# **Meet Your TDs**

This is part of a series of profiles of tournament directors working at the NABCs.

It's a good bet that two of the tournament directors working at the 2006 Fall NABC are unfamiliar to most ACBL members, but Chief TD Rick Beye is happy that the Japanese Contract Bridge League sent Atsushi Nakamura and Masato Suzuki to Hawaii.

"They have been incredibly helpful with our visitors from Japan," Beye said. "They have done a great job."

The two are full-time staffers at JCBL headquarters in Tokyo, and they have lots of directing experience. Suzuki has been a TD for 22 years, Nakamura for 15.

With some help from JCBL General Secretary Tadashi Yoshida as interpreter, the two said they have enjoyed working at their first big ACBL tournament.

Both players started playing bridge in college, but now they concentrate on running games rather than playing in them, although neither has given up play altogether.

"I found it more interesting to direct than to play," said Nakamura. "It's more fun, and I like to organize games."

# Fallenius leading in Player of Year race

Bjorn Fallenius has overtaken Bob Hamman for the lead in the Player of the Year race, which likely will be decided over the weekend.

With 200 platinum points available to the winners of the Reisinger Board-a-Match Teams and 160 for the winners of the North American Swiss Teams, the Player of the Year race is still up for grabs.

With three days to go in the NABC, Fallenius leads with 722 platinum points, followed by Hamman with 660.53. The rest of the unofficial top 10 are Jeff Meckstroth, 607.42; Eric Rodwell, 605.58; Paul Soloway 582.42; Michael Rosenberg, 549.20; Ralph Katz, 537.89; Zia Mahmood, 532.71; Bobby Levin, 507.94, and Fulvio Fantoni, 503.08.

# Italians strong in Blue Ribbon victory

Fulvio Fantoni and Claudio Nunes first made their mark on the international scene in 2002, winning the Open Pairs at the World Bridge Championships in Montreal.

They are now part of the powerful Italian team that captured the Bermuda Bowl last fall in Portugal.

On Thursday, they added another trophy to their case – the Blue Ribbon Pairs.

They took the lead after two sessions on Wednesday and put together two solid games in the final sessions to win by about a board (38 top). They scored 56.22% in the afternoon and 61.54% in the evening, leading at one point by more than 100 matchpoints.

Second place went to Jim Krekorian and Drew Casen, followed by Jeff Meckstroth and Eric Rodwell.

Fantoni and Nunes are longtime partners who live near Rome. They are not strangers to the NABCs, with multiple victories in the national Swiss Teams (and Fantoni played on a winning squad in the Mixed Board-a-Match Teams).

According to Fantoni, the secret to success in the Blue Ribbon was to forget about big major-suit fits and just bid 3NT. Twice in their first two

Each player must have an ACBL convention card filled out and on the table. Please note that other types of convention cards, such as the WBF convention card or homemade cards that do not sufficiently resemble the ACBL convention card, are not acceptable substitutes.

### Masterpoint disclaimer

Scores as reported in the Daily Bulletin are subject to change because of score changes or corrections.

The masterpoint awards as shown are, therefore, also subject to change.

# No calls, please

Cell phones, audible pagers or any similar communication equipment may not be operated or operable in the playing area during a session of play at NABCs except for health-related equipment or by permission of the director-in-charge of the tournament or event.

### Convention card reminder

Each player is required to have a convention card filled out legibly and on the table throughout a session. Both cards of a partnership must be identical and include the first and last names of each member of the partnership.

If a director determines that neither player has a substantially completed card, the partnership may play only the Standard American Yellow Card and may use only standard carding. This restriction may be lifted only at the beginning of a subsequent round after convention cards have been properly prepared and approved by the director. Further, the partnership will receive a 1/6 board matchpoint penalty for each board played, commencing with the next round and continuing until the restriction is lifted. In IMP team games, penalties shall be at the discretion of the director.

If the director determines the partnership has at least one substantially completed convention card but has not fully complied with ACBL regulations, the director may give warnings or assign such penalties as he deems to be appropriate under the circumstances.

The objective of these warnings and penalties is the encouragement of full compliance with ACBL regulations.



