Cohen-Katz out front in LM Open Pairs

Ken Cohen of Philadelphia and Richard Katz of North Versailles PA were in the lead after two qualifying sessions of the Bobby Nail Life Master Open Pairs. The event concludes today.

Cohen and Katz scored 1262.36 matchpoints (25 top) to sit slightly more than eight matchpoints ahead of a father-son partnership: Richard Pavlicek of Fort Lauderdale and Rich Pavlicek Jr. of Santa Clara CA.

In third place, more than 40 matchpoints behind, were Jeff Meckstroth of Tampa and Perry Johnson of Bloomfield Hills MI. Norman Beck and Bart Bramley of Dallas were close behind them in fourth.

Berkowitz-Glasson lead LM Women's


Two New Jersey players took a slim lead into the final two sessions of the Helen Sobel Smith Life Master Women's Pairs. Less than one matchpoint ahead after two qualifying sessions were Lisa Berkowitz of Old Tappan and Joann Glasson of Pennington.

With 1176.48 matchpoints (25 top), Berkowitz and Glasson were just ahead of Beverly Perry, New York City, and Tobi Sokolow of Austin TX, with 1175.50. In third place were Jacqui Mitchell and Lynne Tarnopol of New York City.

Canada-U.S. duo ahead in Non-LM Pairs

Two players from opposite ends of the continent combined to lead the Skinny Miles Non-Life Master Pairs after two qualifying sessions. The leaders with 63.13% with two rounds to go are Jadwiga Polujan of North Vancouver BC, playing with Bernie Weiss of New York City.

They were followed by Sylvere and Wilma Luquette of Van TX. About three percentage points behind them were Frank Pataky of Toronto and Williams Dawson of Peterborough ON.

First LM earns Gold Card-plus

Nalini Gubin came to Orlando in search of the masterpoints that would make her a Life Master. She earned the requisite points almost right away – and she got a bonus.

As the first Life Master reported to the Daily Bulletin, Gubin was awarded a 14K gold pendant from the Bridge Gold Group, now selling a variety of bridge jewelry at the ACBL Product Store.

The Bridge Gold Group has pendants, rings, pins and cufflinks for all ACBL ranks, including Mini-McKenney and Ace of Clubs winners.

Generic ACBL pendants, pins and rings are also available.

The Bridge Gold Group will award watches to the winning pair in the National 99er Pairs to be played on Friday.

Gubin, of Pelham AL (suburban Birmingham), earned her gold card in Bracket 3 of the Educational Foundation Knockout Teams. She was playing with Mike Donaldson of Birmingham, whom she describes as her mentor. Their teammates were Russell Stowers of Weidman MI and Lynne Logan of Diamondhead MS.

Gubin, a retired pathologist, has been playing since early 2001.

What do you think of new hand records?

You probably have noticed the new addition to the hand records you pick up after each session. You are probably wondering what it's about.

One of the greatest tools ever invented to analyze bridge hands is a software program known as Deep Finesse. Once a deal is entered into the program, you can find out what declarer lines work and what the best defense is.

All the deals in each set of hand records have gone through Deep Finesse. The program is very practical – it analyzes according to the cards as they are dealt, not according to what might have been. The contracts listed on the hand records are those that can be made with correct play against correct defense as the cards lie.

Want to see how it works? Go to www.deepfinesse.com and enter the deal you want to study. You can try all manner of play methods or defense methods, and Deep Finesse will let you know if you're on the right track.

High fives

It's often tough to know what to do when the bidding escalates quickly, and the judgment to do the right thing is what often separates the winners from the losers.

About half way through the first qualifying session of the Bobby Nail Life Master Open Pairs, Robert Levin and Steve Weinstein, one of ACBL's top pairs, were having a lackluster game. Then came a string of boards where the bidding ended at the five level. Their good judgment helped turn their game around. It started with board 15.


Levin did very well to bid on to 4♠. The best that North-South could do from that point was plus 100 for 4♠ doubled. North went on, however, suffering down one when Weinstein, after winning the sxA at trick one, switched accurately to the $\diamond 9$, assuring three tricks for the defense. Plus 100 was good for 23 out of 25 matchpoints for Levin and Weinstein. Minus 100 would have been worth 18.5 MP's.

There was more action on the next deal.


own, and indeed he took a long time before passing his partner's second double. As you can see, the five level is minus territory for East-West because of the diamond ruff South has coming. Plus 500 for 5♥ doubled was worth 16.5 MPs.

