

By the time the two young players had scored the final board of their 64% game in the evening, they were more than two boards clear of second place – Ken Cohen and Dan Gerstman. In third were David Berkowitz and Larry Cohen.

On a 51 top, the winners' final score was 1722.39. The runners-up had 1616.55.

Although Greco and Hampson didn't play together in the Open Pairs II last year, they were very much involved in the finish at the 2002 Spring NABC in Houston. Greco won the event going away with Curtis Cheek, while Hampson was sec-

Ulker Mutlu wins 10,000th point

When Ulker Mutlu came to the United States from Turkey 45 years ago, she knew nothing about bridge and only two words of English - "yes" and "no." Today she is celebrating because she now has 10,000 masterpoints to her credit.

Back in 1957 her husband Guneri, a physician, opened a medical office and Ulker began to meet people and learn English. Time and again she was asked if she played bridge. If bridge was such a wonderful game and if it would open social paths for her, she wanted to learn the game.

Her husband was not all that enthusiastic about the idea. He gave her four reasons NOT to learn

Double, no trouble



Kyoko's takeout double might not be everybody's choice as the AK rated to be unfavorably placed. But then everybody might not have got the score she did. Yamada wriggled from one 4-3 fit to the other, but had no more squares to run to after 2♥ was doubled.

East, who shall remain anonymous, led his singleton spade to 6, jack, queen. Yamada continued spades to king and ace, East pitching a diamond. Three rounds of clubs followed. Yamada ruffed, then entered dummy with a diamond to play a heart to the 10. East won and – fatally - played back another heart to king and ace. That was all Yamada needed. He played a diamond to the king and another diamond to reach the following position with West on lead:



Whether East ruffs the spade return or not, he gets no more tricks.

be sitting across from Zia all day.


Matchmaker, matchmaker, my request is so small,

Ruff and uppercut on the same deal

The defense has a number of maneuvers available to them – in the trump area they have have the ruff and the uppercut. It is rare for one and the same defender to get an extra trick in both strategies, but Board 10 in the second qualifying session of Open Pairs II showed North-South scoring well on defense by doing just that.




I'm sure that the auction went around to West in third seat at many tables. He probably would open 1 ♠ – most macho men believe in four-card majors in third seat. North (me) overcalls 2♥, not liking it too much, but pair events require you to do this sort of thing. East bids 2. How bad can it be to finish up at the two level here? Plenty bad, as you'll see.

I led a diamond to the 10 and queen, and John Diamond cashed his ◆A and gave me a ruff. Now the ♥A and a heart to the king saw the declarer run the ♣J to my king. I cashed the ♥Q, then led another heart. Dummy ruffed with the 6 and Diamond overruffed with the 8. Declarer took the trick with the trump jack. He cashed the A and ruffed the ♣Q in dummy. He led dummy's last trump to the queen and my ace. I led my last heart at trick 12. Diamond ruffed with the 10. When declarer overruffed, my \$\displays 100k the contract down three tricks for plus 300 and 35 of a possible 38 matchpoints.

Bobby Levin showed a hand with 22-23 points and three aces. East led a low diamond and declarer won in hand to play the $\bigstar K$ and the $\bigstar Q$. I pitched two clubs and now declarer played a club to the king which held the trick. On the ♦ A dummy threw a club and I let my last club go.

Now declarer played the ♠K and followed with three top hearts. When he cashed the A he was at the crossroads. I still had the ▲J-4 and the ♥J .If he guessed to play a heart I would have to give dummy the last two tricks. However, not unreasonably he thought I held the A in which case the Q and 10would give him his 12 tricks. He played a spade and I won the last two tricks.

Had my partner, Bob Jones, won his ♣A, I would have had no defense. When declarer would cash his \$Q, we would have to unguard one of the major suits to give declarer his contract.

Jones's very nice play resulted in an 11-imp swing to Pavlicek instead of the same number the other way as our teammates played in game.

It takes two

Each player is required to have a convention card filled out legibly and on the table throughout a session. Both cards of a partnership must be identical and include the first and last names of each member of the partnership.

If a director determines that neither player has a substantially completed card, the partnership will be required to play a convention card provided by the tournament director and may use only standard carding.

