Defenses to 1NT

A group of expert players was recently polled on their favorite methods of combating 1NT openings. The Daily Bulletin will feature the preferred defense against 1NT of a different expert each day of the NABC.



(Players should note that several of the systems described in this series use Mid-Chart conventions and are not permitted in events that are restricted to the General Convention Chart. Players should check the director-in-charge for details.)

Today's expert: Bart Bramley

If Bart Bramley comes to your table and says, "We play SCUM," you shouldn't take it personally: It's the name of the convention he uses to compete against 1NT. The many-time NABC champ has been using a variation of this treatment since 1970.

SCUM is an acronym: The S stands for shape, the C stands for color and the M is for majors. ("The 'u' doesn't stand for anything. It just makes it pronounceable," said a deadpan Bramley.) The three letters of the acronym correspond to the first three steps of the method:

| 2NT = | minors |

In the case of double or 2♣, advancer's continuations are pass-or-correct.

Bramley uses this method against strong 1NT openings, but his definition of "strong" is any notrump range that would usually contain enough defensive strength to beat a game. "Against what I call 'constructive' 1NT openings, typically 12 high-card points or more, I use SCUM. Against 'destructive' or 'non-constructive' 1NT, which is anything that incorporates a bad 11 HCP or worse, I use a penalty double," he said.

The strengths of the approach appeal to Bramley. "I've had a lot of good luck with this. The ambiguities of the system (double and 2♣) are coupled. Once you know one suit, you know the other. Other systems don't have this. For example, in DONT 2♣ is clubs and a higher suit, or in Cappelletti, 2♥ is hearts and a minor. There's no connection between the lower-ranking suit and the higher one in those systems."

Bramley was candid about his competitive style versus 1NT openings. "I hate defending 1NT. I compete on some hands that would make many people blanch. My style is hyper-aggressive; I'll come in on 4-4 hands, especially if I don't like my lead position. If my hand contains a lot of tenaces that make it unattractive to lead from (against a 1NT opening), I'll trade my lead problem for a declaring problem."

The weaknesses of SCUM, according to Bramley are two-fold. "Hands with a long minor-suit have to come in at the three level. More serious, however, is that if you compete and they end up declaring, they'll do so double-dummy because this method pinpoints your suits."

Play begins in Vanderbilt KO

Eighty-two teams entered the 2007 Vanderbilt Knockout Teams. In order to bring the number of teams down to 64 for today's head-to-head matches, the conditions of contest specified that the top 12 seeded teams receive a bye and the 13th seed play a head-to-head match with the lowest-seeded team. The remaining 68 teams were grouped into 17 groups of four. These four-way matches each yielded three survivors.

The top 12 seeds, the winner of the #13 vs. #82 match-up, and the 51 survivors of the four-way matches gave 64 teams for round two.

Cohen, Satten lead Silver Ribbon Pairs

Ken Cohen of Philadelphia and Neal Satten of Wynnewood PA lead the Leventritt Silver Ribbon Pairs by a razor-thin margin. Cohen and Satten had a 65.77% game in the afternoon and followed that with 56.6% in the evening. Their total score was 795.5 (on a 25 top).

In second place is Sharon Hait, from Livingston NJ, and Lester Sokolower from Verona NJ. Their total was 795. The third place pair was Ed Schulte and Joe Godefrin with 788.

Sixty-five tables are in play for the final two sessions today. Slightly more than half qualified from the original field of 128 tables.

Youngsters excited by first NABC

Youths from middle schools in Carlinville IL and Mt. Pleasant IA made the trip to St. Louis to play Saturday.

"They are excited," said Zip Mettenberg, one of the organizers for the Mt. Pleasant group. "It's rewarding to see the kids' interest and the support of the parents and the school."

Both groups have active school bridge teaching programs. Mt. Pleasant began theirs last year after seeing an article in USA Today in which Bill Gates and Warren Buffett made a grant to promote bridge in schools.

"(Local player) Irene Norris brought the article to the club," said Mettenberg, "The club contacted a middle school teacher, Rosemary Peck, and things just snowballed."

At first, classes and play were offered two days a week during lunch hour. That escalated to bridge as an enrichment program offered twice a week as a regular class with 20 students in each.

The classes typically have a 10- or 15-minute lesson and then the play of prearranged deals that reinforce the point of the lesson.

The local bridge club in Mt. Pleasant provides the bridge teachers and teacher aides. The aides, volunteers from the local club, are necessary to answer questions and give help to the students. They used the Kitty Cooper lesson book, and ACBL provided playing cards and tee-shirts to students who graduated, along with trophies.

