Pass, 1 a by East. He did, of course, have excellent support for the unbid suits.

## APPEAL CASE 1

In order to keep the bridge public informed of appeals results in a timely fashion, the NABC Daily Bulletin staff publishes write-ups. Every effort is made to ensure that these reports are accurate and complete. However, before they are published in the NABC Appeals Casebook revisions may be made.

Subject: Unauthorized Information
Event: North American Pairs, Flight A, March
5, Second qualifying session

(1) Precision
(2) Clubs and hearts
(3) Natural, game force
(4) Natural
(5) Primary diamonds, normally five or more

The Facts: $2 \uparrow$ doubled went down one, +100 for N/S. The opening lead was the $\% \mathrm{Q}$. N/S called the Director when dummy came down. They said they thought East had "fielded" West's psych of 2 * and should have to bid $3 \star$ over $2 \wedge$ doubled. The Director ruled that there was no evidence of a concealed understanding (Law 40) and allowed the table result to stand.

The Appeal: N/S appealed the Director's ruling. N/S told the Committee that with four-card support for his partner's first suit (diamonds) and only a singleton in her second suit (spades) it was normal for him to take a preference to diamonds. The failure to do so suggested an implicit partnership understanding. If players adopt a destructive mentality against a strong club and are able to psych freely without fear of getting "buried" by their partner, then the strong club bidders have no chance of getting it right (the psychers have an unfair advantage).

East said he had shown his hand with his initial action (double) and his partner's subsequent actions were on his own. The Committee also determined that E/W had played together for more than 20 years and that East had played bridge for more than 50 years.

The Committee Decision: The Committee believed that the logic of the auction backed up what East had said about West acting on her own. East had shown two suits and the opponents had announced game-going values, making it highly unlikely that West would wish to compete in whichever of the other two suits East preferred. Further, if North's double showed at least five diamonds, then West could hold no more than four of them and could not possibly be bidding this way with four-four in diamonds and spades.

East may not have expressed his reason for passing very well, but he was experienced enough to recognize that West's bids suggested that she was feeling around and that East should stay out of her way. N/S seemed to have been playing methods that were adequate for exposing the psychic (North's double of $2 \star$ ). They simply misjudged what to do on this hand.

Based on this logic the Committee decided that N/S were not damaged by a concealed partnership understanding and allowed the table result to stand.

The Committee noted that given East's initial action, it appeared that $\mathrm{E} / \mathrm{W}$ were very active in competing against a strong club. This time West held a freakish hand with a moderate fit for both of her partner's suits (clubs and hearts), making her efforts to muddy the waters by psyching attractive.

However, E/W were advised that if they commonly bid a short suit in this type of auction, the opponents were entitled to that information ("Partner has been known to bid a short suit in this type of situation."). The hand was referred to the Recorder.

Dissenting Opinion (Aaron Silverstein): Although I do believe that East could have worked out that West had psyched from his own hand and the auction, his statements in front of the Committee ("I had shown my hand and whatever she did was up to her." and "For all I knew she had seven hearts and was about to bid them.") led me to believe there was a concealed partnership understanding. Even though South could, and maybe should, have worked out that it would be right to bid 3NT, I am reluctant to say that
 his failure to figure out that the opponents were psyching was an egregious error which severed any connection to the damage. Therefore, I believe the contract should have been adjusted to 3 NT made five, +660 for N/S, for both sides."

## ACBL institutes new pre-

 Alert/Disclosure forms
## By Rich Colker, ACBL Recorder

Pairs who play methods not permitted on the ACBL General Convention Chart are required to pre- Alert their opponents to these methods prior to the start of each round (in a pair event) or segment of a match (in team games). The methods in question are those permitted only on the ACBL MidChart or Super-Chart

The pre-Alert must be in writing and should include a complete description of the method along with an approved suggested defense if one is required. Those marked with an asterisk on the Mid- or Super-Chart do not require a written defense.

Approved defenses can be obtained from the ACBL Defense Database. These are available on the ACBL web site (www.acbl.org) or can be purchased (hard copy) from the ACBL sales department. Defenders may refer freely to the written description of the method and any written defense during bidding or play.

What is new in 2003 is the form that the ACBL requires for disclosure of these methods. In the past the disclosure form was a simple lined sheet (sometimes on gray paper, sometimes on yellow) with the heading "Pre-Alert/Disclosure Form."

This has been replaced by two forms (one for opening bids, the other for overcalls) which have been adapted from the disclosure forms presently in use by the World Bridge Federation. The new forms (printed back-to-back on light blue paper) contain sections for the convention user to disclose far more information about their methods than has previously been required.

Information requested for a pre-Alertable opening bid includes: what seats and vulnerabilities the bid can be made in; a detailed description of what the bid shows; what typical, minimum and maximum holdings look like; what the responses and rebids are; which hands responder may pass the opening bid with (if any); what various actions (including pass and double) mean in competition; and space for the approved suggested defense (if one is required).

Information requested for a pre-Alertable overcall includes: at what vulnerabilities the bid can be made; what the bid shows; whether the bid applies when partner is a passed hand, an unpassed hand or always; what typical, minimum and maximum holdings look like; which hands responder may pass the overcall with (if any); what the partner of the overcaller's bids (advances) mean; what various actions by advancer mean if responder (third hand) acts; what various rebids by overcaller mean if opener acts again; and space for the approved suggested defense (if one is required).

The requirement to pre-Alert Mid-Chart and Super-Chart methods and the need to provide an approved suggested defense for some methods (see the Convention Charts for details) have existed for some time. ACBL is now testing these new forms. The ACBL hopes there will be a marked improvement in providing full disclosure.

Some pairs will inevitably be forced to discuss aspects of their adopted methods (such as what various responses and rebids mean, or what various bids mean if the auction turns competitive) that might otherwise be neglected.