This restriction may be lifted only at the beginning of a subsequent round after convention cards have been properly prepared and approved by the director. Further, the partnership will receive a 1/6 board matchpoint penalty for each board played, commencing with the next round and continuing until the restriction is lifted. In IMP team games, penalties shall be at the discretion of the director.

If the director determines the partnership has at least one substantially completed convention card but has not fully complied with ACBL regulations, the director may give warnings or assign such penalties as he deems to be appropriate under the circumstances.

The objective of these warnings and penalties is the encouragement of full compliance with ACBL regulations.



In the days when scoring was done by hand, you could often find the tournament directors together with their sheets, as was the case at this tournament in Mexico in the late Seventies. Seated on stage, each with a score sheet, are Gary Blaiss, Julie Greenberg, Guillermo Poplawsky, Phil Merry, Ralph Kaufman, Tom Whitesides, Bill Adams and Harry Clark. Of this group, Kaufman, Adams and Merry are no longer with us. Blaiss and Greenberg work at ACBL Headquarters, Clark is retired, and Poplawsky and Whitesides are full-time TDs.

there was a feeling of pride to produce the first balanced sheet. There were many speedy scorers, but only one superman – Richard Freeman. Yes, the same Richard Freeman who wins world championships these days.

Freeman is a world champion bridge player, but when it came to manual matchpointing he had no equal. When they used to talk about the Fastest Pencils, Freeman was never included because no one could touch him.

Freeman was particularly awesome on a 25 top. Modern players, used to computer scoring, probably have no idea what a chore it was to do a 25-top sheet. But back then only the best scorers ever were assigned to score a 25.

Harry Goldwater, one of the all-time great national directors, once decided that he was going to beat Freeman on a 25-top sheet. Goldwater had somewhat of an edge since he was the chief director at that New York tournament. He put all the slow players in Freeman's section, and he assigned the laziest caddy to that section.

After the game Goldwater was furiously matchpointing when he suddenly heard Freeman say, "I'm in balance except for three late plays."

Freeman had finished matchpointing, adding and balancing his sheet while Harry still had several boards left to matchpoint. That was the last time anyone challenged Freeman.

Another famous oldtime director, Maury Braunstein, hated to be

saddled with slow scorers. One time the tournament chairman insisted. As everyone was scoring their sheets after the session, the chairman asked Braunstein how the new director was doing. "See my No. 1 assistant over there? He's finished his sheet. Your director has finished half his sheet. I guess I'd have to say he's a half-fast scorer."

Both players and directors enjoyed the sociability of manual matchpointing.

"Computers are faster, but they're so impersonal," said Betty Ann Kennedy of Shreveport LA. "It was great fun standing shoulder to shoulder with the other players while we watched the directors matchpoint our sheet."

"Computer scoring is not as exciting," said Andy Purbrick of Rose Valley PA. "I loved to stand there and copy down my scores while the director matchpointed. Sometimes you wonder what the computer is doing with your scores."

Ralph Hall of Needham MA much prefers computer scoring. "They post the results after 12 rounds so you know how you did when you look at the scores after you finish. If you're out of contention you can go home right away and get to bed

early."

Back in those good old days, directors used to play games with their sheets. The longer a board went without a duplicated score, the more points the director earned. Extra points also were awarded when the same score showed up for both North-South and East-West. The usual bet was five cents a point, which doesn't sound like much. But just ask some of the old-time directors – when you were having a bad day and there were six or seven directors in the field, you could lose a bundle.

Tournament Director Charlie MacCracken remembers that quite often a woman would stand behind him and rub his neck while he was matchpointing. "It made me feel good," he said, "and I think it helped my matchpointing."



MacCracken remembers how Louise Embry discovered that the red matchpoint scores were soluble in gin. She had just finished her sheet when she tipped her drink over. Yes, directors used to drink back in the good

"I think we've spoiled the players," said Tournament Director Terry Lavender. "When we posted burners, the players learned how to matchpoint so they could figure their scores after 12 rounds while we finished the sheets. Now all they have to do is look at the leader sheets."

old days.

