ROB CRAWFORD/ELLEN CRAWFORD DISCIPLINARY DECISION

Procedural History

On December 7, 2022, National Recorder, Jeff Edelstein, submitted a Recorder Complaint against Ellen Crawford and Rob Crawford to Charging Party Paul Cuneo, ACBL Interim Executive Director, alleging a pattern of exchanging unauthorized information while playing online in ACBL sanctioned games between April to September 2020.

On December 7, 2022, charges of ethical misconduct under CDR Rule 3.20¹, Collusive Cheating, Online, were initiated against Mr. and Mrs. Crawford by Mr. Cuneo based on the Complaint submitted by Mr. Edelstein. The Charge Letter under “Summary of Facts” states:

A thorough investigation conducted by the Office of National Recorder which examined hundreds of hands played by the parties finds sufficient evidence that said parties exchanged unauthorized information during online play to warrant such a charge.

Charging Party Cuneo appointed Jeff Edelstein and Justin Coniglio to serve as Co-Advocates and designated Online Ethical Oversight Committee (OEOC) Chairperson Jordan Chodorow to serve as Presiding Chairperson of a 3-person Hearing Panel and Chris Moll and Karen Walker as the two other panelists. Marilynn Greenberg was designated as Advisor for the hearing.

On January 17, 2023, Chair Chodorow advised the parties of his appointment as Chair of the OEOC Panel and that Jeff Edelstein and Justin Coniglio had been appointed as Co-Advocates for the Charging Party and that the hearing would be held at 6:00p.m. EST on February 15, 2023 by web-conference using Zoom. Chairperson Chodorow further advised the parties of the following:

- (a) Sabrina Goley is the ACBL Compliance Coordinator and Marilynn Greenberg will serve as the Advisor to the Panel. Both are neutral parties in the process and cannot offer an opinion on the allegations or evidence. If you have questions regarding the procedures set forth in the ACBL Code of Disciplinary Regulations (CDR), you can direct your questions to them.
- (b) Pursuant to CDR 501(K), the Charging Party and the Charged Party have a right to appoint an Advocate to represent them before the Disciplinary Body at their own cost. The Advocate shall not be a member of the ACBL Board of Directors.

¹ The effective date of the applicable CDR in this matter is January 1, 2020.

- (c) The Charged Parties and the Charging Party were advised of their right to challenge any panel member for cause, such as bias, in accordance with CDR 501(I). Chair Chodorow advised the parties that challenges for cause must be submitted to Compliance Coordinator Goley in writing by January 24, 2023. No objections or challenges were submitted by the deadline.
- (d) Pursuant to CDR 501(G), Chodorow directed the pre-hearing disclosure of available evidence and the identity of witnesses. The witness list should identify the witness by name and include a summary of the witness' expected testimony. Chodorow recommended that the Charged Party review the Charged Party Tips included in the Notice of Charges provided on April 11, 2022. Chodorow directed the parties to email their pre-hearing submissions by 2:00 p.m. EST on the following dates to Sabrina Goley in one email and she will provide each party a copy. The Charging Party's pre-hearing disclosure was due by January 24, 2023 and the Charged Parties' prehearing disclosure was due by February 7, 2023.
- (e) Chodorow advised the Charged Parties that they are not required to appear at the hearing and that failure to appear will not be grounds for discipline.

On January 25, 2023, the Charging Party's Pre-Hearing Disclosure Statement was provided to the Charged Parties. On January 27, 2023, the Advocate for the Charging Party requested a pre-hearing conference to discuss the statistical evidence to be presented at the hearing and to advise that expert witnesses would be available at the hearing to respond to questions about the statistical evidence. Prior to the Chair's decision on whether to grant the request for a pre-hearing conference, the Advocate for the Charging Party wrote again, advising that the expert witnesses would not be testifying at the hearing and asking the Chair whether or not to remove the statistical submission entitled "Edgar" from the Charging Party's Disclosure. The Chair posed the question to the Charged Parties and the Charged Parties agreed to it being removed from the Disclosure since [they] "do not like the Edgar Program." Accordingly, the Statistical information was removed from the Charging Party's Pre-hearing Disclosure. The Charged Parties provided no Pre-Hearing Disclosure Statement. The evidentiary materials and charging documents ("the Packet") were then compiled by Compliance Coordinator Goley and provided to the Charged Parties, the Advocates, the Advisor and OEOC panelists on February 13, 2023 (see Exhibit A attached hereto).