# JUST FOR NEW PLAYERS

# Interfering over 1NT

Overcalling after the opponents open a strong 1NT (15-17 or 16-18) is not like overcalling when they open in a suit on the one level. After a suit opening bid, you have several reasons for overcalling. It could be your hand; either side might have a partscore; you could interfere with the opponents' communications, or you might direct a good opening lead if you lose the auction.

So overcalls are both constructive and obstructive. But an overcall after your opponents open a strong 1NT is primarily obstructive. Most players use conventions such as Stayman and transfers to help them find a good spot after a 1NT opening bid. Your overcall can interfere with the opponents' use of these conventions. Because 1NT is at the top of the one level, any overcall you make must be at the two level or higher.

While an opening hand is suggested to overcall on the two level after a suit opening bid, you might overcall the opponents' 1NT opening with less. You do need a safety net, though, and that safety net is distribution – a good long suit or perhaps a two-suited hand. We seldom overcall a 1NT opening bid with a balanced hand even when it has strength.

**A**A2 ♥KQ875 ◆KJ4 **♣**J73

This hand has high-card strength, but it is too balanced to enter the auction. Pass.

**♦**62 **♥**K Q J 105 **♦**A K 4 **♣**A 7 3

In standard bidding, a double of 1NT is for penalty. This hand qualifies, but the reasons why are important. First, you have a great opening lead in the  $\Psi$ K, and you can count seven tricks on defense in your own hand. Note that you might have no play for  $2\Psi$  if partner is broke.

**♦**A **♥**AKQJ65 **♦**632 **♣**873

Again, you might not make 2♥, but you can defeat 1NT off the top. A penalty double shows either a strong hand with a good lead or a hand with a suit you expect to run to defeat 1NT. While some might prefer to overcall in hearts, I have had success in doubling with hands of this type.

 $\blacktriangle$ 6 ♥K Q 10 9 6 5  $\bigstar$ A 6 3  $\clubsuit$ 7 4 2. This is a good hand for an overcall of 2♥,

taking away the opponents' ability to transfer to spades.

**♦**QJ10954 ♥6 ♦QJ106 **♣**74

This hand doesn't have a lot of strength but it does have shape. A 2 • overcall can jam the opponents' bidding. A second suit makes your hand more powerful on offense. Many desirable overalls will be two-suited.

There are several conventions that allow you to enter the bidding and describe your distribution (Landy, DONT, Cappelletti, Brozel, etc). Your partnership can agree to investigate these and choose the convention that feels most comfortable or is most popular in your area.

The above discussion pertains to strong 1NT

opening bids. If your opponents use a weak 1NT opening (typically 12-14), your overcalls should be more constructive because there is a greater chance that your side has the balance of the strength.

You can choose your style for competing over a 1NT opening bid but you cannot stop the opponents from entering the auction after your 1NT opening bid. Your partnership must have agreements on how to continue the auction after the opponents interfere. A popular solution is to use a convention called lebensohl. When you are ready to add more conventions, I suggest that you investigate lebensohl.

In the mean time, I suggest a relatively simple set of agreements to cope with interference over your 1NT opening bid. These agreements are easily expanded into the use of lebensohl later.

- (1) Double is penalty. With the junk some players have when they overcall, you can collect a big penalty even at a low level. If you are considering bidding 2NT, it's probably better to double.
  - (2) Transfers are off.
- (3) Bids at the two level are competitive and to play (not invitational).

(4) Bids at the three level are game-forcing and show at least a five-card suit.

(5) Cuebid the suit bid by the opponents as Stayman. Because you are at a high level, you are essentially forcing to game. One exception many players use over a conventional 2. overcall is to use double as Stayman.


One of the reasons that interfering over a 1NT opening succeeds so often is that partnerships have not discussed their agreements on how responder bids after interference. Don't let that be you. Talk to your partner!





# Thinking bridge By Eddie Kantar



Opening lead: AA

**Bidding commentary:** South has a promising hand for a balancing 2♥ bid and has no trouble bidding game after North invites.

**Defensive commentary:** East signals encouragement in spades, and West continues with the **A**K and a spade to East's queen. East exits with the **A**Q.