Some of the directors remembered the dinger sheet. Tournament Director Dean Weisbach used to keep a record of each director's mistakes on a special record sheet. Each mistake added one more dinger to the director's total. Too many dingers and you weren't hired for the next tournament.

Tournament Director Pat Jackson misses the personal aspect. "It was fun the way the players hovered over us as we worked. A lot of the camaraderie is gone today."

Jackson would like to have the ACBL run a 1950's style tournament, complete with manual matchpointing. It might be fun!

TOURNAMENT APPEALS

Appeal Case 7

The Facts: $3 \blacklozenge$ doubled went down two, +500 for E/W. The opening lead was the $\blacktriangledown 7$. The Director was called after the double. There was an admitted break in tempo. The Director ruled that there was unauthorized information and that passing $3 \spadesuit$ was a logical alternative to doubling for West. The contract was changed to $3 \spadesuit$ down two, +200 for E/W.

The Appeal: E/W appealed the Director's ruling. No players attended the hearing but E/W submitted a written statement as they had to take a train home and the last train left before the hearing could begin.

West's statement read: "I based my double of 3 ♠ on my hand and the auction prior to the hesitation by my partner. With a weak hand containing seven clubs headed by the queen-jack he could have transferred by bidding 2 ♠ directly over the double of 1NT. Instead he passed and came into the auction later. I believed his actions prior would normally produce one trick to go with my four tricks which would be down one for +200 to protect against our making +110 in 3 ♣."

The Committee Decision: The Committee believed that the hesitation, which was agreed to by E/W, suggested values and made West's double more attractive. They also believed that pass was a logical alternative to doubling. Therefore, the Committee changed the contract to 3 ◆ down two, +200 for E/W.

The Committee considered an Appeal Without Merit Warning but because the case was not screened and one Committee member thought that West's double was fairly automatic at pairs, it was decided not to award one.

The Facts: 3NT made six, +490 for E/W. The opening lead was a low diamond. The Director was called at the completion of play. 3♣ had originally been explained as 8+ HCP and five-plus clubs. After dummy was tabled, the explanation was corrected to 13+ HCP and five-plus clubs.

When the Director was called North said he would have led the ♥10 instead of a low diamond with the correct explanation. The Director ruled that had N/S called at the time the conflicting information came to light the opening lead could have been changed with no penalty (Laws 9, 11); continuing to play prejudiced the right to an adjustment. The table result was allowed to stand.

The Appeal: N/S appealed the Director's ruling. Only North attended the hearing. N/S was an experienced partnership with 2900 and 3900 masterpoints. North stated that had he been aware that West had 13+ HCP he would have led a "safe" ♥10 instead of the aggressive ◆7. He said he did not call the Director when he became aware that an infraction had occurred because he was just getting back into bridge after having quit playing for almost 20 years and so he didn't know the laws. (The Director determined that he had been back playing after his 20-year hiatus for at least two years.)

E/W were frequent partners and each had about 350 masterpoints. The Reviewer educated them about their obligation to correct a misexplanation before the opening lead when they are the declaring side.

The Panel Decision: The Panel agreed that N/S had compromised their position by not calling the Director immediately after becoming aware of the infraction. Five expert players were given the auction and the North hand as an opening lead problem. All five led a diamond given the explanation at the table and all five said they would still lead a diamond given the correct explanation.

Five players in the 2000-5000 masterpoint range were also consulted. Three of them led a low diamond given either explanation; one led a heart given either explanation; the fifth led a heart with the explanation given at the table but switched to a small diamond given the proper explanation.

Therefore, the table result was allowed to stand. Since N/S sought redress even though they did not call the Director at the proper time and presented an argument that had no bridge merit, they were each assessed an Appeal Without Merit Warning.

The Facts: 3NT made four, +630 for E/W. The opening lead was a club. N/S called the Director after the 3♥ bid and said that there had been a substantial break in tempo before East passed 3♣. All agreed that the pass had taken 30 seconds or more. The Director ruled that pass was a logical alternative for West and changed the contract to 3♣ down three, +150 for E/W.

The Appeal: E/W appealed the Director's ruling. West argued that with a five-five minor-suit hand on his right East was more likely to have hearts and that he had a tolerance for spades as a fall-back position. N/S both thought that pass was a logical alternative to bidding 3♥.