EVIDENCE AND ARGUMENTS PRESENTED

Charging Party's Pre-Hearing Disclosure

The Pre-Hearing Disclosure of Co-Advocates Edelstein and Coniglio was comprised of five sections:

- I. The background of the Charged Parties, including their Masterpoint holdings, their joint residence and a copy of their convention card (see Exh. A, pp. 57 – 59).

- II. The background of the Co-Advocates and witnesses for the Charging Party (see Exh. A, p. 60).
- III. Full scores for five (5) full sessions between April and September 2020 that were reviewed, along with highlighted commentary on 24 selected boards (see Exh A, pp. 61-66).
- IV. Examples of hands that demonstrate possession of Illicit/Information (I/I). These examples are broken down into the following categories: Bidding, Underleads of Aces and Kings against Suit Contracts, a table showing all the times the Charged Parties declined an “easy lead” in favor of a different lead from April 28 – August 31, 2020; and some examples of specific leads made by the Charged Parties (see Exh. A, pp. 67-137).
- V. Hyperlinks to all the hands that the Charged Parties played together on BBO ACBL sanctioned games during 2020 (see Exh. A, pp. 138-181).

The Hearing

The OEOC hearing convened on February 15, 2023 at 4:00p.m. EDT by Web-Conference using Zoom. Chair Jordan Chodorow presided and panelists Chris Moll and Karen Walker were present. Marilynn Greenberg was present as Advisor. Charging Party Co-Advocates Jeff Edelstein and Justin Coniglio were present (Mr. Coniglio was not presenting but was available to respond to questions, and Interim OEOC Executive Director Paul Cuneo was present as an observer). The Charged Parties Rob and Ellen Crawford were also present. After introductions, the Chair invited the Charging Party Co-Advocates to make their presentation.

Charging Party’s Presentation

Co-Advocate Edelstein had provided the Advisor with an outline of his presentation prior to the hearing (see Exhibit B attached hereto). He began by reviewing the background and bridge credentials of the Charged Parties. Mr. and Mrs. Crawford live together. Mr. Crawford joined the ACBL in 1986, becoming a Life Master on September 1, 1987. As of January 6, 2023, he was a Platinum Life Master with 13,314 Masterpoints (MPs), including 712 platinum, 9,194 gold, 1,313 red, 605 silver, 1,224 black and 263 online points. He is a club director and member of the National Goodwill Committee. Mrs. Crawford joined the ACBL in 1977, becoming a Life Master on August 1, 1990. As of January 6, 2023, she was a Diamond Life Master with 10,000 MPs, including 492 platinum, 2,327 gold, 694 red, 393 silver, 1,496 black and 307 online points, with 4,287 points added as a previous National Champion, making her GLM eligible. She is a certified director, an ACBL accredited teacher and a member of the National Charity and Goodwill Committees. According to Co-Advocate Edelstein, as demonstrated by their credentials, the Charged Parties are highly skilled, are at the upper echelon of the bridge world and have a well established partnership; hence they should be held to the highest standard and given the maximum penalty if found guilty of cheating.

Co-Advocate Edelstein then began going through for the Panel 31 hands that the Co-Advocates felt were clear examples of collusive cheating (see Exh. B, pp. 184-214). In these hands, Rob Crawford has a BBO name of rcrawford and Ellen Crawford is known as ecrawford. The hands are broken down into 4 categories that the Co-Advocates for the Charged Party believe are exemplary of the possession of I/I, No Trump Disparity (inconsistent no trump bidding with similar hands depending upon partner's holding), System over Opponents' No Trump (using different conventions with similar hands when bidding over opponent's no trump depending upon partner's holding), Finding Fits, Avoiding Misfits, and Other Hands. In each of these examples, the Charged Parties always got a favorable result and never got into trouble or got a bad result. The Co-Advocates believe that the Charged Parties exchange I/I on every hand in a very sophisticated and nuanced manner due to their expert skill level. No exculpatory hands were provided.