There were more high-level decisions to make on the next round.




Levin's hand isn't great, but the five-card spade suit – and an opponent who seemed to be trying to get away with something - might have tempted some players to bid instead of doubling. Turns out East-West can't legitimately make even 10 tricks. Levin and Weinstein could get 5♥ only one trick, but it was good for 19 matchpoints.

The next board produced the fourth straight five-level finish.




There was no way 5 ♦ was going down – and if West doesn't get a heart ruff, the contract would make with an overtrick. Of course, with an opener based entirely on a seven-card suit, Levin had no thoughts of sitting for the double – and he came within a hair of making his contract. He took the diamond opening lead in dummy, ruffed a heart high, pulled the outstanding trump with a low one to dummy, ruffed another heart high, ruffed his last diamond in dummy, ruffed another heart high and entered dummy with a low trump. Now he played the &J, and if North had been dealt a singleton matchpoints.



It's a grand slam, but only by North

The field played this deal in 6NT, and rightly so. But our opponents had a chance to play the highest scoring contract. They could have declared 7♥ from the North side.



North opened 2* and South responded 2NT, which showed hearts since 2♥ would have been a double negative. Anyone could take the diamond finesse and score all 13 tricks when the finesse succeeds.

However, the true expert doesn't take the finesse. He wins the trump lead and draws four rounds of trumps, pitching a diamond from dummy. East can afford to discard a diamond and a spade, but then he's caught. A spade lets declarer ruffs out the spade and then he goes to the *K to cash the 13th spade. A diamond is fatal immediately. A club discard allows declarer to cash four clubs for the spade-diamond ruffing squeeze.

Note that the contract must be played by North. With South as declarer, West can lead a diamond to set up East's king.

Did you note on your hand record that Deep Finesse says you can make 7♥ as North but only 6♥ as South?

After you bid game, you have to make it

Deep Finesse says you can make 10 tricks at notrump on this deal, but that's double dummy. Declarers in general had trouble to getting to game in the first place, then found it very difficult to find even nine tricks.

Tim Crank, a Junior playing with Frank Allison, got to game and made it for 22 out of a possible 25 matchpoints. Here's how he did it.

South a low heart to North's queen (!), and the heart return went to South's 10. He switched to the ♠2, and naturally Crank went up with dummy's king. He led a diamond and, based on the bidding, successfully finessed the 10. He got out with a heart to South's king, and South continued with a club. Crank took the king and cashed the A. Next he led a spade to South's queen. He switched to the ♣Q and Crank took dummy's ace.

Now he called the $\blacktriangle 10$, and that was the end. North had to keep three diamond to cover dummy's suit, and he also had to hold onto the ♥Q. Since he can keep only three cards, he had to give up.

Robert E. Callihan

Bob Callihan, who teamed with his wife, Pauline, to build Jourdan's into one of the most successful bridge clubs in North America, died in September. He was 77.

Callihan, a graduate of Northwestern University and Harvard Business School, worked in the manufacturing sector for many years. He served in World War II.

The Callihans bought Jourdan's in 1985. At one time they and nine other directors ran games during four morning, seven afternoon and five evening sessions. In a 1994 *Bridge Bulletin* article, Callihan offered these tips to fellow club owners: (1) familiarize new players with the mechanics before they try a real duplicate game and (2) make a real effort to find appropriate partners for singles.

During the Callihans' 10-year tenure at Jourdan's, the club was consistently among the top 10 clubs in North America in table count.

The Callihans sold Jourdan's in 1995 but remained regular club players. They were also bridge directors on cruises.

Thinking Bridge #2

The opening lead is the **A**K. You (South) are the declarer. Plan the play.

All Pass

West's opening bid of 4 normally describes a hand with a strong eight-card suit and fewer than 10 high-card points. It is a preemptive opening bid and it causes the opponents fits.

Do not make the mistake of opening with a three bid when you have an eight-card suit and a preemptive hand. Opening three of a suit when holding a reasonable eight-card suit puts you right back in kindergarten.

You (South) can do no less than bid 5 ♦ when 4 ♠ comes around to you. Be thankful you have a strong suit of your own. It is not always this easy to find the right trump suit after a 4 ♠ opening bid

On to the play. Before playing from dummy to the first trick, review the bidding to see if you garner any information. It never hurts to count your tricks. You should come up with 11: seven diamonds, two hearts and two black aces — just what the doctor ordered.

No so fast. West figures to have eight spades and that means East is void.