The Panel Decision: The Panel determined that there had been a significant hesitation before East's pass. Four expert players were consulted about West's bidding. Two passed while a third said he might either double or pass. Two of the three thought the huddle suggested bidding. The fourth expert thought both 3♥ and pass were possible and wondered if a double would have been takeout.

Three of West's peers (Flight B) were polled. One seriously considered doubling 2NT; all accepted West's pass over 2NT and would then have passed 3.4 in passout seat.

Therefore, the Panel decided that pass was a logical alternative to bidding 3♥. The contract was changed to 3♣ by North (Law 16A2). Next the number of tricks declarer would take in 3♣ was considered. Two experts were consulted and they believed seven tricks was the most likely result. The contract was changed to 3♣ down two, +100 for E/W. E/W were each assessed an Appeal Without Merit Warning since they chose to continue the appeal when pass was an obvious alternative to 3♥ and both the table Director and Reviewer had explained the law to them.

Puppet Schmuppet

When Jim Flint of Zillah WA opened the bidding with 1NT on board 12 in the Sunday evening 299er Pairs, partner Susan Kestenbaum of Huntingdon Valley PA responded 34, which Flint Alerted as puppet Stayman.

He bid $3 \blacklozenge$, showing at least one four-card major, and she bid $3 \spadesuit$.

In a senior moment, Flint forgot that his partner was showing the major she didn't have, and he raised her to game with four spades.

Kestenbaum played the 4-3 fit expertly and made five, good for nearly all the matchpoints.

The good board helped the two to finish first overall with a 64% game.

It wasn't silent after this deal

The last board of the day in the second qualifying session of Open Pairs II saw two experts come to our table. They may have pushed us around in the auction, but we recovered in the play.

On the first board expert No. 1 overcalled on a four-card suit, so on the second deal expert No. 2 opened a four-card major.

Perhaps I should have been warned by the previous deal, but I drew the not especially intellectual conclusion that partner would be short in hearts – wrong!

Expert No. 1 led the ♥K (partner playing the queen), then cashed the ace and led a suit- preference 2 to the jack. All well and good, but West thought he knew better – maybe I had the ♣J-9-8 – so he played a diamond. I had seen the suit preference play, so I knew what I needed to do.

I put in the \blacklozenge J, cashed the \spadesuit Q, took the \blacklozenge A, crossed to the \spadesuit A and played off the \blacklozenge K before drawing the last trump. This was the ending:

I led a low club from dummy to West's 7 and my 8. I wish I could say "the rest is silence", but as we left the table that was far from being the case.

Where's that ace?

Jill Mellstrom of Sweden was playing for the first time in a year and a half, so maybe it's not surprising that this happened. She was playing a hand and had to make a discard, so she shed a diamond. Later she was looking for the •A in her hand, but it wasn't there! She looked on the floor and there it was. It was face up so everybody saw it. "That's the card you discarded," said one of her opponents. "No way," said Jill. But she changed her mind when even her partner agreed that she had pitched the ace.

A knockout she'll always remember

Betty Eisenberg has been playing and teaching bridge for many years and had amassed almost 900 masterpoints – but she wasn't a Life Master. She still needed eight gold points.

She found a part to partner in one of the knockout events, and not only did she win her gold card – she won the event. She also became a Bronze Life Master and is now closing in on Silver Life Master.


Being from nearby Cherry Hill NJ, she had a large cheering section supporting her. She told teammates Sally Sabo, Neil Carlson and Anite Carlson, all of Santa Fe NM, that this was one event that she would remember forever.

Show-up squeeze

There were other lines of play that would have led to nine tricks on this deal from the Vanderbilt, but Brad Moss made his game with an interesting endplay.

Moss won the opening heart lead with the queen and led the ◆Q, ducked. He continued with a diamond to the jack and switched to the ♣Q, taken by West who led another heart. Moss won and led a spade. We can see that Moss could set up his long heart by giving up a heart, but he thought it likely that West had led from a four-card suit. East went in with the jack, but West overtook with the queen. West continued with another spade, ducked, but Moss won the next spade. He cashed his other top spade, leaving this position:



West was caught in a show-up squeeze on the play of a diamond to the ace. He couldn't discard his spade because of the 7 in dummy. He couldn't pitch his heart because declarer still had the jack. And when he actually shed a club, of course the jack showed up when declarer led the suit.

bridge – the language, learning about hands, not enough time and "You're working for me!"