And isn't that a good thing? It will now be possible to hold pairs playing these methods responsible for any problems caused by missing information. And that's surely a good thing.

Katz said he and Rosenberg arrived at 3NT several times on auctions not likely to be duplicated at many tables. Fortunately for them, some "impossible" 3 NT contracts came home, along with loads of matchpoints.

The penchant for playing 3NT got so pronounced, Katz joked, "at dinner I asked Michael if he wanted to take Stayman off the card."

After the first final session, Katz and Rosenberg lay fourth overall, more than 106 matchpoints behind the leaders, Eric Greco and Geoff Hampson. Those two, plus the pair lying second after the first final - Steve Weinstein and Robert Levin - had poor games in the evening and dropped in the standings.

That's right - George Burns, Omar Sharif and Clint Eastwood. What about the investment world? Sure enough - Bill Gates and Warren Buffett. Tennis great Martina Navratilova is there as well as Supreme Court Justice John Paul Stevens.

Actually there are three Walls. - South, West and Luminary. In the center of the Luminary are Charles Goren, Bob Hamman, Edgar Kaplan and Norman Kay. Featured with Goren is an autographed copy of the Time magazine from the Fifties where he was featured on the cover as the King of Hearts. Benito Garozzo, Dave Treadwell and Bobby Wolff are on the left, and Eddie Kantar, Arthur Robinson and Bob Jordan are on the right.

Altogether the Wall features more than 80 submissions from contributors spanning the globe.

Mark Lombard, who had the idea for the Wall, believes any club in the ACBL could build tremendous interest by building a similar Wall. "Our club members are enthusiastic, and interest in the games has increased exponentially," said Lombard.

Lombard did the organizational work, but he applauds the major help he received from Judy Kay, Zeke Jabbour, Frank Stewart, Hamman, Wolff and Robert Lombard.

Lombard realizes that it takes more than photographs on a wall to generate a global renaissance in bridge's popularity. "However, simply expressing one's passion for the game encourages others to explore its many glories. It is, after all, a glorious game. As Norman Kay inscribed on his photograph, 'Here's to bridge. Long may it reign!'"

Eddie Kantar, Norman Kay, Alfred Sheinwold, Josephine Culbertson, Vic Mitchell, Al Morehead, P. Hal Sims and Sam Stayman were the Hall of Fame inductees.

Ralph Katz and Howard Weinstein, winners of Open Pairs I, credited luck with playing a major role in their victory

East-West, with more than half the high-card points, did not take the sacrifice, so Katz-Weinstein were headed for a good score just for getting to slam with 13 points opposite 6 . In fact, they collected 71 of 77 matchpoints when West underled his $\checkmark$ A at trick one - trying to reach his partner for a spade ruff - and Weinstein racked up plus 1390.

Bruce Reeve and Nadine Wood sat down to play against Zia who, as usual, was surrounded by kibitzers. After the bidding made Nadine the declarer, Bruce asked, "Would one of you kibitzers like to play against Zia?" One volunteered and Bruce left the table temporarily. After the opening lead, the kibitzer put the dummy down, remarking, "I'm sorry about my bidding, partner."


Bob Goldwater (South) refused to give up in the bidding or the play on this deal. West led the -A and continued with the king, and Goldwater ruffed. He cashed the $\mathrm{A} K$ and conceded a diamond to East's 10. East would have done better by switching to a heart at this point but he continued a club, and Goldwater ruffed again. Now Goldwater ruffed a diamond in dummy and led the a J, ducked. He ruffed a club back to his hand as East pitched the $\vee \mathrm{J}$, and led a heart to dummy's ace. At trick 10, he was in dummy with East's $\uparrow \mathrm{Q} 73$ trapped in front of his $\uparrow$ A K 10. Plus 650 was worth all the matchpoints.

North at my table eventually passed and led the \(\bullet K\), shifting to the \(\uparrow 9\) at trick two. I ducked to the \(\uparrow \mathrm{Q}\) and the \(\uparrow \mathrm{Q}\) was returned, overtaken by North, who played a second spade.

I won the \(\uparrow A\) and led a low club to partner's ace. Then he cashed the \(\boldsymbol{*} \mathrm{Q}\), noting North's echo in clubs. This was the position:

The winning play on defense is not so hard to spot. If you lead a low heart from hand (West), North can rise with the ace and play a low diamond, forcing you to ruff with the \(\vee \mathrm{Q}\). South ruffs the \(\boldsymbol{*} \mathrm{K}\) low and the defenders must get another trick.

When I led a low heart to dummy, however, North ducked. Now I had a tempo: the \(V\) Q wins, I play the \(\approx \mathrm{K}\), ruffed and overruffed and exit with a second heart to North's now bare \(\vee\) A. Whatever North plays at that point - a club, high diamond or low diamond - I have the rest.

It was nearly the last board, however, so North and I were both tired. I put in the \(v 9\), playing North for a 2-3-5-4 pattern, and went down one.

Oh, well. Confession is good for the soul.

East led a low spade to the jack and king. Aker then cashed five club tricks, discarding a diamond and his low spade. His right-hand opponent discarded three spades, while East let go of a low spade and a diamond.

Reading the position accurately, Aker cashed the \(\diamond \mathrm{K}\) and A , then played the \(\vee \mathrm{Q}\) and a heart to the ace. This was the end position:


Aker exited with the \(\wedge \mathrm{Q}\) to to endplay East, who was forced to lead into Aker's heart tenace. That was good for plus 690, not a huge difference on a 64 top since many East players discarded hearts prematurely on the run of the clubs, making it easy for North to scoop up 12 tricks. Still it's always good for your amour propre to play correctly.