Their club traveled to Omaha NE last August and met Bill Gates and Warren Buffett.

"I got them to autograph my 'Bridge is Cool' tee-shirt," said seventh-grader Jessica Tone. When asked how she got started in the bridge classes, she said, "They announced they were having classes, so I went, and I liked them. It's fun trying to remember all the stuff (the bidding and the cards that have been played)."

"It's been a wonderful way to bring the community into our school," said teacher Peck. "After we returned from Omaha, we were front-page news. Our students did very well there taking five out of the top six spots."

Peck was asked about the appeal of bridge to

All my own fault!

Keith Garber gave me a deal where he had missed a sure way to set a partscore, and he had suffered the ultimate indignity of being squeezed at trick five. Garber was playing with Ruth Stover against Patty Cayne and Jacqui Mitchell.

Mitchell's weak jump response might not meet with the approval of the purists, but it got the job done.

When dummy came down on the ♣K lead, Garber decided to play for spade ruffs by shifting to the ♠10. A heart shift would work better. Declarer put up the ♠K and Stover cashed her three spade tricks, as Garber let go of a club. Now she exited with the ♠9 – a winner which squeezed Garber. (A heart shift would still have done the trick.)

If he ruffed, declarer could overruff, draw trumps and crossruff. If he threw a diamond, the suit would ruff out, and a second club would let that suit ruff out.

The weak two-bid

In my college days at the University of Illinois, if a degree in bridge had been offered I would have graduated with one.

Unfortunately, I had to settle for one in chemistry. Back then, we all played strong two openers with only the three level for pre-emptive bids with seven-card suits. We played for hours eagerly waiting for that strong two-bid to come along. That's why I never got to bed before 2 a.m.

One day, a new arrival to our bridge game introduced us to the weak two-bid. Things were never the same. Six-card suits with 6-10 high-card points came up all the time. Now I could get to bed earlier.

Of course, we always need rules for any bid, so here are a few you might consider for the weak two-bid.

1. An opening bid of 2♦, 2♥ or 2♠ shows a six-card suit headed by two of the top three or three of the top five honors and 6-10 HCP. Don't count for length in the six-card suit, it's already accounted for. With 11 HCP, the hand is too good a hand for a weak two-bid, so consider opening at the one level.

2. You should not have a good four-card major on the side. With
 ♠A K Q 8 6 2 ♥7 4 3 2 ♦4 ♣8 3,
 open the bidding with 2♠. With
 ♠Q 8 7 6 4 3 ♥A Q 8 7 ♦4 ♣8 3,
 Pass will work better.

3. You should not have a five-card suit on the side. The weak two-bid can also be used as an overcall as long as it is a jump bid. Examples:

West	North	East	South
		1♦	2♥

A non-jump two-level overcall is not weak, as in this case:

West	North	East	South
		1♠	2♥

That simply shows a good hand with a good heart suit (if you are vulnerable, that overcall should deliver a pretty strong hand).

Well, now that partner has opened a weak two-bid, what do we do? Here are some options:

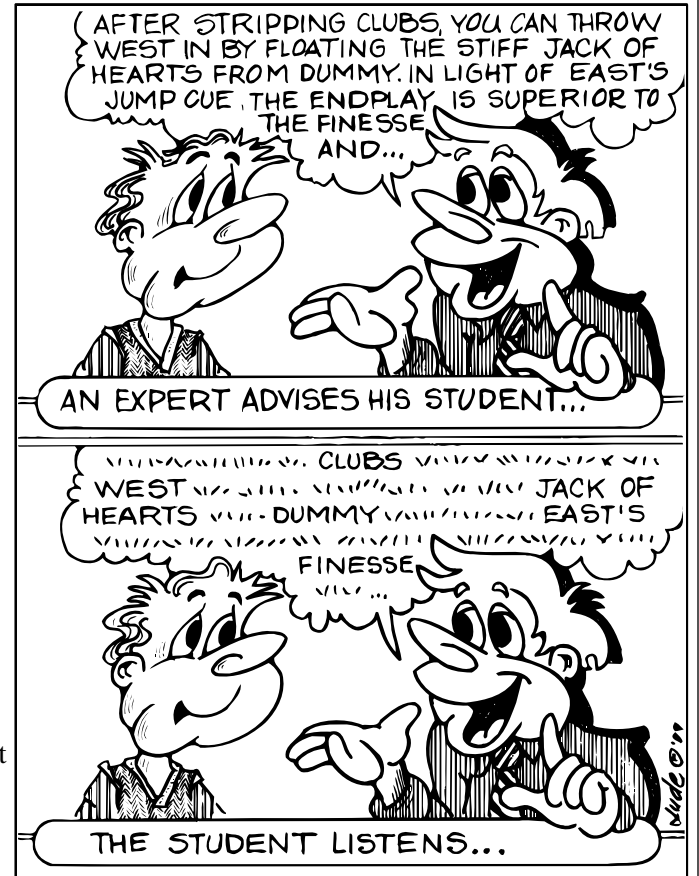
1. Raise partner to the three or four level. If you have a fit for partner's long suit but not a lot of strength, raising partner simply continues the preempt. You want to make it more difficult for the opponents to enter the auction and/or exchange information. A raise of partner is definitely not forcing (a forcing bid is one partner cannot pass). There is a spot on your convention card where you can insert the letters RONE, meaning Raise Only Non-Force. That means that if you do anything other than raise partner's suit, he must take another bid (assuming the next hand passes).