That didn't stop her. She began watching people playing bridge, and finally she started to play. She hadn't read any books and she had taken no lessons. She kept asking, "Why did I get a zero?" and slowly but surely she put all the answers together and started winning. She was Rookie of the Year in her first year as an ACBL member, but she's come a long way since then. She is an ACBL teacher and she is a professional player. "I've taught hundreds of students and quite a few of them have become Life Masters."

She vividly remembers the first time she won a trophy. "I went home and woke up my husband. I showed him the trophy and told him to never underestimate the power of a woman. He was very proud of me."

Mutlu remembers how frightened she was when she first started playing duplicate. "I encourage young people to play. I tell them that there's nothing to be afraid of." And then she told about the time that was frightened out of her skin.

"My partner opened 4NT, and I thought it was Blackwood so I bid 5. because I didn't have any aces. After the opening lead was made and the dummy was spread, one of the expert opponents called a director and took the director aside. I was shaking – what had I done?

"After a while the director came back and asked me to come with him. He asked me why I bid 5. I told him I was answering Blackwood. He chuckled and told me to go back to the table and play the hand. Strangely enough 5. was the only contract that made. We had a 4-4 spade fit, but all five spades were in one of the defender's hand.

What was it all about? "My partner had actually opened ONE notrump!"

the final by vanquishing the Mark Gordon squad, 162-140.

Gordon's team was Richard Zucker, Winthrop Allegaert, Jaggy Shivdasani, Mark Molson and Boris Baran.

Pavlicek jumped out to a 44-22 lead after a quarter, increasing it to 103-61 at the halfway point. Gordon made a mild comeback in the third quarter, but there was too much work to do and not enough time.

Nickell's match against Rita Shugart (Andrew Robson, Forrester, Boye Brogeland) was much the same. Nickell led by 68 at the halftime and weathered a comeback attempt by the opposition to win 169-128.

The Nickell team, one of the most successful in ACBL history, has been dominant in other major team events but has won only one Vanderbilt - in 2000. The team was second last year. Meckstroth and Rodwell won the event on a different team in 1985.

Pavlicek has won the Vanderbilt three times, each with the late Bill Root as his partner. Kamil

Olive Peterson – an all-time great

Philadelphia's bridge history is dominated by legendary figures of the game – Helen Sobel Smith, Charles Goren, John Crawford, Olive Peterson, Sidney Silodor and B. Jay Becker.

Olive Peterson — Life Master #36 and the fourth woman to win Life Master status — was an outstanding player and teacher whose career spanned auction and contract bridge.

She was closely associated with Milton C. Work, with whom she won many auction and contract championships. She conducted one of the earliest bridge cruises with Work – in 1933 aboard the S S Corinthia.

Peterson (1894-1965), who lived in St. Davids PA, was subsequently associated with Charles Goren. She was elected president of the Women's National Committee of the ACBL in 1940.

That same year she won the Mixed Team-of-Four Championship with Henry Chanin, Marie Black and Waldemar von Zedtwitz, a victory she would repeat in 1942 with John Crawford, Margaret Wagar and von Zedtwitz.

1942 was Peterson's great year in competition: she narrowly missed a win in the National Mixed Pairs with Crawford but triumphed in the Women's Teams championship with Ruth Sherman, Olga Hilliard and Peggy Golder (later Solomon).


She also put up a terrific battle in the Masters' Individual before finishing second to Harry Fishbein – the best finish by a woman since Elinor Murdoch had won the grueling bridge marathon in

In 1943 Peterson repeated the Mixed Teams championship - this time with Helen Sobel Smith, Goren and Silodor. This earned her Life Master status and she celebrated the achievement by winning the Mixed Pairs with Goren.

The following year, the foursome repeated as Mixed Teams champions and in 1945, Peterson and Peggy Solomon won the Women's Pairs.

Peterson served as vice president of the Women's Auxiliary of the ABL in 1936 and ACBL Secretary in 1951.