Play commentary: South counts 20 high-

card points between his hand and dummy, leaving the opponents with 20. Furthermore, South knows that West has 15-17 HCP. East has

already turned up with the ♠Q and presumably the ♣Q J. That's 5 HCP. Therefore, West must have the ♥K and the ♠Q. After the heart finesse wins and trumps are removed, South has to broach diamonds knowing West has the queen. If the queen is doubleton, playing the ace-king will work.

But West has turned up with a doubleton heart and is unlikely to have two doubletons and open 1NT. What declarer must do is play East for the • 10 and take a backwards finesse!

South leads the ◆J. Assuming West covers, dummy's ace wins and a diamond is led to the 9.

### Take care

The field played 2♥ by South on this deal from the Mitchell Open Board-a-Match Teams (hands rotated).

Normal defense is to cash two diamonds and shift to a club. East wins the ace and returns the suit. At one table, declarer won the K, cashed the Kand led a heart to the ace after West showed out. Now what? In practice, declarer cashed the top three spades, pitching a club. My partner ruffed and led the ♥Q, then a club, letting declarer ruff in dummy. Now, although he could ruff a spade, he had no entry to the established spade trick. His only chance was that the ♦Q would fall. No luck.

The winning play is simple if mildly counterintuitive. When the ♥8 appears from West on the play of the king, a 4-1 split must be a possibility, so take the A and K and ruff a spade before playing the ♥A. If East overruffs, declarer has trump control. If East does not overruff, declarer gets to ruff two plain cards in hand and makes at least eight tricks.

**The Facts:** There was an agreed-to unmistakable break in tempo (BIT) by North when North doubled. The North-South pair admitted to a duration of approximately 20 seconds. The estimate of the duration by the East-West pair was slightly longer.

The Ruling: The BIT suggested doubt and demonstrably suggested bidding if South could not provide the normal complement of defense. Pass was considered to be a less successful logical

alternative. In accordance with laws 16A and 12C2, the director adjusted the result to 5♠ doubled by West making five, North-South minus 850.

**The Appeal:** North-South, the only pair to attend the hearing, contended that South's bid was clear, that there was no logical alternative and that, therefore, there should be no adjustment to the table result. South testified that she intended to push East-West to the five-level but that she did not want to push them to the six-level. She also said that she had planned on bidding  $6 \heartsuit$ , if her partner doubled  $5 \spadesuit$ .

The Decision: The committee thought that South's 6♥ bid must be considered in the light of the fact that South did not bid 6♥ over 5♠. South had told the committee that the reason that she did not bid 6♥ immediately over the 5♠ bid was that she was afraid that East-West might bid and be able to make 6. The committee, however, thought that a person who passed 5♠ would be unlikely to bid 6♥ when her partner (who hadn't passed during the auction yet) doubled to say that he thought 5♠ could be beaten. Since some statistically significant number of players who had passed over 5♠ would also pass the double of  $5 \spadesuit$ , the committee ruled that pass was a logical alternative to bidding 6♥. With pass being a logical alternative to the bid of 6♥ which was demonstrably suggested by the BIT, the committee decided that adjusting the board to 5. doubled and making, minus 850 North-South, was appropriate.

The committee discussed at length the issue of whether the appeal had substantial merit. There was strong reasoning supporting the conclusion that the appeal did not have substantial merit. However, the fact that one committee member maintained that there was no logical alternative to bidding 6♥ weighed heavily on this committee. The majority of the committee decided that the appeal had substantial merit based largely on that one member's belief that the committee was deciding wrongly on the primary issue before it. Accordingly, by majority vote the committee decided to find that the appeal did have substantial merit.

# The play's the thing

There were two interesting play problems on this deal from the second final session of the Mitchell Open Board-a-Match Teams.

Dlr: South **∧** K 4 Vul: E-W **♥** 9852 ♦ A 9 6 2 ♣ J 7 6 **♠** AQJ97 **▲** 10 8 3 2 **♥** J 10 6 ♦ J ◆ Q 10 7 5 ♣ K 9 5 3 2 **4** 10 8 **♠** 65 **♥** A Q 7 4 ♦ K 8 4 3 ♣ A Q 4


First, as South, imagine you are defending 3. by West after partner has shown four hearts. The lead of the  $\checkmark$ 5 goes to your ace. What should you do

At the table, South returned a trump: not good enough, for a strange reason. Declarer played low and won the trump return in dummy to play on clubs, making nine tricks without breaking a sweat when the A was onside.