Translation: if you play the AA at trick one, that trick is not going into your pile. East is almost sure to ruff. So long, farewell, auf wiedersehen, good-bye to the AA.

If you duck the AK and duck again if West continues with the AQ, you can ruff the second

spade, draw trumps and eventually use the ♠A to discard a club.

You will wind up losing one spade and one club which is much better than having your A ruffed and losing two clubs to boot.

Points to remember:

- 1. An opening four bid usually shows an eightcard suit, possibly a seven-bagger with a side fourcard suit. In theory, it denies the strength of an opening one bid.
- 2. If one of your winners is sure to be ruffed and that winner can be used later to take a trick, be smart, play low and don't allow your winner to be ruffed. Partner will be impressed.

Glossary of bridge terms, Part 2

Rookie, masterpoints, stratified pairs — these terms may be confusing to new members of the American Contract Bridge League. Here's a list of terms and their meanings:

Masterpoints: the unit which measures bridge achievement in competition. Masterpoints are awarded at ACBL clubs and tournaments in amounts proportional to the size and classification of the event and the rating of the club or tournament.

•Black points: awarded at club games. Some special club games award red, gold or silver points.

•Silver Points: won at sectional tournaments, progressive sectionals and Sectional Tournaments at Clubs (StaCs).

•Red points: awarded for section placements at regional tournaments and NABCs. Also awarded at clubs for special events such as the qualifying rounds of the North American Open Pairs and the Grand National Teams.

•Gold points: awarded for section firsts and overall placing in regionally rated events that have no upper masterpoint restrictions.

•Platinum points: awarded for NABC+ events.

Gold points are also awarded for section tops and overall placing in regional events of two or more sessions that have a masterpoint limit of 750 or more points.

One gold point is awarded to section winners in the annual ACBL Instant Matchpoint Game in sections of seven or more tables. In addition, new players may now win gold points in their own NABC events: .50 gold in the National 49er Pairs at the Spring NABC, 1.50 gold in the National 199er Pairs at the Summer NABC and 1.00 gold in the National 99er Pairs at the Fall NABC (the remainder of the award is in red points).

A major source of gold points is the Bracketed Knockout Teams. The overall awards for the top brackets are all gold while the lower brackets may receive a percentage of gold points and the remainder in red points.

•Silver points: awarded for sectional firsts and overall placing at sectional tournaments. Also awarded at Sectional Tournaments at Clubs (StaC).

Barry Crane Top 500 race: This trophy is presented to the ACBL player who wins the most masterpoints during a calendar year. Originally the McKenney Trophy, it was put into play by William E. McKenney, ACBL executive secretary. It was known as the McKenney Trophy from 1937 to 1981.

The list was expanded to include the top 500 players in 1982 and called the Top 500 from 1982 to 1985. It was renamed the Barry Crane Top 500 in 1986. Crane, who was murdered in July 1985, was ACBL's top masterpoint holder at that time and was acknowledged by his peers to be unequaled as a masterpoint winner and a matchpoint player.

Mini-McKenney races: In 1974 the ACBL Board of Directors voted to recognize masterpoint achievements among player below the rank of Life Master. The Bridge Bulletin recognizes leaders ACBL-wide. At the unit level, winners in each category receive recognition and special medallions. All points won during a calendar year are counted in these races.

Ace of Clubs contests: This competition was created in 1984 to recognize achievement at the club level. Winners are recognized at the unit level as well as ACBL-wide.

Points won only at the club level — excluding the North American Open Pairs, the Grand National Teams and Sectional Tournaments at

Clubs — are counted in these races.

Masterpoint races: ACBL recognizes the players who win the most masterpoints in their categories during the calendar year. The categories include Life Master, Bronze LM, Silver LM, Gold LM, Diamond LM, Grand LM, Youth, Junior, Sectional (points won only at sectional tournaments during the year), Senior (55 years or older) and Richmond Trophy.

These are the various categories and the requirements for each category at the beginning of a calendar year:

Rookie: 0-5 masterpoints Junior Master: 5-20 points Club Master: 20-50 points

Sectional Master: At least 50 points, including 5

Regional Master: At least 100 points, including 15 silver plus 5 red or gold

NABC Master: At least 200 points, including 50 pigmented points of which 5 must be gold, 15 must be red or gold and 25 must be silver

Life Master: 300-500 points Bronze Life Master: 500-1000 points Silver Life Master: 1000-2500 points Gold Life Master: 2500-5000 points Diamond Life Master: 5000-10,000 points

Grand Life Master: 10,000 points and a North American Bridge Championship or its equivalent

Youth: age 19 and younger Junior: age 25 and younger

Sectional: points won only at sectional tournaments

Senior: 55+ years, points won only in Senior

Richmond Trophy: awarded to the Canadian player who wins the most points in a calendar year.