Her writings include Work-Peterson Accurate Valuation System, 101 Celebrated Hands, Simplified Digest of Culbertson System and Common Sense Contract.



Many a seemingly ironclad contract has been defeated because an alert defender thought twice. Peterson (West) led her singleton spade to East's queen. When he continued with the AK, she discarded the &Q.

At trick three the A was led and she pitched the A. A club lead now promoted a defensive trump trick and the set.

Use the Alert bar

Why I didn't win the Mixed Pairs

For 25 years, my wife, Carol, and I have played together once a year, at the Alexandria Regional over the Fourth of July weekend. Our once-a-year bridge in Virginia was very, very good. For the last two years, however, I have attended a veterans' reunion and been deprived of her company at the bridge table. Once a year came early this season in the form of the Rockwell Mixed Pairs at the Philadelphia NABC.

I "taught" Carol to play in 1970, two weeks after I had been drafted into a two-and-a-half-table game at Camp Lejeune NC. In the intervening 33 years, we have never played transfers!

In the first session of the Mixed Pairs, I opened 1NT, left-hand opponent passed, Beloved bid 2♥. RHO and I passed and LHO, after inspecting our two properly filled out convention cards, bid 2. Carol's double card floated to the table and LHO went for 800. It's hard to get very angry at a partner who just won 63.5 matchpoints out of 64 (one wonders how this result was duplicated at another table). The director was called and ruled: "Bad luck, the result stands."

Tuesday evening produced a very satisfying session for 25 boards, with our only "bad" results coming from our opponents' very good play. On the last board, Carol opened 1NT and I bid 4♥. Carol bid 4♠. I bid 5♥ and she passed. It is conceivable that I was the only declarer in the hotel to play this contract from the North position, since, in 33 years of playing bridge together, we have never played transfers.

No harm (to us) $-5 \checkmark$ was cold. RHO, however, held two aces but didn't get one of them. Plus 680 was good for 60.5 matchpoints. Now, when your partner forgets twice that you have never played transfers in the history of your 33-year partnership, you are not supposed to win 124 out of 128 matchpoints. I estimated our evening session at 57%.

It is clear, however, that God in his heaven is watching. We had arrived at our table for the evening session a bit late (I was doing partnerships) and our East-West opponents had made one of the two boards from the hand records (boards 11 and 12). We all completed the second set.

Our opponents, however, were probably not aware that they had been designated God's instrument as they placed the hands for Board 11 into Board 12 and 12 into 11. Nor did I see fit to insult their intelligence by inspecting the boards that they had made.

When the smoke had cleared, we were penalized 128 matchpoints (two full boards) for fouling the boards. This penalty was sufficient to remove the pair that never have played transfers in 33 years from the final two sessions.

Goodwill message

All about knockouts

Knockout Teams: an event in which a team (of four, five or six players — with four playing at a time) plays another team. The losers are eliminated or "knocked out" while the winners play other winners until only one team remains undefeated.

Bracketed Knockout Teams: a KO event in which teams are divided into groups — usually of 8, 16 or 32 teams — based on their masterpoint holdings. The top group — Bracket I — and all other groups compete in a separate event with their own set of winners.

Compact Knockout Teams: a shorter version of Bracketed KO teams.

Helen Sobel Smith – the best ever

Philadelphia's bridge history is dominated by legendary figures of the game – Helen Sobel Smith, Charles Goren, John Crawford, Olive Peterson, Sidney Silodor and B. Jay Becker.

Helen Sobel Smith, the first woman elected to the Bridge Hall of Fame, is universally considered the best woman player of all time – and, by many, the best player of all time.

Edgar Kaplan, editor and publisher of *The Bridge World*, made these comments in 1996: "In my lifetime, Helen is the only woman bridge player who was considered the best player in the world. She knew how to play a hand."

Helen (1910-1969) was born in Philadelphia but spent most of her adult life in New York City. She learned to play bridge while working as a chorus girl in the Marx Brothers' *Animal Crackers*.

She won her first national title, the Women's Pairs, in 1934 and became Life Master #25 in 1941.

Her style was frisky and aggressive – so aggressive that "some of her male partners were intimidated," Kaplan said. "These guys felt they were playing in the Mixed Pairs and they were the girl."