Note that on a passive heart return at trick two, declarer wins in hand and does not know which black-suit finesse to play for. He can lead clubs or spades out of his hand, and some of the time he will guess wrong.

At another table, by contrast, Henry Bethe declared 3♦ as South. West, who had shown the black suits, led the ♦J. Bethe guessed wrongly to run the diamond lead to his hand, then led a spade up. West won the ♠A and returned a spade. In dummy, Bethe passed the ♥9 to the king. Back came a heart, and now South played a sneaky low club from hand, ducked to dummy's jack.

That was all the help he needed: with a complete count of the West hand, Bethe now cashed the A and Q to reach this ending:



A club play does not work. West wins the king and exits with a club, letting East ruff high and get out with a spade for down one.

Bethe, however, played a heart. East ruffed and got out with a high diamond, but Bethe took it in dummy and returned a diamond. East won but had to give a ruff-sluff, and Bethe's club loser vanished.

# European tournament open again in 2007

Until 2003, the European Bridge Championships were open only to Europeans. Three years ago, that changed. Now, in oddnumbered years, the tournament is open to all comers, making it more like the NABCs.

The 3rd Open European Bridge Championships is scheduled for June 15-30 in Antalya, Turkey, and will feature Mixed Teams, Mixed Pairs; Open, Women's and Senior Teams, and Open, Women's and Senior Pairs. All events are transnational (pairs and teams can be made of players from any combination of countries) and there will be cash prizes for overall finishers.

European Bridge League President Gianarrigo Rona visited Hawaii to invite ACBL players to play in Antalya.

The venue for the 2007 championships will be the World of Wonders Resort, Kremlin Palace Hotel in Antalya.

For those concerned about security in Turkey, Rona said, the tournament venue will be open only to registered players.

Antalya is on the Mediterranean coast of Turkey. Rona said the weather there is usually very pleasant. All playing facilities are air conditioned.

Players are encouraged to book their trips to Antalya through Bentour International (www.bentourevents.com). The EBL has negotiated an all-inclusive package for tournament participants that features (at no extra charge) breakfast, lunch and dinner buffets, a la carte restaurants, all beverages 24 hours a day, mini-bar in each room, fitness center, group tennis lessons and many other services.

I led the  $\clubsuit 8$ , Andy won the queen and returned the  $\spadesuit K$ . That was not what I wanted, and the one who knows . . . I overtook the  $\spadesuit K$  and with the ace and continued with my other spade.

Partner won the  $\bigstar K$  then cashed the  $\bigstar A$  and continued with the  $\bigstar A$ . Partner is unlikely to go wrong here, but . . .the one who knows . . .I ruffed partner's  $\bigstar A$  (I've always wanted to do that!) and played the  $\bigstar K$  and  $\bigstar Q$ , ruffed.

At that point, declarer had to decide whether to try to drop the  $\forall K$  or ruff a spade to dummy for a heart finesse. He laid down the  $\forall A$  – seven down and an absolute top for us.

# The Chicken Squeeze By Peg Kaplan

In preparation for the NABC, one of my partners tutored me on squeezes. Double squeezes, compound squeezes ... but – in the first semi-final session of the Blue Ribbon Pairs, a Chicken Squeeze arose.

After a 1NT - 3NT auction, my left-hand opponent led the  $\checkmark 3$ , fourth best.

- RHO played the jack of hearts. I won, and

returned my \$\infty\$10, which won the trick.

The seemingly "natural" play is to now lead a diamond to the jack. If it loses, however, a spade might come back. With the wrong guess, my current 11 tricks might turn into 10.

So instead, I trundled over to dummy with a club and led the \$\int J\$. When East didn't cover, I ran it.

It won.

I cashed my  $\forall$ A, pitching a spade, and then ran the clubs.