2. Bid your own suit. This is forcing to partner and shows a powerful hand and a good suit of your own. Just an opener is not good enough to change suits. Don't attempt to rescue partner at your first turn to bid if you are very short in his suit. You will only dig the hole deeper.

3. Bid game. If partner has opened a weak 2♥ or 2♠, use the Rule of 17 to determine if you have enough for game. Add your HCP to your trump holding. If it adds up to 17, bid game. For example, say you hold

♠A J 3 ♥A 10 7 6 3 ♦K Q 4 ♣8 3,
 and partner opens 2♠. You have 14 HCP and three spades. That adds up to 17. Bid 4♠.

4. Bid 2NT. This asks partner to further describe his hand. Many players show an outside

ace or king (known as a "feature") when at the top of the point range. Otherwise, opener simply repeats his suit.

My favorite convention to use with weak two-bid is called Ogust (invented by Harold Ogust). It allows more flexibility for the weak two opener. These are the responses to 2NT:

- 3♣ = Bad hand, bad suit.
- 3♦ = Bad hand, good suit.
- 3♥ = Good hand, bad suit.
- 3♠ = Good hand, good suit.

A bad hand is 6-8 HCP; good is 9-10 HCP. A good suit has two of the top three honors; a bad suit lacks that strength.

Thinking bridge

Opening lead: ♦J

Bidding commentary: In the modern game, 12 high-card points with the North distribution is an opening bid. South's second-round jump to 2NT is not forcing (11-12 high-card points or a very good 10). North has an easy pass.

Lead commentary: Though one avoids leading dummy's first-bid suit, a perfect four-card sequence takes priority over a marginal holding in an unbid suit.

Defensive commentary: East wins the ♦K and shifts to the ♥Q. Declarer wins the ♥K and

leads a spade towards the K-Q-10-6 in dummy. As West, holding the ace and seeing this spade combination in dummy, duck the first spade, and if declarer plays the king and later leads a second spade, duck again. Just do it!

As East, holding the ace with or without the jack, and seeing this spade combination to your right in dummy, duck the first spade. These ducks must be made smoothly. If the defenders play properly, South has to guess who has the ♠A. If West takes the ♠A on either lead, he eliminates the guess in the suit. If East has the

♠A and not the jack and wins the first round, he exposes West, who may have J-x-x, to a second-round finesse.

Play commentary: As South, assuming the defenders have played their spades properly and smoothly, the fate of the contract depends on which spade you play from dummy the second time. If you try the 10, you are toast. Also, if you played the 10 the first time, you are toast, only a little sooner. The 10 would be the right play, however, if the East-West spades were reversed.

her students. "For one thing, they get to play a game in school," she said candidly. "That's better to them than a regular class."

The Carlinville IL group has a similar story. Dr. Chris Shaw was the moving force to get bridge classes started in the Carlinville Middle School.

"The bridge lessons started after school on Mondays," said Shaw, "We have 10-minute lessons, followed by the play of prearranged deals."

Shaw has done research studies that show that youngsters who have had bridge instruction do better on standardized tests. His research gives weight to the idea that inferential reasoning, something that is hard to teach, is improved by bridge lessons. (For more details of Dr. Shaw's study, refer to page 22 of the Aug. 2006 *Bridge Bulletin*.)

The Carlinville students were joined by their middle school teacher and club sponsor Mary Lattan who also played Saturday. "I'm just learning along with the students," she said.

After the game, the two groups joined together for a pizza party.