1944 was a banner year for Helen. She won the Vanderbilt, the Spingold, the Women's Teams and the Master Mixed Teams and placed second in the Reisinger.

By 1948, she had amassed the greatest number of masterpoints of any woman, taking over the top spot from Sally Young and holding it until 1964.

In all, she won 35 national titles – the Vanderbilt twice, the Spingold five times and the Reisinger four times – and the McKenney Trophy (now the *Barry Crane Top 500*) three times: in 1941, 1942 and 1944.

Helen and frequent partner Charles Goren won the De La Rue International Invitational Pairs Tournament in London in 1956 – billed as a world championship – and represented North America in the Bermuda Bowl in 1957 and the United States in the World Team Olympiad in 1960.

Goren was the bridge writer/promoter and Helen "was the player. She was a marvel," said Kaplan. Helen had a poker face, he continued, "and nobody ever knew what she was doing. Her judgment was extremely good and she would always feel perfectly free to deviate from her so- called system."

Helen was a good partner – "very tolerant of success" – who was "lovely and humorous and frisky and magnificent," Kaplan said. "There'll never be another one like her."

Helen won her last NABC title in 1968 – the Master Mixed Teams, playing with

Oswald Jacoby, Jim Jacoby and Minda Brachman. It was her sixth win in the event, tying her for the record with former partner Goren. Her team's margin of victory was 1.5 boards and the senior Jacoby summed up the victory: "Helen was so sensational. She won it. We were just her teammates."

When Helen died of cancer in 1969, the *Bridge Bulletin* remembered her as a player "without a peer among women and very few peers among men. Helen played like a man, it was true. But she also played like a lady."

What's your play?

The contract is 3NT. West leads the $\clubsuit 6$ and East plays the $\clubsuit K$. Plan the play.

The declarer was Helen Sobel Smith, playing in a world championship conducted by the International Bridge League in Budapest in 1937. The championship was won by Austria but Helen's play of this deal became a classic.


Here is an account of the play, taken from the April 1970 *Bulletin:*

Declarer quickly realized that nine tricks couldn't be made without some heart tricks. But, of course, as soon as the defenders won the \P A, they would run the spade suit.

If the spades were 4-3, the contract could not be defeated regardless of what South did. If West had led from a five-card spade suit and East held the ΨA , a holdup of the A appeared imperative. If West, however, held the A and five spades, the holdup appeared pointless.

So, dear reader, what would you have played to the first trick – and why?

Here is how our hero figured it out. If West had held Q-J-10-x-x, he would have opened the AQ. Therefore, if East held only a doubleton spade, it must include the 10 or jack. Going by this analysis, declarer won the first trick with the ace and went after the heart suit. This was the full deal:






In a vise

On this deal from the Rockwell Mixed Pairs, Allen Kahn brought home 11 tricks by means of a rare vise squeeze. He was playing with Jessica Piafsky.




East led a low heart to the 4, 9 and jack. Kahn played the •9 to the jack in dummy and followed with the •J: 2, 8, queen. At this point, East could have defeated the contract by switching to the •Q. The defenders could get three spade tricks up and still have the •A to come. That's a difficult play to find, however, and it seemed reasonable for East to continue with a heart to dummy's bare king.

Another club was played to West's ace, and a third round of hearts finally established East's queen. Three rounds of diamonds were followed by two rounds of clubs to reach this position:



When Kahn played the ♣10, East's hand was ruined. Playing the ♥Q would make the ♥J good for trick nine, and a spade discard would allow Kahn to play his singleton spade to the queen, king and ace. The ♠10 would be the ninth trick.

Careful defense



(1) Equivalent to a forcing 1NT.

Meredith Beck opened the ♣A and switched to a spade to partner's ace. Tom Carmichael returned a spade to Beck's king, and she led a low heart to partner's queen and declarer's king. At trick five declarer misguessed and cashed the ♥A, followed by another heart. Beck won her jack and only now did she play her ♣K. That doomed the contract because declarer had no way to get to dummy to take the diamond finesse. That proved to be an excellent score because most North-Souths made 3♥.

