CONVENTION CARD REMINDER

- Each player is required to have a convention card filled out legibly and on the table throughout a session. Both cards of a partnership must be identical and include the first and last names of each member of the partnership. If a director determines that neither player has a substantially completed card, the partnership may play only the Standard American Yellow Card and may use only standard carding. This restriction may be lifted only at the beginning of a subsequent round after convention cards have been properly prepared and approved by the director. Further, the partnership will receive a 1/6-board matchpoint penalty for each board played, commencing with the next round and continuing until the restriction is lifted. In IMP team games, penalties shall be at the discretion of the director.
- If the director determines the partnership has at least one substantially completed convention card but has not fully complied with ACBL regulations, the director may give warnings or assign such penalties as he deems to be appropriate under the circumstances.
- The objective of these warnings and penalties is the encouragement of full compliance with ACBL regulations.



No calls, please — Cell phones, audible pagers or any similar communication equipment may not be operated or operable in the playing area during a session of play at NABCs except for health-related equipment or by permission of the director-in-charge of the tournament or event.

Parking — Players will receive a discounted parking rate of \$11 per day at the Adam's Mark Hotel. Hotel guest parking will include in-and-out privileges. Non-hotel guests will pay a maximum of \$11 each time they park. Stop by the Information Desk on the concourse level of the Plaza building to pick up a coupon for the discounted rate.



ENTRY FEES



Players must be ACBL members whose service fees or dues are current in order to compete in any of the following nationally ranked events: Nail Life Master Open Pairs, Smith Life Master Women's Pairs, Reisinger Board-a-Match Teams, Keohane North American Swiss Teams, Kaplan Blue Ribbon Pairs, Mitchell Open Board-a-Match Teams, Marsha May Sternberg Women's Board-a-Match Teams and the Senior Knockouts. The entry fees for these contests are \$16.50 per player per session.

Players must also be current ACBL members to play in the Mini-Blue Ribbon Pairs, Miles Non-Life Master Pairs or National 99er Pairs. The entry fee is \$15 per player per session.

Regional championships are \$14 per player per session for ACBL members, \$16 for non-members. All other events are \$13 per player per session for ACBL members, \$15 for non-members.

Notice to players who live outside North America

Participation in the Kaplan Blue Ribbon Pairs and the 0–5000 Mini-Blue Ribbon Pairs is limited to those

ACBL members who have earned a Blue Ribbon qualification (or for those members on the Lifetime Top 100 masterpoint list).

Participation in the Life Master Open and Women's Pairs is restricted to ACBL members who have achieved the rank of Life Master. Foreign players who do not meet these criteria, but feel they are otherwise eligible, must receive a waiver in writing prior to the commencement of these contests.

Previously granted Blue Ribbon waivers will not be honored. Previously granted Life Master waivers will be honored. Please contact ACBL Chief Tournament Director Rick Beye here at the tournament. He may be contacted through the Tournament Operations office and he will be available at the selling sites.

The starting times will be 9 a.m., 1 and 7:30 p.m. on most days. All IN events will be played in Plaza Ballroom F except for the 9 a.m. games which will be in Plaza Ballroom D.

Don't forget to pick up your free registration gift. The IN Partnership Desk will guarantee players a partner if they sign up one hour prior to game time.

Celebrity Bridge Speakers will give free mini-lessons at 12:15 p.m. and 6:45 p.m. all week (with the exception of the first Thursday afternoon and the final Sunday). Don't miss these free bridge lessons.

On Friday, November 18, there will be free Newcomer games (0–5 MPs) at 1 and 7:30 p.m.. On Saturday, November 19, at 10 a.m. Bridge Bulletin columnist Jerry Helms will give a free two-hour lesson entitled "Taking Your Tricks — The Art of Making Partner's Bids Look Good." Health Note: **High-Altitude Sickness**

Sometimes people get sick at high altitudes. This is called mountain sickness or high-altitude sickness.

This is caused by lack of oxygen. As altitude increases, the air becomes "thinner," which means less oxygen is in the atmosphere. You get less oxygen in your lungs with each breath, so the amount of

oxygen in your blood declines. All people can experience mountain sickness, but it may be more severe in people who have heart or lung problems.

Symptoms usually begin within 48 hours of arriving at high altitude. Symptoms include:

- headaches, breathlessness, fatigue
- nausea or vomiting
- inability to sleep
- swelling of the face, hands and feet

Most people adjust or "acclimatize" to the high altitude within a few days. Here are some tips:

- Avoid strenuous activity for the first day or two.
- Drink extra fluid.
- Be careful of drinking alcohol. Its effect is magnified at high altitude.
- Your doctor may prescribe medication to help prevent or treat altitude sickness.

Monitoring

At this and future North American Championships, ACBL will be monitoring NABC+ events with visible, real-time cameras. The images will be recorded and will be available for later official inspection and review.

By general monitoring of the session and participants' behavior, ACBL has another source of information that may be useful in determining facts and settling issues arising from some types of ethical and behavioral complaints or actions. Please summon a director if a problem occurs at the table. This procedure is intended to assure everyone that the playing field is level and that misbehavior will not be tolerated.