Linhart tries to put **BPT Bonus on ice**

The Orlando NABC is the site of the 21st BPT Prize Money event this year. The Open event begins at 1 p.m. today in the Grand Ballroom XIV. The Stratified and 299er events begin at 7:30 tonight in the same place.

Different individuals have won each of the prior 20 events with 350 in the competition. Jim Linhart currently leads the pack with 8900 bonus pool points, with three tournaments to go. Anyone in the top 50 could still win the title that has been won by Eddie Rose of Laguna Niguel CA in 2001, Chandler Flickinger of Portola Valley CA in 2002, and last year by Chris Compton of Dallas TX. With the title goes the first prize in the Bonus Pool of \$5,000.

Leading the Stratified Bonus Pool is Maxine Musick of Chicago Park CA. She leads more than 160 competitors in the division restricted to those who have won less than \$500 in BPT Prize Money Bridge. Volkert Veeder of Toms River, NJ has a small lead over Bill Cubley of San Leandro CA.

Jim Zinkand of Plymouth Meeting PA leads the 299er Bonus Pool, which has 157 competitors. Close behind are Bettyanne Houts of Long Beach CA and Mira Rowe of Valencia CA.

The BPT Prize Money Tour is a year-long national tour that had 23 tournaments across the country. To qualify to receive an award in the Bonus Pool, you must have competed in four tournaments and ended up in the top 32 of those qualified in your division.

BPT Prize Money Tour began as four events on the West Coast in 2001 and has expanded to its national structure. For next year, BPT plans to have more than 20 tournaments and a \$30,000 Bonus Pool.

Convention card reminder

Each player is required to have a convention card filled out legibly and on the table throughout a session. Both cards of a partnership must be identical and include the first and last names of each member of the partnership.

If a director determines that neither player has a substantially completed card, the partnership may play only the Standard American Yellow Card and may use only standard carding. This restriction may be lifted only at the beginning of a subsequent round after convention cards have been properly prepared and approved by the director. Further, the partnership will receive a 1/6 board matchpoint penalty for each board played, commencing with the next round and continuing until the restriction is lifted. In IMP team games, penalties shall be at the discretion of the director.

If the director determines the partnership has at least one substantially completed convention card but has not fully complied with ACBL regulations, the director may give warnings or assign such penalties as he deems to be appropriate under the circumstances.

The objective of these warnings and penalties is the encouragement of full compliance with ACBL regulations.

Pre-Alert forms

If your partnership plays special overcalls, you must fill out a pre-Alert/disclosure form and make it available to your opponents when you play in events that allow Mid-Chart and Super-Chart conventions.

This applies to NABC+, regional or higher knockouts and Flight A Swiss games. Look for the light blue forms on the table where convention cards are available.



Bridge Today Daily: Brushing up with Reese

It's been more than 10 years since I've played seriously at an NABC. This fall, however, I've started a partnership with Migry Zur-Campanile, Israel's star woman player, and we decided to make Orlando our first tournament. Before today, we played together only on the Internet, despite the fact I live in Jerusalem and she lives in Tel Aviv, only an hour or so away.

To get back into "bridge shape," I took out an old copy of Terence Reese's *Play These Hands With Me*. I've been reading it for the last few weeks and it's paid off already. Early in the session in Thursday evening's charity event, I used one of his themes successfully. It's really a wonderful feeling when that happens – putting into practice what you read in a good bridge book.

North **♠** 7 **♥** 10 4 2 **♦** 8 5 4 2 **♣** K 9 6 5 2 South **∧** A K 9 6 5 4 2 **♥** A 7 5 3 **♦** A ***** 3 West North East South Pass 1 🛦 1NT Pass Pass 2 All Pass

West led the \$J, East followed with the queen. From the 1NT overcall I knew that West had started with \$J 10 8 3. So I had two spade losers, two or three heart losers and the \$A. If the hearts were divided 4-2, I had to find a way to score that \$K\$ in dummy to throw one of my hearts. I won the first trick with the \$A\$ and, remembering one of Reese's lessons from the book on reducing your trumps in a situation where you might later endplay an opponent, I set out on this plan.