The Chicken Squeeze was in; RHO held: ♠A Q 9 7 3 ♥J 7 6 2 ♦ Q 8 5 2 ♣ —

Slow play, as opposed to careful or thoughtful play, is discourteous to your opponents — and to all other competitors as well. Players and pairs who take more than their allotted time are subject to penalty.

In general, pairs who are rarely late will be warned while pairs who are habitually tardy and/or pay no attention to time limits will be penalized.

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# You cannot relax at matchpoints

By Gary Blaiss

Even when an opponent's system puts your side in jeopardy, you may be able to overcome their advantage with heads-up play. So, having played well (enough) on the first two days, on board one of the first final in the Blue Ribbon Pairs you hear an auction of:

West	North	East	South

- (1) Strong.
- (2) No five-card suit, either 4-3-3-3 or 4-4-3-2.
  - (3) 16-19 HCP.

Your partner leads the  $\displayskip 6$  – fourth best or top of or middle from nothing. Dummy and your hand are:

J84

Do you have your plays planned?

Declarer wins your  $\diamond 8$  with the  $\diamond J$ . Declarer pays the  $\diamond 4$  to dummy's ace as partner follows with the 6 and you with a Smith  $\diamond 5$  (indicating that you were not overly enthused with partner's lead.

Declarer now leads the ♥J from dummy and you play the 2.Too late now. Declarer will now make 11 tricks. That's one more trick than those who played 3NT from the North hand. You should realize that partner led a diamond because he had no four-card major – unless he had five diamonds. If he led from length in diamonds he still has an outside king or queen. If your side has two winners outside the diamond suit, it is of vital importance that you win yours first.

Therefore, you should have disregarded the second hand low rule to jump up with the heart ace to get your side's par. Matchpoints is not a relaxing game! However, this situation is another recurring theme for which you should be on the alert. In this case it gets you back to even (if declarer doesn't guess to squeeze your partner out of the  $\Psi$ Q) – in others it may be the difference between the contract making or going set.




My teammates, Sue Picus and Renee Mancuso, know how to save a bad result. Look at what happened on this deal from the first qualifying session of the Mitchell Open Board-a-Match Teams.



We defended 5♥ after East opened 1♠. The lead of the ♣A was not a success and we were minus 480. At the other table:

Sue, West, led a club for the ruff, and Renee underled her ♥A for a second ruff, so the ♦A meant plus 500 and a win on board – never in doubt!



There is nothing more enjoyable than pulling the wool over the eyes of a regular opponent and adversary. On the above deal, we sat North-South and led a heart against 2NT, reached after a reversing auction. I led a low heart as North, and Alex Ornstein won the jack to shift to a spade. When declarer led a club to the queen and a club back, we could arrange six tricks and might have had seven.


Sue Picus played 3NT as West against a pair of New York experts. North started with the ◆9. Sue won the ◆J, led a club to the queen, followed by the ◆8 to the 10 and queen, then a club to the 8 (!). She cashed two more diamonds, then took her top spades and played a third round to South, who could cash two spades but had to concede a trick to dummy's ◆K at the end. Nine tricks made!

# A little technique


A good friend of mine tells me that playing bridge is all about drawing trumps, taking finesses and cashing winners.

Yes, but once in a while some excellent technique in a grand slam wouldn't hurt, as on this deal (rotated).



On the lead of the ♥J, do you fancy declarer or the defense?

At the table, declarer won the  $\forall K$  and ran the clubs. With one club to go, this was the position:



Declarer cashed dummy's last club, pitching a heart as East discarded another spade and West a heart.


Now declarer missed the winning play—cash the ♥A to pitch a spade from hand. West must unguard the diamonds to keep the spades, and the ♠A followed by the ♠K finishes East – he is squeezed in the red suits.

There is a winning defense. On the run of the clubs, East pitches all the diamonds to leave West guarding the suit. West discards hearts, leaving East in charge of that suit.

In the six-card ending, West keeps three to the queen in spades and diamonds and East all his spades and the heart guard. The best declarer can do is cash the  $\forall$ A and pitch a spade, but West also pitches a spade and there is no pressure.

# A little help from my friends

This deal from the semifinal of the Senior KO helped the Freed team advance to the final. South was Fred Hamilton and North was Arnold Fisher.