Four of the Carlinville youngsters joined the ACBL Saturday.

Truth or Dare?

This deal comes from the Friday-Saturday knockouts:

♠ 5 2
♥ 10 9 4
♦ A Q J 6
♣ J 10 6 4

♠ A 8 7 4 3
♥ 6 5
♦ 7 4
♣ Q 9 8 3

On lead to 2NT-3NT, you try a low spade to the ♠9 and king. Declarer runs the ♦10, which holds, and plays a diamond to the jack, losing to the king. Partner returns the ♠J, covered all round. Things are looking up! What next?

The key to the deal is that if partner has four spades, the contract is down in top tricks. So let's consider that partner maybe started with ♠J 10 9. Now what should you do?

The answer is that you can't beat declarer legitimately. The most partner can have is the ♥Q – and if he has that card, declarer can take a finesse for his ninth trick. But which finesse?

To have any chance to beat the contract, you must shift to a high spade. A good partner will win the ♠9 and shift to the ♥8, keeping up the deception. Now let declarer work out whether to take the club or heart finesse! If he does, your reputation has probably gone before you. The full deal:

♠ 5 2	♠ J 10 9
♥ 10 9 4	♥ Q 8 7 3 2
♦ A Q J 6	♦ K 5 3
♣ J 10 6 4	♣ 7 2
♠ A 8 7 4 3	♠ K Q 6
♥ 6 5	♥ A K J
♦ 7 4	♦ 10 9 8 2
♣ Q 9 8 3	♣ A K 5

Convention card reminder

- Each player must have an ACBL convention card filled out and on the table. Please note that other types of convention cards, such as the WBF convention card or homemade cards that do not sufficiently resemble the ACBL convention card, are not acceptable substitutes.

- Each player is required to have a convention card filled out legibly and on the table throughout a session. Both cards of a partnership must be identical and include the first and last names of each member of the partnership.

If a director determines that neither player has a substantially completed card, the partnership may play only the Standard American Yellow Card and may use only standard carding. This restriction may be lifted only at the beginning of a subsequent round after convention cards have been properly prepared and approved by the director. Further, the partnership will receive a 1/6-board matchpoint penalty for each board played, commencing with the next round and continuing until the restriction is lifted. In IMP team games, penalties shall be at the discretion of the director.

If the director determines the partnership has at least one substantially completed convention card but has not fully complied with ACBL regulations, the director may give warnings or assign such penalties as he deems to be appropriate under the circumstances.

The objective of these warnings and penalties is the encouragement of full compliance with ACBL regulations.

Anheuser Busch Brewery Tour

St. Louis City Tour

Enjoy a private, guided 3-1/2-hour tour of St. Louis, featuring two stops.

You begin at Laclede's Landing, a nine-block industrial area that once housed companies producing coffee, leather goods, mattresses, tobacco, whiskey, candy and machinery for the barges, and now features some of the most unique restaurants and sidewalk cafes in St. Louis.

Next you will visit the famous Gateway Arch, a stainless steel structure that towers over 60 stories tall, completed in 1968. It is the nation's tallest national monument. With a tour to the top included, you'll get a stunning glimpse of the St. Louis region from a dizzying height of 630 feet. Next, visit the Museum of Westward Expansion where you can view rare Indian Peace Medals and weapons of survival, an actual teepee, and Sioux war bonnet and walk through time with Lewis and Clark.

East won the diamond opening lead with his ace and led another to Jansma's king. Declarer advanced the ♥J. West won his ace and exited with a heart to dummy's ♥K. Jansma cashed the ♥Q and pitched one of his club losers.

At this point, declarer had lost two tricks. It looked as if East had seven diamonds and three hearts. He was pretty sure East had the ♠A for his opening bid, but who held the ♠Q? If East had the ♠A Q, it was necessary to play a trump from the table.

Instead, declarer led a club to his ace and cashed the ♣K. Only now did he lead a trump, making the unusual looking play of low from his hand to East's bare ace. Holding nothing but diamonds, East had to present a ruff-sluff on which declarer discarded his last club while ruffing in dummy. In all, he lost one diamond, one heart and two trump tricks – making three for plus 140. This deal helped the pair finish fifth overall.

This procedure is intended to assure everyone that the playing field is level and that misbehavior will not be tolerated.

Masterpoint disclaimer

Scores as reported in the Daily Bulletin are subject to change because of score changes or corrections.

Therefore, the masterpoint awards as shown are also subject to change.