Finally, the Co-Advocates provided sentencing recommendations. Because the Charged Parties are at the upper echelons of the game and hold positions of great trust and respect, the Co-Advocates recommended that each of them be suspended for five years, followed by a ten year probation during which they cannot play together. In addition, they recommended a masterpoint reduction of 50% of their total MPs. At the conclusion of this presentation, the Chairperson opened the floor for questions to the Co-Advocates from the Panel and the Charged Parties. No one had any questions so the floor was turned over to the Charged Parties for their presentation.

The Charged Parties began by explaining that they did not post a convention card based upon their partnership agreements, but posted a convention card used with a different partner. Thus, they were not familiar with what was on the posted convention card. They had not submitted a Pre-Hearing Disclosure Statement so they proceeded to address orally each of the boards in the Charging Party's Disclosure, beginning on page 26 through page 95, that purportedly showed the exchange of I/I. For each of these boards, they gave an explanation of why they made their bids and why these bids could not possibly be the result of collusion. If they could not come up with a seemingly logical explanation for a given bid, they attributed the bid to a misclick. They often reiterated that their favorable results were because they were such better players than the rest of the field. Finally, they explained that they did not take playing bridge online very seriously so they did not give much thought or care to their bids. They did not go through the packet to present any exculpatory hands. At the conclusion of the Charged Parties' presentation, no one had any questions and the hearing was adjourned.

PANEL'S FINDINGS OF FACTS AND CONCLUSIONS

The Charging Party bears the burden of proving ethical misconduct to a level of "comfortable satisfaction," defined by the CDR as:

A burden of proof that is met when, after a careful weighing of the evidence and the facts proved by direct, circumstantial or other evidence, the decision maker has a comfortable satisfaction that he or she has reached a correct and just conclusion.

It is higher than [the] “preponderance of the evidence” standard but not as high as “beyond a reasonable doubt.”

Direct evidence, circumstantial evidence, hearsay evidence, witness statements, mathematical analysis and any other relevant evidence (including evidence from outside of the ACBL) may be used to establish Comfortable Satisfaction. These factors go to the weight given to such evidence and not its admissibility. (See CDR at _____ page _____ 2).

The Panel was comfortably satisfied in accordance with the CDR that Mr. and Mrs. Crawford were colluding online by consistently sharing information. Some of the hands that the panelists found particularly damning are as follows:

The discussion of this hand by Mr. Crawford was a good example of their scattershot approach to justifying their actions. He took so many stabs at an excuse – he couldn't remember what we were using as ace-asking, he thought the grand was a good shot, they were just fooling around -- that it was obvious that he didn't base his bid on any of them.

When the 2NT is made on 17, the companion hand blasts game with 7 hcp (not bothering with Stayman, and of course partner doesn't have four of the other major); when the 2NT is made on 13, the companion hand passes quietly with 9hcp and lots of intermediates.





Meckwell vs. Cappelletti: When asked, the Crawfords responded that they play Cappelletti over opponent's no trump even though their convention card says they play Meckwell. They claimed that they do not even know Meckwell. They usually alert when they play Cappelletti, but whenever they deem it more advantageous, they do not play it and they do not alert what they are actually playing, which certainly looks like Meckwell. The comment that they do not play Meckwell is belied by its being listed on their convention card, which is what their competitors in these games look to first when no alert is made. At best, this shows an unacceptable respect for ACBL policies and procedures; at worst, it is duplicitous and intentionally dishonest.



Their leads always hit partner's strength, even if that proves suboptimal for the defense upon seeing all four hands.

These boards just represent the tip of the iceberg. There are dozens more boards just from this limited sample where the panelists could find no explanation for their choices other than the exchange of I/I.

