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GRAND NATIONAL TEAMS (GNT) DISTRICT 15

2021-2022 CONDITIONS OF CONTEST

The following, in conjunction with the ACBL Conditions of Contest, shall constitute the District 15 Conditions of Contest. The ACBL National Conditions of Contest may be referenced by clicking Ctrl + left mouse button while the cursor is located over the following underlined text:

GENERAL

Each unit in District 15 shall appoint a Unit Coordinator. This person will be responsible for arranging Unit GNT competition, reporting unit results, and aiding clubs within their unit with questions about the Conditions of Contest (COC). **The name, address, phone number and e-mail address of the Unit Coordinator shall be submitted to the District 15 Coordinator no later than Sep 30, 2021. If the Unit Coordinator does not have e-mail, an e-mail address of a contact person within the unit shall be provided.**

The Unit Coordinator of the Host Unit for the District 15 Finals shall work with the District Coordinator in facilitating the District Finals.

FLIGHT ELIGIBILITY

FLIGHT	MASTERPOINT LIMITS
Open Championship Flight	Unlimited
Flight A	Under 6,000 MPs
Flight B	Under 2,500 MPs
Flight C	Non-Life Masters under 500 MP

Master point totals for flight eligibility is determined by the ACBL's September master point cycle. **This information will be produced on August 6, 2021 in Horn Lake, MS. Masterpoints won after this cycle will not impact flight eligibility for these events.**

The Championship Flight and Flight A may be combined at the club and unit levels for play and masterpoint awards. In a stratified event, all teams are eligible for qualification in the Flight they participate in and any higher Flight.

CLUB LEVEL COMPETITION

Club level competition begins on September 1, 2021 and will conclude on **Feb 27, 2022**. Clubs can hold as many games as they wish. These games may be one or two sessions.

Club level games should be flighted, if possible. If the event is stratified, the following master point limits must be used: Open/2,500/NLM<500.

Points awarded at club level games are half red and half black at Sectional rating.

QUALIFICATION: There is no qualification needed to play in the club Level game. All bridge players are welcome. A team's flight eligibility is determined by the member with the most MPs.

REPORTING: Results of ALL club level games must be submitted to both the Unit Coordinator and the District Coordinator. This can be done in any method that is suitable to the club and Unit Coordinator. The results need to list all players, with their ACBL number. If you are using ACBL Score, please submit a copy of the game file to the District Coordinator in .TXT format. Send the result as an attachment to the email address at the top of page 1. If your club does not use ACBL Score, send a hard copy of the results that includes the player's ACBL number. **Each club must remit \$2.25/table/session to the ACBL with their monthly report and \$6.75 per table/session surcharge to the District Coordinator. Send in your reports and remittances by the 15th of each month. Please identify, club number, date of game and number tables that the District remittance applies.

RESTRICTIONS: No club level qualifying game may be held during any District 15 regional tournament or during a sectional tournament within 25 miles of the club game. Scheduling conflicts designated in the National COC must be observed.

CONVENTIONS: At the club and Unit qualifying level, the ACBL Open Convention Chart will apply for stratified games. For flighted games at all levels the Basic Chart applies to Flight C, the Basic + Chart applies to Flight B, the Open Chart applies to Flight A, and the Open+ Chart applies to the Championship Flight. UNIT LEVEL COMPETITION

Unit Finals should be scheduled between Feb 28, 2022 & Mar 20, 2022. The event should be two sessions, if possible. The game should be flighted, if possible. If sufficient numbers of teams are unavailable, the event may be stratified.

QUALIFICATION: A player must be a member of the ACBL in good standing and a member of District 15. Players may play in a unit final other than their own. A team's flight eligibility is determined by the member with the most MPs. New teams may be formed for play at the Unit level. A player may participate in a unit final even if they have not played in a club level game.

REPORTING: The Unit Coordinator must insure that the results of the Unit Final are submitted to the District Coordinator by Mar 20, 2022, report in the same manner as for club qualifying games (above).

In addition to your Unit Final results, the Unit Coordinator must insure that the Unit remits \$2.25/table per session to the ACBL with their monthly report and \$6.75 per table per session surcharge to the District Coordinator. RESTRICTIONS: No Unit Final may be held during a District 15 Regional. Scheduling conflicts designated in the National COC must be observed.

CONVENTIONS: Refer to the Club level conventions section for the Unit level conventions that apply.

PLAYER SUBSTITUTION RULES: In the event of an emergency, a team may substitute a player at the Unit Final subject to the following conditions:

- Only 1 substitute is permitted on a team. No substitute is allowed if a fifth or sixth team member is present. The only exception allowed is in the case of a family emergency where 2 members of the family are playing on the same team. In such circumstances, 2 substitutes are allowed unless a fifth and sixth team member are present.
- Any substitute who plays more than 50% of the boards during the event becomes the player of record for the event. Match awards and overall awards will be apportioned between the player and the substitute according to the ACBL Participation Requirement rules, as stated in the Knockout Team Events - General Conditions of Contest or the Swiss Teams - General Conditions of Contest, whichever is applicable.
- A substitute must meet the eligibility requirements of the Flight played in.
- A substitute must be a member in good standing of the ACBL and a member of District 15.

DISTRICT LEVEL COMPETITION

The District 15 GNT Finals will be held at the OKC Regional, Apr 2-3, 2022.

New teams may be formed for play at the District level.