All Pass

West led the  $\diamond 2$  to East's ace. East shifted to the  $\diamond Q$ , won by declarer's ace. South advanced the  $\diamond J$ , covered by the king and won in dummy. Declarer cashed the  $\diamond Q$  discarding the  $\diamond 10$  and led the  $\diamond 8$  to the 10 and South's king.

Declarer next cashed the ♠K and led the ♣3. West discarded a heart as East won with the ♣J. East returned a diamond, allowing declarer to shorten his trumps. South led his good ♣7. According to Deep Finesse, West can play any card in his hand except the ♠5 and set the contract – even the ♠A! In fact, West ruffed with his low trump and dummy overruffed.

West returned a heart, which declarer ruffed. He then led a low spade to West's now-blank ace and claimed the last two tricks with his K—10 of spades.









# Nickell tries for three in a row in Reisinger

The squad of Nick Nickell, Richard Freeman, Bob Hamman, Paul Soloway, Jeff Meckstroth and Eric Rodwell were the winners of the 2004 and 2005 Reisinger Board-a-Match Teams, the premier team contest at the Fall NABC. If they win in 2006, it will be their second three-peat in the Reisinger. The team won in 1993, 1994 and 1995, but with one difference in their lineup: Bobby Wolff was playing on the squad then, while Paul Soloway is playing on it now

#### The Reisinger

The event is contested for the Reisinger Trophy (the Chicago Trophy until 1965). It is a six-session open team-of-four event scored by board-a-match with two qualifying sessions, two semifinal sessions and two final sessions. It was contested as a four-session championship until 1966.

The event began in 1929 as the North American Open Team Championship and the prize was the Chicago Trophy, donated by the Auction Bridge Club of Chicago. (In 1928, the open team competition was for the Harold S. Vanderbilt Cup.)

The Chicago Trophy was replaced in 1965 by the Reisinger Memorial Trophy, donated by the Greater New York Bridge Association in memory of Curt H. Reisinger.

Reisinger (1891-1964), New York City, was a principal patron of contract bridge and the American Contract Bridge League in the early years of both.

Reisinger was a great-grandson of Anheuser and a grandson of Busch, co-founders of the brewery from which he inherited great wealth. That wealth enabled him to become a stalwart financial supporter of the game, as well as a noted philanthropist on a far larger scale.

In the years when there was often a struggle to meet the League's modest payroll, Reisinger was often called upon and never failed to help with a loan or an outright gift. His support made possible several early contract bridge tournaments, clubs and books.

Among the positions in which he served were director of the United States Bridge Association, president of the Greater New York Bridge Association and chairman of the ACBL. In 1953, Reisinger was named ACBL Honorary Member.

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
### Overcoming a bad break

Joe Houde of St. Augustine FL found trumps splitting 5-0 against his 4♥ contract, but he found a neat endplay to overcome the bad break (hands rotated). This deal was from the first session of the Mini-Blue Ribbon Pairs, an event he won playing with Divakar Bhargava.

West led the ♣Q, which declarer won with his ace. He led a spade to the queen and then cashed the ♠A, discarding a club. The ♠2 was ruffed and a heart was led to the king. When West showed out, declarer could see that he couldn't draw trumps, so he led another spade from dummy and ruffed it as East discarded a diamond. Declarer next led the ♥A and another to dummy's queen.

Declarer had taken the first eight tricks and this was the position:



Houde now led the good spade from dummy. West ruffed this, but was endplayed and had to lead a diamond, which declarer let run to the dummy's queen. Making 4♥ was worth 23 matchpoints out of 25.

After West chose to open a weak INT, Bhargava doubled, showing values. East scrambled to 24, and Joe Houde bid 3NT. With his long diamond suit, he judged that his side could make a vulnerable game, but could not defeat the opponents enough if his side defended.



John Klayman and Lawrence and Lau were second in the Mini-Blue Ribbon Pairs. West led his ♥4 and Houde put up dummy's queen. When that held, he had nine tricks – one heart, six diamonds and two spade tricks. Making 3NT was good for 51 matchpoints on a 51 top.

Players will be vying for the Keohane Trophy, donated by Ethel Keohane in 1973 in memory of her husband, William H. Keohane, one of the leading New England bridge personalities.