In light of this massive evidence of cheating, and in view of the fact that the Charged Parties had access to all boards from the relevant period of time, their failure to adduce a single truly exculpatory board, while not necessary to the Panel's finding of culpability, also speaks volumes. The Charged Party Tips to which Chairman Chodorow directed the attention of the Charged Parties in his January 17, 2023 correspondence clearly indicate that charged parties will be well served to introduce examples of boards on which they took unusual actions that did not hit partner's hand. Once the Charging Party has made a prima facie case, panels look to Charged Parties to introduce exculpatory hands, where actions similar to those painted as inculpatory in the Charging Party's

presentation of evidence were taken but missed partner's hand at single dummy. Even a comparatively small number of such boards may be viewed as exculpatory. All of us struggling to do our best at the bridge table regularly have the experiences of bidding too high in a suit partner doesn't fit, under- and over-competing, and making leads that give away tricks or full boards. The Crawfords never do.

Based upon the vast number of hands that there could be no other explanation for the bids and/or play except for the sharing of I/I, the Panel felt that this was an egregious case, and the evidence was overwhelming. The factors that suggest a harsh sentence are the level of experience of the Charged Parties, the frequency and duration of the cheating, the flagrancy of the cheating, and the premeditation that went into the cheating. Also, in addition to their level of experience and masterpoint accumulation, the Charged Parties hold positions of respect within the ACBL that they have disgraced, thereby inflicting collateral reputational damage on the League. The Panel did not believe that the Charged Parties treated these online games as a fun diversion as they claimed. Rather, the Panel found that they systematically, and without letup, sought to benefit themselves and damage their competitors with their illicit knowledge of each other's hands.

Disciplinary Sanctions

The Panel finds that the Charged Parties' unethical conduct falls within CDR Rule 3.20 Cheating and Other Ethical Violations. Due to the severity of the unethical conduct and the apparent lack of remorse, the Panel imposes a 5-year suspension on both Charged Parties followed by a 10-year probation during which time they cannot play together. The Panel also rules that the Charged Parties are to lose 50% of all their MPs.

Summary of Evidence

On December 7, 2022, the ACBL filed a charge letter alleging that the Charged Parties violated the Code of Disciplinary Regulations by exchanging illicit information ("I/I"). The evidence submitted below maintains that the Charged Parties cheated in online play from April to September 2020. This disclosure packet contains the Charging Party's evidence and consists of four sections.

Section I provides background on the Charged Parties, including their Masterpoint holdings, joint residence, and a copy of their convention card.

Section II states the background of the co-advocates and witnesses for the Charging Party.

Section III provides full scores for five (5) sessions, with commentary on 24 highlighted examples. All of the boards from these sessions are provided.

Section IV lists examples of various plays that demonstrate I/I. These are broken down into the following categories: Bidding, Underleads of Aces and Kings against Suit Contracts, Declining "Easy" Leads against Suit Contracts, and General Leads and Defense.

Section I Player and Case Background

Mr. and Mrs. Crawford* reside together and provided the ACBL with a Nevada address. Mr. Crawford joined the ACBL in 1986, becoming a Life Master on September 1, 1987. As of January 6, 2023, he was a Platinum Life Master with 13,314 Masterpoints, including 712 platinum, 9,194 gold, 1,313 red, 605 silver, 1,224 black, and 263 online points. He is a club director and member of the National Goodwill Committee.

Mrs. Crawford joined the ACBL in 1977, becoming a Life Master on August 1, 1990. As of January 6, 2023, she was a Diamond Life Master with 10,000 Masterpoints, including 492 platinum, 2,327 gold, 694 red, 393 silver, 1,496 black, and 307 online points, with 4,287 points added as a previous National Champion, making her GLM eligible. She is a member of the National Charity and Goodwill Committees and a certified director and ACBL accredited teacher.

Advocate's concern:

Board 1. It seems somewhat more likely Rob's 1♠ opening was a misclick rather than a psychic, but in either event Ellen does not directly raise spades or offer a cuebid or splinter in clubs.

Board 4. Ellen's 2NT bid vulnerable with a flattish, unremarkable 8-count and a diamond tolerance is quite light and could easily be passed but Rob has a hand that could have opened 2♣ had he been dealer.

Board 6. The Charged Parties have a proclivity for driving to game when the hands mesh well together and stopping short when they do not (see Section IV, July 7).

Board 9. The Crawfords' convention card indicates that they play Meckwell in defense over 1NT (see Section IV, May 26), but they use Meckwell and Cappelletti variably.