QUALIFICATIONS: Participants must be members in good standing of the ACBL and members of District 15 to enter the District 15 GNT Final. A team's flight eligibility is determined by the member with the most MPs. A player may participate in the District final even if they have not played in a club or unit level game.

REPORTING: The District Coordinator shall obtain a copy of the District Final results for all flights from the Director-in-charge. In addition, the District Coordinator should ensure that the \$8.00 per table per session surcharges are collected and submitted to District 15.

CONVENTIONS: Refer to the Club level conventions section for conventions that apply at the District level.

EVENT PLAYING CONDITIONS: All flights of 2, 3 or 4 teams will play two sessions concluding on Saturday. Flights of 5 or more teams will play a 3rd session on Sunday. The 20 victory point scale will be used in all flights except when noted otherwise. Each flight will play separately. There will be no subdividing or pooling of teams allowed in any flight. Reference the ACBL General Conditions of Contest Swiss Teams for running of Swiss teams. Ties shall be broken in accordance with the ACBL General Conditions of Contest Knockout Teams.

Flights of 2 teams will play a 2 session match of 24 boards each to come to one winner.

Flights of 3 teams will play a 2 session KO of 24 boards against each team, 12 boards per session. This group will use IMP scoring.

Flights of 4 teams will play a double round robin to one winner as follows: 3-16 board matches played across 2 sessions. Then scoring converted to VPs for final rankings.

Flights of 5 teams will play double round robin to eliminate 3 teams consisting of 4-12 board matches played across 2 sessions. Then scoring will be converted to VPs to determine 2 finalists for the 3rd session of 24 boards.

Flights of 6 teams will play a full day round robin over 2 sessions of 5-10 board matches converted to VPs to come down to 2 finalists for the 3rd session of 24 boards.

Flights of 7 + teams will play a Swiss movement over 2 sessions to come down to 2 finalists for the 3rd session of 24 boards.

In the event of a tie for fourth place or higher in the Swiss qualifying rounds, the following tie-breakers will be used, in the order stated, to determine the place in question:

- Total wins.
- Results in a head-to-head match.
- Best record against common opponents (based on Victory Points).
- A four board match.

In the event of a three-way tie for fourth place or higher in the Swiss qualifying rounds, the following tie-breakers will be used, in the order stated, to determine the places in question:

- Total wins.
- Results in a head-to-head match.
- Best record against common opponents (based on Victory Points)
- A four board match.

Registration with the District GNT Coordinator for the GNT event will open starting Friday afternoon and close 30 minutes prior to the announced starting time on Saturday. All entrants must check in with the Director in Charge no later than 15 minutes before game time on Saturday.

PLAYER SUBSTITUTION RULES: In the event of an emergency, a team may substitute a player at the District Final subject to the following conditions:

- Unit level "Player Substitution Rules" apply.
- A substitute may play in both days of the District Finals if the emergency warrants such actions. Such occurrences will be handled on a case-by-case basis and must be approved by the District Coordinator.

DISTRICT CHAMPION DETERMINATION CRITERIA: Refer to section II of the National Conditions of Contest.

FOLLOWING THE DISTRICT FINALS:

- No player may be replaced on a team without their consent.
- A winning team must field a minimum of 3 original members; otherwise the next placing team shall receive the subsidy to compete in the National Event.

TEAM SUBSTITUTION RULES: If a winning team decides for any reason not to participate at the National Event, the team captain must immediately notify the District Coordinator about the team's withdrawal. The captain of the withdrawn team is responsible for ensuring that any subsidy received by the team is returned promptly to the District Coordinator. The second place team from the District 15 Finals will be substituted for the withdrawn team. This process will continue through the (up to) top four finishers in order in the affected Flight until a team wishing to participate in the National Event is found. The second place team (of three) will be the team which lost by the fewest IMPs in the round robin final. The third place team (of four) will be that team which lost by the fewest IMPs in the semifinal matches. If this procedure results in a tie, the third place team will be designated as the team which lost to the Flight champion in the semifinal match. If no team in the top four finishers of the Flight wants to participate in the National Event, no team will be sent by District 15 to the Nationals from that Flight.

When a flight B or C had at least 8 teams competing in the district final, a second team in that flight will also be eligible to compete at the NABC. In this case a similar process will be used to determine a substitute for a withdrawn second place team.

If the substituted team wishes to augment their team, they will be encouraged but not required to augment using willing players from the withdrawn team(s) that placed ahead of them in the District final.

AUGMENTATION: After a team has won their Flight at the District level, they may augment their team to a maximum of 6 members, subject to the following provisions.

- The player(s) must be a member in good standing of the ACBL and a member of District 15.
- The player(s) must meet the eligibility requirements of the Flight involved.

- Subsidies provided the District is for a team of four. No additional subsidy will be provided for teams with more than four members.

STIPEND: District 15 will provide stipends for each team representing our district at the National Finals to help cover travel expenses. The total amount of any stipend will be determined annually by the District Board, based on available funds collected specifically for this event. These funds will be shared equally among the four flights participating at the National Finals. If any team from any flight(s) does not participate in the GNT National finals, their stipend will not be awarded. Any stipend(s) not awarded will be rolled over for use in following years allocations. In the event that a stipend has been paid and a team subsequently decides not to participate at the National GNT Finals, that team is responsible for returning the full amount of the stipend to District 15. The returned stipend will be rolled over as described above.

If the NABC is held online the stipend does not apply since the stipend is meant to assist with the players travel expenses,