Bill Keohane (1896-1972) was a consulting engineer, bridge teacher and bridge administrator. He served as chairman of the 1970 Summer NABC in Boston and, for many years, was chairman of the New England Individual Championship.

Keohane was elected in 1972 to a one-year term as the first District Director of the newly created District 25 (New England). He died later that year, just before he was to attend his first Board meeting.

The Keohane Trophy was presented for the Open Individual Championship until it was redesignated in 1995 by the ACBL Board of Directors for the North American Swiss Teams.

East-West are entitled to one spade trick, but when declarer misguessed trumps in the end position, East scored his **A**K and declarer was set five tricks. Plus 1100 was good for 51 matchpoints on a 51 top.

West leads the ◆K. You win with the ace, play a trump, win the club return eliminate diamonds while drawing trumps, then exit with a club and claim.

That's what all the experts did . . . not JoAnna Stansby.

In  $4 \triangleq$  as South, she ducked the opening lead of the  $\bigstar$ K, hoping that West would assume she could not have a singleton diamond. Assume West had the  $\blacktriangle$ A. Might he not continue with a diamond, trying to give partner a ruff or kill the discard?

So it proved. After a diamond continuation, JoAnna got both clubs away and guessed hearts to take 11 tricks for a spectacular result.

Of course, on a club switch, she would have turned a 100% contract into one hinging on the heart guess, but you can't make an omelet without breaking the odd egg or two.

# NAP/GNT conditions of contest

The North American Pairs and Grand National Teams were created initially with the expectation that players would play in and represent the districts in which they lived. They were to be "grass roots" events.

Over the past several years, implementation of this original intent has become increasingly difficult. This is especially true in the top flight of the GNT as expert partnerships are established over increasingly large geographical distances.

Partnerships in all flights were also affected mostly where districts abut one another.

In an effort to restore the integrity of the original intent to these two great events, the ACBL Board of Directors, after lengthy and extended deliberations over two years, has approved for implementation the following measures:

Effective July 1, 2006 for the GNT 2006/2007 event.

Effective April 1, 2007 for the NAP 2007/2008 event.

**GNT:** A member's principal physical residence as of Sept. 1 of the year prior to the National Final shall establish the district in which said member is eligible to participate beyond the club qualifying stage, if any.

**NAP:** A member's principal residence as of June 1 of the year prior to the National Final shall establish the district in which the member is eligible to participate beyond the club level, if any.

In order to ensure that each participant at the unit or district level understands that a participant is affirming his or her eligibility, entry forms for unit and district finals should include the following statement: "By entering this event, I hereby certify, subject to penalties provided in the Conditions of Contest for the event and the ACBL Code of Disciplinary Regulations, that I am eligible to play in this event in this district."

It is expected that there will be virtually no exceptions to the residence requirements for participants in this event. A player seeking an exception must obtain permission in writing from the ACBL District Director representing the district in which the member has a principal residence and from the ACBL District Director representing the district in which the member wishes to play.

Both District Directors must approve the request for the exception to be granted. The player must begin this process by April 1 of the year prior to the National Final for the NAP and by July 1 of the year prior to the National Final for the GNT.

An ACBL Credentials Committee (CC), composed of ACBL Board members, has been established to clarify in which district a player is allowed to participate when said player's eligibility is in question. When a challenge to one's eligibility from a unit final stage or later stage has been made, the CC may request documentary evidence from the member whose eligibility is in question. If a member is unable to verify to the CC's satisfaction that he or she is playing in the district of principal residence, the CC shall automatically disqualify the member and his or her partner and teammates (if the event is the GNT).

When a member is disqualified by the CC, the CC may refer the matter to the ACBL President. Upon such referral, the ACBL President may make charges to the ACBL Disciplinary Committee in accordance with section 2.2.3 (d) of the ACBL Code of Disciplinary Regulations.

The ACBL recognizes that implementation of these measures may inconvenience some members who were granted exceptions for previous events. The general consensus, however, is that implementation and strict interpretation of these measures is necessary to restore the initial intention ("grass roots") and, therefore, integrity of application of the conditions of these events.