After winning the ♥K, declarer would have done better to lead toward dummy's 8 to guarantee an entry.

Popper held the East hand and he decided to bid 2NT and Ivar Stakgold raised him to 3NT. The opening ♠8 lead rode to the queen, and Popper crossed to the ♥K to lead a club. North rose with the ace and got out with the ♥Q to Popper's ace. Popper carefully played the ♥10 from dummy. Popper cashed the ♣K and continued with the ♣J, losing to North's queen but setting up the rest of the suit.

Once again North got out safely with a club to Popper's 8, and Popper went to dummy with the ◆A. He cashed the ♥J and got back to his hand by winning the carefully preserved ♥4 with the 8. When he cashed his last high club, North was squeezed. He couldn't discard his ◆K – the queen would be good. And he couldn't discard a spade – dummy's spades would be good. Popper wound up with 11 tricks.

Playing with John Diamond, we bid the hand this way:

I was West and led a low diamond to my partner's queen, and back came another diamond, ducked to dummy's king. Declarer should play a heart now, but he actually led a low spade — fatally. Diamond won the spade with his queen and led a low heart to the king. A heart back to the ace and a third heart to the 10 followed. I led my club, and dummy's queen lost to partner's king. Dummy took the club return. Declarer ruffed the next club, but he still had to suffer a three-trick set — minus 500. If he had drawn trumps, the defense could take another heart trick when they win their A. If he didn't draw trumps, I would eventually get another trump trick.

280 Pairs

Some days are like that

It was a bad day all around.

Mary Oshlag and Charlene Predmest were doing well in the Women's Pairs qualifying when suddenly Oshlag started having terrible pain. She was rushed to the hospital where it was discovered that she was suffering from kidney stones. Charlene finished the session with a substitute. They did well enough for Predmest and Oshlag to qualify.

However, Oshlag was kept in the hospital. Under the rules, Predmest could not play with a substitute, so suddenly she didn't qualify.

She called her husband Brian to tell of her woes, but Brian had a story of his own to tell:

"I was following Davis Love who was playing in a pro-amateur golf tournament. Suddenly Love's partner got sick and had to quit. Love picked me out of the crowd and asked me to fill in. I told him I had no equipment with me, so he lent me some of his.

"On the first hole I had a good drive, a fine chip shot and two putts to par the hole. 'Stick with me and we'll win this tournament,' Love said. It was a great feeling to be playing with such a star.

"And then it happened – we were hit by a severe lightning storm and they called off the tournament. And you're talking to me about kidney stones?"

Yet another Philadelphia story

Here's another one from Don Krauss (to whom we owe an S from the first Philadelphia story earlier in the week).

As an experienced gambler, John Crawford never wanted to bet with anyone more than that person could pay. After all, if you win \$100 from someone who can't pay more than \$50, you probably won't even get the \$50.

All this was relevant when Crawford's team – Howard Schenken, Edgar Kaplan, Norman Kay – was playing a practice match against the sextet of Sam Stayman-Vic Mitchell, Robert Jordan- Arthur Robinson and Bob Hamman-Krauss prior to their competing in the World Bridge Olympiad in New York in 1964. The game was at the Regency Whist Club in New York City.

Before the match, Crawford set out to make bets on the outcome with each member of the other team.

Crawford bet Stayman \$500. The bet was \$200 for Jordan, \$50 each for Mitchell and Robinson. When he got to Hamman and Krauss, two young hotshots, Crawford asked, "Can you two afford \$10 each?"

They said yes.

Sure enough, Crawford's team won, and Hamman and Krauss had to pay up.

"Between us," recalls Krauss, "we had \$27. After we paid off on the bet, we had just enough for cab fare back to the hotel."

A passing fancy

The previous deal had been passed out, and Jim White was the dealer on the second board. But he suddenly discovered that everyone else had passed! Then he looked down and was surprised to see a green card in front of him. He had forgotten to return the Pass card to his bidding box after the previous deal and everyone thought he had passed.

When the director got to the table, he explained that no player can be deprived of his right to make a call. If one player fails to get a chance to bid, the auction reverts to him and continues without penalty.

But White decided he didn't have much of a hand, so he passed, and so did everybody else.

Discounted parking