At trick two I cashed the \blacklozenge A, and at trick three I led my singleton club. West took the ace and, as I hoped, returned the \blacklozenge K for me to ruff. Then I led a low heart. West won the jack and played the \blacklozenge J, which I ruffed. I then cashed the \blacktriangledown A, West following with the king. This was the position from my view:

♥ 75

I knew West still held the \$10 8 3, and it looked as if he was out of hearts. So I led the \$5 and he won the trick with the 8. He played a fourth round of diamonds, and East followed with the queen. I ruffed, cashed the \$K\$ and played my last trump, the 9 (I was finally out of trumps). West won and had nothing to play but clubs, so I scored that \$K\$ for my eighth trick and was able to thank Migry for that useful card (and silently thank Terence for having been such a great bridge writer).

West almost beat me. He thought a long time when he won the AA at trick three. If he had switched to hearts, instead of playing diamonds, he would have had enough diamonds later to exit with and avoid the club lead at trick 12. But a heart switch was surely difficult to find.

Slow play is the curse of the game

Patty Johnson, Sebring FL, is a National Tournament Director and the Director-in-Charge for all District 9 (Florida) tournaments.

An old tournament director friend of mine, John "Spider" Harris, was famous for the saying: "Slow play is the curse of the game." Nothing is more frustrating for tournament directors than having to herd players along like cattle when slow play isn't actually the problem.

If you take a moment to think about it, most of your opponents do not take that long to bid or play a deal — yet before you know it, the round is being called and you are nowhere near finished with the last board.

Here are some suggestions which, if followed, would solve many of our problems.

First: do not post mortem between deals whether you are in a pair game or a Swiss team event. Finish the round and then discuss hands if there is still time. We, as directors, will not cut your time but I think you will find yourselves under less pressure by following this suggestion. Remember: we provide hand records in pair games so you don't have to worry about forgetting a particular holding.

Second: if you are on opening lead, make your lead before recording the contract in your private score. You will have plenty of time after leading to record the information and still see the entire first trick

Third: unless you have a legitimate reason to leave the table, such as the restroom or a smoke break, please remain at the table and visit with your opponents. You might actually find this enjoyable and a new way to make friends or future Swiss team partnerships.

I wish we could make these suggestions into rules enforceable by penalty but none of us wants a bridge event decided by the pair with the fewest penalties. All I can do as a director is to ask the cooperation and help of all players because I think not only you but everyone else will enjoy their tournaments more.

Remember: those who enjoy a tournament will continue to play. Do your part to make bridge enjoyable for yourself, your partner and your opponents — you can't play without them.

Hampson shoots for 2nd Herman Trophy

Geoff Hampson racked up 374.79 points to edge regular partner Eric Greco and take home last year's Herman Trophy, awarded to the ACBL member who earns the most masterpoints at the fall tournament.

Hampson and Greco won the Reisinger Board-a-Match Teams (with Malcolm Brachman, Mike Passell and Eddie Wold), were 13th in the Open Board-a-Match Teams (with the same teammates) and were second in the Blue Ribbon Pairs.

Norwegian expert Geir Helgemo holds the Herman Trophy record: 449.37 masterpoints won at the 1999 Fall NABC in Boston. Helgemo won two nationally rated events (the Open Board-a-Match Teams and the Reisinger Board-a-Match Teams, both with partner Tony Forrester and teammates Rita Shugart and Andrew Robson) and finished well in a third event (sixth in the Blue Ribbon Pairs with Richard Freeman).

With his performance, Helgemo broke the record set by Michael Rosenberg who won 445.77 points at the Fall NABC in San Francisco in 1996. Zia won 412.75 points at the same tournament and was second.

Jeff Meckstroth was the first player to score 400 or more points at an NABC, racking up 407.77 points at the 1995 Fall NABC in Atlanta. That record lasted only one year.

The Herman trophy was donated in 1951 by Sally Lipton, formerly Mrs. Lou Herman, in memory of Lou Herman (1908-1950), a Houston jeweler who was Life Master #218. Mrs. Lipton was a member of the ACBL office staff in New York and an ACBL tournament director.



When using bid boxes, ACBL suggests that players tap the Alert strip and say "Alert" at the same time. When making an announcement, use the announcement word — such as "transfer" — and tap the Alert strip at the same time.

A player who Alerts or announces a bid should make sure his opponents are aware that an Alert or announcement has been made.