Cell phones

Cell phones, audible pagers or any similar communication equipment may not be operated or operable in the playing area during a session of play at NABCs except for health-related equipment or by permission of the director-in-charge of the tournament or event.



Bid Box Alerts and Announcements

When using bid boxes, ACBL suggests that players tap the Alert strip and say "Alert" at the same time.

When making an Announcement, use the Announcement word – such as "transfer" – and tap the Alert strip at the same time.

A player who Alerts or Announces a bid should make sure his opponents are aware that an Alert or Announcement has been made.

An opening spade lead will scuttle the slam, but West led the ♥Q. This was covered by the king and ace, and declarer, Duboin, ruffed.

Duboin turned his attention to the trump suit. The normal play in trumps would be to play low to the queen. This caters to K-x-x with West, and this is the play that several declarers tried. The problem with that approach is that even if West has K-x-x, there is no way to return to the closed hand to draw the remaining trumps after West takes his king.

Duboin realized that to succeed, he needed trumps to be 2-2 or for the ♦K to be singleton. So at trick two he banged down the trump ace, and when East obliged with the king, he crossed to the ♦Q and ran the clubs. West could get one trump trick, but that was all.

Plus 920 was worth almost all the matchpoints.

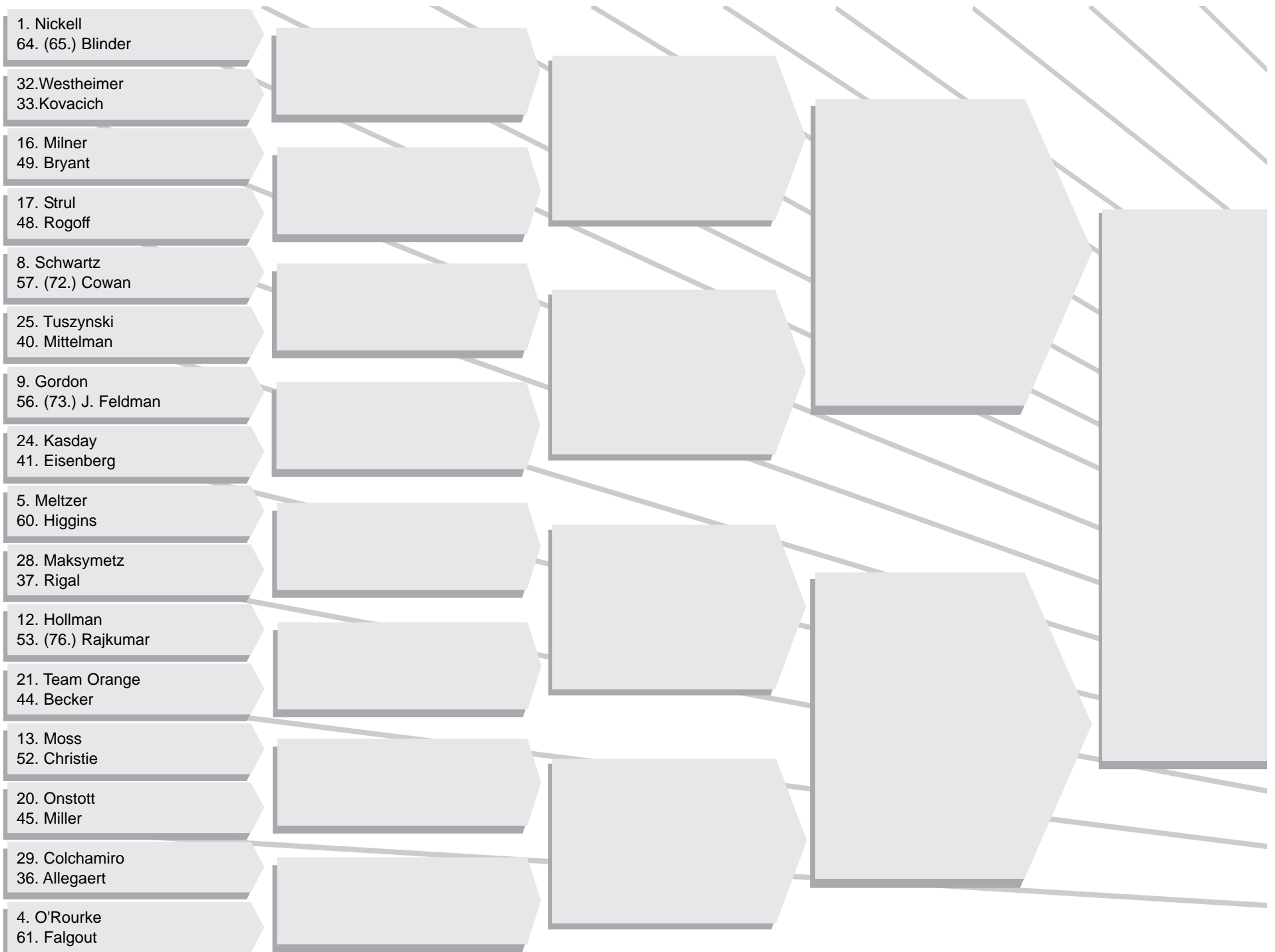

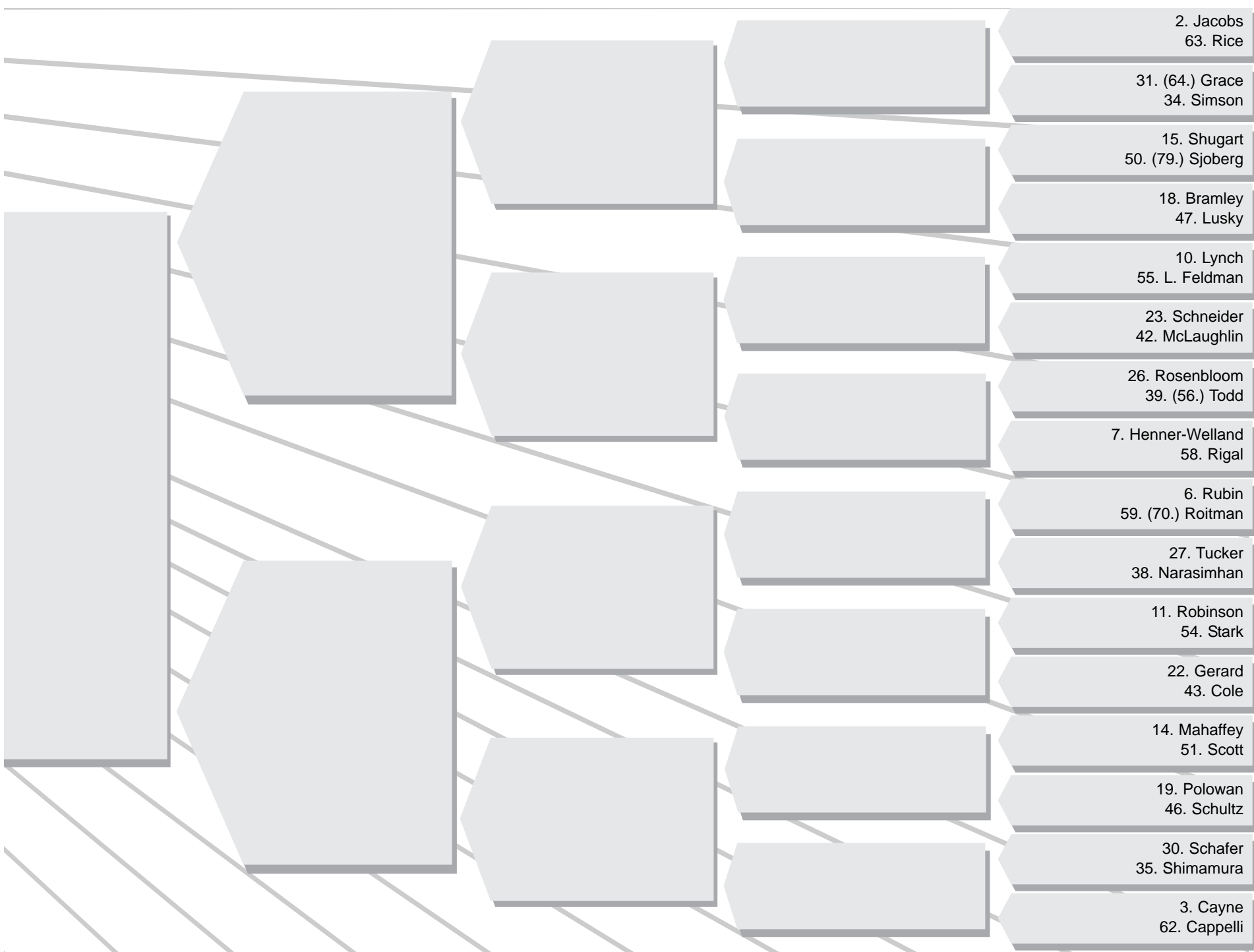