Board 12. The Crawfords' convention card indicates they play Puppet Stayman over a 2NT opening, so it would have been normal for Ellen to respond with 3♦ at her second turn to show at least one 4-card major, but that would have required a bid of 4♦ from Rob who has both majors and a 4-count, when it appears the pair's goal was to stay on the 3-level in spades.

Board 18. The combination of Rob's 1♠ open on a 4-card suit and Ellen's Jacoby response on an 11-count makes it easier to get to the good spade game than if the auction had proceeded normally.

Advocate's concern:

Board 2. The Charged Parties often make 4-card overcalls highly successfully (see Section IV, May 12), often on suit quality that does not warrant one. Here Ellen's is certainly called for but it does find Rob with 4 hearts.

Board 9. Rob had a choice of leads and chose the one that found partner's length and strength.

Board 14. Rob passes his partner's opening bid with an 8-count, suggesting I/I Ellen had opened with 7 HCPs.

Board 17. Rob takes a blind 4♣ bid on ♣KJ85 with partner silent, finds a 4-4 fit and pushes the opponents up a level.

Board 18. Rob's heavy preempt works well as Ellen has just the right amount of values.

Advocate's concern:

Board 3. The Charged Parties are an experienced pair and know these new suit 2-level bids show 5-card suits. Note that in both this hand and Board 17 the bids both found 4-4 major fits.

Board 4. Few bridge players of Ellen's skill level would fail to lead the queen from this sequence if a club were their choice.

Board 5. Rob's passed-hand 2NT balance seems likely informed by partner's opening values and long heart suit.

Board 11. The Crawfords' convention card indicates that a new 2-level suit over a weak-2 preempt is nonforcing. Ellen's jump to 4♠ suggests I/I partner held a much stronger hand than could be expected.

Board 17. See Board 3 above.

Board 6. Rob's free 3NT bid with 3 naked aces suggests I/I partner had 6 solid clubs.

Board 8. Ellen avoids the spade lead in the suit Rob gave delayed support and finds his strength.

Board 10. Ellen's double may suggest I/I she was scoring a small trump trick.

Board 13. Rob's free 4♥ bid finds Ellen with values well-placed.

Board 18. Rob has no compelling reason to preference to what could be a 4-3 diamond fit, suggesting I/I the two hands were ill-suited for NT with the opponents having multiple entries.

Advocate's concern:

Board 4. With 9 cards in the majors and an 11-count, Ellen's 2♥ jump in response to partner's takeout seems modest, suggesting knowledge Rob had a subminimal takeout.

Board 5. Ellen makes a negative double with 3 spades, but Rob knows to take it out to 1NT though he has 4.

Board 8. Rob's failure to move to 5♣ demonstrates I/I Ellen had jumped on a 1-count.

Board 10. The Charged Parties are avid matchpointers so Rob's repeat of his 5-card heart suit holding a 10-count seems counterintuitive but works well here as Ellen has ♥A76 and no diamond stopper.

Analysis: The parties underled an Ace versus a suit contract on 7 occasions, finding partner with the king 5 times. 3 of these underleads were somehow directed (e.g., partner bid/raised the suit or made a lead-directing double). One of the two “misses” may not be construed as exculpatory (footnote above). Kings were underled 48 times, with partner having the Ace or Queen on 46 occasions. 24 of these leads were directed. Of the remaining 24 King underleads where the lead had no direction or was even contraindicated (e.g. both partners or non-leader silent or bid a different suit that was led), partner was found to have the king on 22 occasions (91.67%).

DECLINING “EASY” LEADS VERSUS SUIT CONTRACTS

What follows is a table containing a collection of alternate leads that were selected by the Charged Parties when an “easy” lead was available and are rated “HIT” or “MISS”. These are situations in which honest players select the “easy” lead more than 90% of the time and when they do not their choice frequently works poorly. There are 34 examples, with 33 “hits” and 1 “miss”. The single miss is identified with an asterisk. This table assumes 3rd/5th leads when listing the “easy” lead as the Charged Parties do not have an agreement listed on their convention card and at times lead erratically. Note that some leads rated “MISS” may still be effective leads.






